

"The Lord is near to all who call upon him." Psalm 145:18



# First Reading: Isaiah 55:6-9

This Reading is from the section of Isaiah known as "the little book of consolation." It is because although the Lord punished Israel for its centuries of infidelity by the loss of their land and their exile to Babylon, he loves them too much to sever the covenant relationship with them. In fact, he follows them into exile and returns with them to the land. There the prophet urges them to "seek the Lord" once again in the Jerusalem temple. To persuade his hearers to change their course, he reminds them that the Lord's "thoughts' are superior to and more intricate than theirs. In short, the Lord will always out-scheme them.

# Second Reading: Philippians 1:20-24, 27

Paul writes this letter to the Philippians from prison, where the possibility of being put to death sparks the reflections in today's readings. He is convinced that he will never be shamed by what happens to him because of his commitment to the Gospel. Whether he lives or dies, he believes that Christ will be magnified or exalted so boldly and blatantly in his body that people will take notice. He believes that as long as he draws breath Christ is using him to engage more people.

# Gospel: Matthew 20:1-16

This parable is a long metaphor whose aim is to provoke thought about life in the kingdom of heaven. Jesus uses a common business practice to engage his disciples interest and adds a twist at the end that challenges their view of divine ways. A landowner goes out and finds workers at different times of the day. At the close of day, the landowner instructs his foreman to pay first those who worked the least. The laborers who began work at the start of the day, were exhausted for toiling for twelve hours in the scorching midday heat and were given the amount promised them. They expected to be made more since they worked harder and longer. They were disappointed and complained. Three questions provoked them to examine their views: 1) Did you not agree to the daily wage? 2) Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? And, 3) Are you envious because I am generous? The workers get it. It's the way things work in the world. But Jesus' parable is about the way things work in his kingdom.



Subject: Addendum to General Directives and Liturgical Guidelines due to the new City and County of Honolulu *"Second Stay at Home/Work from Home"* Order 2020-25 for the island of Oahu (ONLY)

Peace be with you!

As you know, Mayor Kirk Caldwell of the City and County of Honolulu, is concerned – as we all are – about the spike in COVID-19 cases on Oahu, and he has issued new restrictive orders that go into effect on Thursday, August 27 at 12:01 a.m. Houses of worship may still hold in-person services, and we are grateful we are still able to celebrate the Eucharist together. However, given the increased risks, it is all the more important that we follow the directives below. No one is obliged to attend Mass at this time, so if you feel strongly that we should not have in-person worship, you are encouraged to stay home and join us on live-stream. This is a difficult time for everyone, and not everyone agrees on the way we should go. But let us all remember to trust in the Lord and to pray to the Lord for an end to this pandemic. May the Lord bless and protect you all!

### \*The following directives will remain in effect until further notice:

• Oahu parish churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions will continue offering in person services (i.e. Daily and Sunday Mass, Funeral Masses, Weddings, Baptisms, Confirmation/first Holy Communion Masses) and other spiritual services following the prior published directives and guidelines from the City and County, CDC and diocese.

• The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday continues to be dispensed through October 31, 2020.

• We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-stream their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website. Daily and Sunday Mass are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. For a comprehensive and updated list please visit our website at <a href="http://www.catholichawaii.org">www.catholichawaii.org</a>.

• The following directives from the latest MEMO ("Act Now Honolulu – No Social Gathering Order" [COVID-19] dated August 19, 2020) will continue in effect. - Face coverings (masks or mask/face shields) will be worn at ALL times by all who participate at the Mass during the liturgical celebration. For those ministers with respiratory issue it is highly suggested the use of a face shield instead of a face mask. - Singing during the celebration of the Mass is to be suspended. The use of wind instruments is also prohibited. Musicians may consider playing instrumental music, using a piano and/ or church organ, during the entrance gathering, offertory, at the communion rite and recessional. - The Responsorial Psalm and all the Mass parts (i.e. Kyrie, Gloria, Collect, Gospel Acclamation, Prefaces, Eucharistic Prayer, the Lord's Prayer and other prayers) are to be recited. Either the priest or the lector should also recite the Entrance Antiphon and the Communion Antiphon found in the Roman Missal.

• Priests are reminded that they can still hear confessions by appointment only. Please observe good spacing between the penitent and priest, while at the same time observing absolute privacy for the penitent. Confessions by phone or via the internet are not permitted. General absolution is not permitted, because it presumes a gathering of people.

• The Anointing of the Sick and Viaticum will only be administered, if possible, in situations where there is the danger of death.

 $\cdot$  The Homebound ministry (i.e. taking Holy Communion to people's homes, hospitals and/or nursing homes) is suspended during the duration of this order and/or until further notice.

· Wakes, prayer services and burials at Funeral Homes and cemeteries are to follow the proper restrictions indicated in the order.

 $\cdot$  All face-to-face meetings are suspended; including but not limited to any church ministry, community, and staff meetings in any church facilities.

# KNOWBE4 CYBERSECURITY AWARENESS TRAINING

You may be aware that we recently ran a simulated phishing security test to determine what our vulnerability would be if a real phishing attack were to happen to our users. The result is there were almost <u>three hundred</u> of our colleagues who have fallen for this simulated attack.

*Phishing* is the process of trying to gain access to sensitive information such as usernames, passwords, banking, credit card, and other personal information by pretending to be a credible entity. The criminals do this by contacting a target by official-looking email, posing as someone from a legitimate institution to lure individuals into providing sensitive information. The data is then used to access important accounts and can result in identity theft and financial loss.

Cybercrime is getting more severe by the month. Hackers are getting smarter about tricking people into clicking on fraudulent links or opening up malicious attachments in emails. It can happen to you personally on your computer and your email as well.

Because of this, our organization has decided that everyone should get comprehensive Cybersecurity Awareness training. We need to defend our organization against cybercrime, and security is everyone's job. You are the last line of defense in keeping our organization safe.

We will be sending out an email to invite you to take a 30-minute General Cybersecurity course, offered by our partner, KnowBe4, one of the world's leading Security Awareness Training organizations. This initial training is engaging and does not need to be completed in one sitting. In addition to cybersecurity training, we will also send out simulated phishing tests regularly so you can practice the skills you will learn as part of your training. Be on the lookout for these in your inbox.

Aloha Father -

Last school year was abruptly side-tracked by the coronavirus; schools were shut-down along with the rest of our state and most of the nation. As is the case especially during holidays and long weekends, children are hungry and want to be fed. For children living in homes that are food insecure, school is where you get an education AND where you fill your hungry belly.

The *Families First Coronavirus Response Act* was authorized last Spring and federal funds were allocated to provide food assistance through the **Pandemic EBT** Program. During the summer, families had the opportunity to receive "shopping credit" through a special Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card used at the market for purchasing food. The amount credited to an existing EBT card (previously food stamps) was based upon the number of school aged children in the household, K-12. Families whose children do not receive subsidized school meals were also eligible to receive a card just for the pandemic.(eNews June 29, 2020)

With the new school year underway and public school students online with distance learning, federal funds are once again being made available for a second round of P-EBT credit for the months of August and September. The maximum amount allocated for each student in the household is \$286. Please see the attached eNews announcement detailing the P-EBT program.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Parents have not applied for free and reduced school meals whose household could benefit by receiving a P-EBT card must apply by MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 21, 2020. They may apply online at <a href="https://secure.ezmealapp.com/ApplicationScreen.aspx">https://secure.ezmealapp.com/ApplicationScreen.aspx</a>. Please share this important opportunity with your parishioners this weekend so to get their application submitted on time.




