

Next Sunday's Reading

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading Isaiah 55:1-3

Responsorial Psalm Psalm: 145:8-9, 15-18

Second Reading

Gospel

Romans 8:35, 37-39

Matthew 14:13-21

First Reading: 1 Kings 3:5, 7-12

This Reading unfolds in three parts: the Lord commands Solomon to ask for something, Solomon asks, and the Lord comments on his request. Solomon who recently ascended the throne of his father, David, describes himself as "a mere youth" and denotes that he lacks experience in the job. When commanded by the Lord to ask for something, Solomon asks for "an understanding heart." The Lord was pleased that he did not ask for wealth or the removal of his enemies. The Lord gave Solomon a wise heart and understanding, that no one will ever match or be like him.

Second Reading: Romans 8:28-30

In this Reading, Paul reapplies "Those who love God is a designation for the people of Israel" from in the Old Testament to their descendants and to all who believe that Jesus is God's son. He wants to impress the baptized with the wonder that since the beginning of time God worked all things together for their advantage and continues to do so in their present circumstances. From eternity, God knew each of them intimately and predestined them to play unique, intertwined roles in his plan for the salvation of every created human being.

Gospel: Matthew 13:44-52

This Gospel sets out three parables about the kingdom of heaven and a simile for a scribe instructed in its ways. The first parable compares the kingdom to someone who by chance finds a treasure buried in a field. The finder simply must have the treasure and takes immediate steps to acquire it: he hides it, leaves, sells all, and buys the field. In the second parable, a merchant finds an extraordinary pearl of great price. He wants it so passionately that he immediately sells "all," his business and his personal assets and buys it. In the third parable, the kingdom is like what happens to a net that is thrown into the sea and collects fish of every kind. The fishermen haul the nets ashore and sort what is good and throw away the bad. Like angels who go out and separate the wicked disciples from the righteous ones and throw them into the fire where they will be eternal wailing and grinding of teeth. Jesus' question, "Do you understand these things?" He wants the disciples to ponder and study his teachings until they see how to put them into practice.

GUIDELINES FOR PARISH MINISTRIES IN THE TIME OF COVID-19 PREPARATION FOR AND CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION, FIRST PENANCE, AND MATRIMONY

Remote and Immediate Preparation

*Sacramental catechesis and faith formation are essential prior to receiving the sacraments. Parishes are urged to find creative ways to engage in the preparation process through virtual gatherings or other practical means. If a gathering is necessary, the number of persons may not exceed limits set by the county and must adhere to social distance requirements.

*Larger gatherings are permitted IF they are directly related to the immediate preparation of the sacraments (e.g., practice receiving the Body of Christ with an unconsecrated host) and adhere to the safety measures outlined in these guidelines.

*Retreat: Overnight retreats are not permitted on diocesan property.

Conferral of Sacraments

*The conferral of sacraments may take place following the "Guidelines from Bishop Larry Silva, Bishop of Honolulu, for the Reopening of Catholic Churches in Hawaii During the COVID-19 Pandemic" (May 22, 2020) https://www.catholichawaii.org/media/649918/bishops-letter-re-reopening-of-churches.pdf

Meetings and Ministry Gatherings

*Parish ministries (i.e., Finance and Pastoral Councils; liturgical, family, youth/young adult ministries, etc.) are permitted to meet IF they do not exceed county limits for gatherings and adhere to the safety measures outlined in these guidelines.

*Associations of the Faithful may meet at the parish. No other groups are permitted.

*Church offices may physically re-open to the public with safety measures.

STEWARDSHIP SAINT

SAINT MARTHA - ONE OF JESUS' CLOSEST FRIENDS

Just before Jesus' final entry into Jerusalem, his close friends, Martha, her sister, Mary, and brother, Lazarus, entertained Jesus at their home in Bethany (John 12:1-8). Martha "served," while Mary anointed his feet. It is in the simple statement, "Martha served," that we recognize Martha for her witness to stewardship. She isn't a prolific evangelist, she doesn't work miracles. She simply serves Jesus. Jesus may have been a frequent visitor to Martha's home and perhaps this is one of the reasons the Gospel of John reveals to us that "Jesus loved Martha, and her sister Mary, and Lazarus" (11:5). This unique



statement in the gospel informs us of the special relationship Jesus had with Martha and her siblings. And, as another one of Jesus' visits to Martha's home affirms. Martha continues to be concerned that Jesus be served.

Like any good steward, hospitality was very important to Martha (Luke 10:38-42). What is most revealing about Martha is on the occasion of the death of Lazarus (John 11:1-44). Martha takes an active role, going out to meet Jesus to let him know what happened to her brother while Mary stays at home. Jesus assures her that Lazarus will be raised from dead. With courage and conviction, Martha confesses her deep faith in Jesus Christ: "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." And then Jesus said to her: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." When he asked Martha if she believed this, she replied: "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world" (John 11:24-27).

The feast of St. Martha, a witness to service who confessed her faith in Jesus, is July 29. She is the patron saint of homemakers, cooks, domestic workers, waiters and waitresses, and hotel employees.
