Next Sunday's Reading Solemnity of All Saints

First Reading Revelation 7:2-4. 9-14

Responsorial Psalm Psalm: 24:1-6

Second Reading 1 John 3:1-3

Gospel

Matthew 5:1-12

First Reading: Exodus 22:20-25

This First Reading is an excerpt from the Laws. In fact, from Exodus 19:1 to Numbers 10:10 the law continue, following the description of Israel's encampment at Mt. Sinai on the way to the Promised Land. While many of those laws come from a later period, their placement alongside the original one suggests that they were understood to show how the people remained faithful to the covenant in new situations, such as when they settled in the new land.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10

In this Reading, the Thessalonians learned about Christ and decided to commit themselves to him because they were inspired not only by Paul's teaching but especially by the way that he conducted himself when he was among them. They are riveted by the coexistence of suffering and joy that they see in him. Though he was recently thrown out of Philippi and will soon be driven out of Thessalonica, he remains profoundly happy. The Thessalonians, too, suffer and rejoice as they break away from the unbelieving majority who worship false gods.

Gospel: Matthew 22;34-40

In the Gospel, Jesus clarifies the link between love of God and love of neighbor. God loves us so intensely and personally that we are here, with all our individual characteristics, our answering love must involve ourselves. The command, "Love God with your whole self" is a statement about relationship. And our love of God is expressed above all in our love of neighbor.

REFLECTIONS FROM THE WORD OF GOD TO PREPARE FOR THE 2020 ELECTIONS

As faithful citizens of the United States, the State of Hawaii, and the local regions to which we belong, we not only enjoy the right to vote, but we have a civic duty to do so to make our democracy a government "of the people, by the people, and for the people." The following are offered as an invitation to prayer and discernment about some of the issues facing our community to help all discern God's will regarding the persons we elect for public office. We urge you to pray over them in this time leading up to our November 3 elections.

*ONE NATION UNDER GOD - RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

Our nation was founded on "the laws of nature and nature's God." Do we still share this fundamental belief? For those who do believe, is that belief fostered or threatened by our culture and its leaders? "Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone! Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with your whole heart, and with your whole being, and with your whole strength." (Deuteronomy 6:4-5)

*THE SANCTITY OF LIFE FROM CONCEPTION UNTIL NATURAL DEATH

Pope Francis has said that without the right to life, no other right has meaning. What can we do to halt and reverse the hidden Holocaust of abortion that is so accepted that it is protected by law? UPDATE ON DIOCESAN COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

RE: NEW PANDEMIC RESTRICTIONS REGARDING FUNERALS

Aloha,

Governor David Y. Ige's latest FOURTEENTH PROCLAMATION RELATED TO THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY signed on October 13, 2020 (Exhibit H) directs "any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or any other location, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law."

Therefore, effective immediately and until further notice, all Funeral Masses in the presence of a body (casket) in the state of Hawaii are to be postponed OR celebrated without the presence of the body.

Our clergy can still offer the Vigil for the Deceased and/or a Funeral Liturgy outside Mass at the mortuary/ funeral home, or a Committal Service at the cemetery. As an exception during this time, a Funeral Mass at church in the presence of an Urn or without the presence of the body may still be celebrated before the Committal. In that case, the body should be blessed with holy water at the cemetery, and the Final Commendation and Farewell should be included in the Committal Service (See Order of Christian Funerals, Chapter 6.)

Aloha.

I have received various calls asking for clarification on the reason for the new pandemic restrictions regarding funerals that I sent vesterday.

On Governor Ige's 14th Proclamation, Exhibit H (RULES RELATING TO MORTUARIES, CEMETERIES, EMBALMERS, UNDERTAKERS AND MORTUARY AUTHORITIES) signed on October 13, 2020, he explains the purpose for the change:

§1 Purpose and Authority.

These rules are adopted pursuant to section 127A-12, 13, 25, 29, and 31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to respond to the COVID-19 emergency declared by the Governor and have the full force and effect of law. The following are necessary to enable the Department of Health to effectively prohibit gatherings to view a decedent's body outside of mortuaries and cemeteries governed by Hawaii Administrative Rules, Title 11, Chapter 22. To the extent anything in these rules conflicts with Title 11, Chapter 22, these rules shall control during the emergency period.

§2 Prohibition on transporting a body to residences and other places.

Any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or any other location, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law.

Aloha, Sisters and Brothers! Peace be with you!

This year of 2020 has brought us many unprecedented experiences and major adjustments to our lives and livelihoods due to the coronavirus pandemic. While we must not let down our guard and continue to observe prudent hygiene measures, we also want to look optimistically to the future. With Advent and Christmas coming, it is very important that we prepare ourselves well for these high holy days in which we celebrate the great gift of the Word of God taking flesh and dwelling among us. Therefore, I ask all the parishes to plan their Advent and Christmas schedules in such a way as to accommodate as many people as possible throughout these days.

Since mid-March through October 31, 2020 I have issued a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. I am hereby extending that dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation through **December 31, 2020**. As I do so, however, I urge everyone who is able to return to Mass, without undue risks to their health or the health of others, to do so. Please note that in the Diocese of Honolulu, besides all Sundays, the holy days of obligation are the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Tuesday, December 8; and Christmas on Friday, December 25. Again, while all are dispensed from the obligation of attending, I urge you to do so if you can.

It is highly recommended that those who do avail themselves of the dispensation substitute some other prayer experience so that worship of God does not lose its primary focus in our lives. One could do a home holy hour, pray the rosary, celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours, or do some reading of spiritual books and articles, especially the lives of the saints. Of course, we also encourage anyone who cannot attend Mass to watch a live-streamed Mass. Sites are posted on our diocesan website at www.catholichawaii.org.

We encourage everyone to reach out to those who may not hear this message on their own and invite them to "Come, let us adore him, Christ the Lord!





RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

October 25, Sunday – The Sunday catechesis on the Holy Eucharist continues. The video presentation about a kid playing the role of a priest in a makebelieve Mass was entertaining. He could be one of our kids and a potential future priest in our parish.

More interesting video presentations are coming in the next Sundays for deeper knowledge of our Catholic faith. The children and their parents as well as the catechists and any interested parishioner are welcome to attend. This Sunday they will be reciting the Holy Rosary.

We shall continue to observe all mandated safety protocols vis-à-vis the covid pandemic. Everyone is asked to wear face mask, keep six-feet distancing and follow hygiene practices of washing hands and using sanitizer. The area will be disinfected before and after the session and if anyone feels sick, it is advised that they stay home and get well. We are all in this together and so we stay safe and stay alive.

family-oriented we urge the parents to join their children during the sessions so they could follow up in their homes and discussions whatever is presented and work together on the home assignments given them. 

> BRINGING THE GOOD NEWS TO ALL CREATION

With the presidential election upon us, it is more important than ever for mature Catholics to be mindful of their responsibilities to exercise good stewardship over their neighborhoods, communities and society by participation in the public life of our country.

Jesus said that we, his disciples, are the light of the world. We must not hide that light



under a bushel basket (see Matthew 5:16) or in the privacy of our homes or in a church building. We must let it shine so that all men and women can see it. Stewards understand that living out their faith in public life is part of their responsibility to go into the world and proclaim the Gospel to all creation (Mark 16:15); and that their relationship with Jesus Christ and their desire to please him should inform all of their moral decisions, including how they participate in public life and how they vote.

Stewards strive to make prudent choices, vote and encourage others to vote. These are just a few of the ways stewards can help bring the Good News to all creation.

How should stewards exercise their responsibilities as citizens? One way of course, is to inform themselves of the political issues of the day and to vote. Voting is literally the least one can do to promote Gospel values in our communities, state and nation. Stewards are not found wanting in this vital area of their stewardship. The teachings of the church help us understand our responsibility to make informed choices about issues that concern our society and world, especially as it relates to peace and justice and the most vulnerable of our sisters and brothers.

The Bishops of the United States have again provided important guidance through their statement: Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility. Developed by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, this document continues a tradition by the bishops of encouraging Catholics to use the values of their faith to shape their participation in political life. It focuses on helping Catholics form their consciences so they can make sound moral judgments about public choices. (See www.faithfulcitizenship.org)

Stewards commit to prayer, reflection and discussion among others in their community of faith about how to bring the Gospel to public life. They believe in continued conscience formation and conversion, take the teachings of the Church seriously, and keep themselves informed on the political issues of the day. Stewards also strive to make prudent choices, vote and encourage others to vote. These are just a few of the ways stewards can help bring the Good News to all creation.

FREE GRAB & GO MEALS FOR ALL KEIKI!

As part of a national effort to ensure no child ever goes to school hungry, the Hawaii Department of Education has launched a new program to feed ALL students for FREE for the remainder of the Fall 2020 semester. Thanks to additional funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Free Grab & Gomeals will be available for pickup at 203 public schools across the state during regularly scheduled school days through Friday December 18. Distributions will be given to all keiki, regardless of whether or not they are enrolled in public school or have received free or reduced meals before the pandemic. Even children who are homeschooled or attend private schools are included. Please visit the DOE website for a complete list of participating campuses. Schools that are not listed will continue to provide meals during normal school schedules at the regular price.

If parents or guardians are picking up meals, they must provide one of the following verification documents:

- Official letter or email from school listing child(ren) enrolled
- Recent student report card(s)
- Attendance record(s) from parent portals of school websites
- Birth certificate(s) of child(ren)
- Student ID card(s)
- Driver's permit(s)/license(s) for high school students
- State-issued ID of the student

Meals are distributed at lunchtime only. Breakfast for the following day will also be given at that time. Children who require modified meals must email or call a request at specialdiets@k12.hi.us or call (808) 784-5500.

BRIDGING HAWAII'S HUNGER GAP

CARES Act Funds to help struggling families during the pandemic are currently scheduled to expire by the end of the year; but basic needs for food, shelter and other essential services are continuing to grow. 160-thousand Hawaii residents are struggling just to put food on the table, according to Feeding America statistics. Many of those facing food insecurity are senior citizens and young children. We applaud all our parish food pantries and other charitable programs who are doing what they can to feed those in need. But additional government assistance has been—and will continue to be critical in bridging Hawaii's hunger gap. Thankfully the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Service (FNS), has assured it will continue to maintain the following three federal food assistance programs well beyond this current crisis. If you, or someone you know, is in need, please share the following links for information on eligibility and application forms:

1) The Senior Food Box Program, also known as <u>Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)</u> provides low-income kupuna age 60 and above with monthly food boxes containing nutritious food that include fruits, vegetables, proteins, grains and dairy products. To apply, please visit the following links according to each county.

2) <u>Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP)</u> provides low-income seniors with vouchers to purchase fruits, vegetables, honey and fresh herbs from authorized farmers' markets. *November 3 is General Election Day.

*All of Hawaii votes by mail – Registered voters receive their packet in the mail, fill up the ballot in the privacy of their home and mail it before General Election Day. There are no polling places on Election Day.

*Voting: On your ballot, completely darken in the box to the left of your choice candidate using a black or blue pen. Re-fold your voted ballot and place it in the ballot secrecy sleeve.

Sign the return envelope before mailing it back or dropping it off to a voter service center either at Honolulu Hale or Kapolei Hale. Unsigned ballot will not be counted.

*Mail your filled and signed ballot no later than <u>October 27!</u> Your return envelope is postage-paid via the U,S, Postal Service.


