# **Next Sunday's Reading**

Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

First Reading

Responsorial Psalm Psalm: 23:1-3, 5-6

Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17

Second Reading

Gospel

1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28

Matthew 25:31-46

# First Reading: *Proverbs* 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31

This Reading, a poem, concludes the Book of Proverbs. It praises a wife who embodies wisdom. While most people admire superficial traits, like charm that can deceive and beauty that swiftly fades, this poem declares that truly praiseworthy is the valiant woman. She is shaped by wisdom, which as the opening verses of Proverbs declare, begins with "the fear of the Lord." People should talk about her and those like her at the "city gates," the place where one catches up on the news in the biblical world.

# Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6

In this Reading, Paul is not warning believers about a terrifying future event but encouraging them to keep the faith in the present. "The Day of the Lord" is a metaphor that was used by the Hebrew prophets for the eventual full manifestation of Israel's God to the world. Paul teaches, as Jesus taught his disciples, that Christ would return when no one expects him, like a thief at night. He urges believers to manifest their belief that Christ is coming back by their lifestyle and pursuits. He calls them to live as "light children" and "day's children" for they do not live in darkness. Paul exhorts them to stay sober and alert to work together to shine the light of Christ's peace and the security that only Christ can bring into the dark, slumbering mass of humanity around them.

# Gospel: Matthew 25:14-30

Matthew places Jesus' telling of the parable of the talent two days before his passion—the supreme example of "using one's talents" for the kingdom—begins in Jerusalem. The master in the parable represents Jesus. A "talent" represents more than our modern definition of an inborn trait. Here, it is a huge allotment of divine goods that God entrusts to Jesus' disciples. Jesus commends the two servants who doubled their talents, but talks longest about the one talent servant because most Christians are like him. He wants to jar these believers out of their complacency before it is too late, to persuade them to do the work for the kingdom that he assigns them.

# PRAYERS & PRACTICES DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

### PRAYERS AND PRACTICES FOR REMEMBERING THE DEAD DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

\*Provided by the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions | Resources for November 2020 In countless cultures around the world, religious traditions honor those who have died. This is particularly prevalent in the month of November.

Throughout the last weeks of the Roman Catholic liturgical year, the Church reminds us of the "end times" with particular eschatological readings which refer to the coming of the Lord and the unpredictability of death. This year, the world has been especially visited by death. At this writing, the coronavirus pandemic has taken over 1,154,068 lives worldwide – about 4000 per day. In the United States, we have reached over 224,339 deaths. These are not empty statistics; these are very

real children of God who were loved and valued and will be missed by those who knew them. Therefore, this year, let us be even more attentive to prayer. Let us be mindful of the power of the liturgy to transform the lives of those who participate in it. Let us draw from our rich treasury of orations and Scripture in order to give comfort to our people. Most of all, let us commend the Dead to the merciful embrace of almighty God. May these prayers increase our faith and console those who mourn.





### POPE FRANCIS EXTENDS INDULGENCES THROUGHOUT NOVEMBER 2020

PLENARY INDULGENCE DURING MONTH OF NOVEMBER: Due to the coronavirus pandemic and the need to avoid large groups, the Plenary Indulgence applicable to the deceased by those who visit a cemetery has been extended beyond the normal dates of November 1-8. This year, the indulgence can be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, even if only mentally, on any day in November, and devoutly prays for the faithful departed. PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR FEAST OF ALL SOULS' DAY: Regarding the Plenary Indulgence attached to All Souls' Day, this year, it can be obtained not only on the preceding or succeeding Sunday, or on the actual Feast day, but on any other day of the month chosen by each member of the faithful. In this case, the indulgence is obtained by "devoutly visiting a church or an oratory", along with the recitation of the Our Father and the Creed, and the other requirements associated with a Plenary Indulgence.

THE HOMEBOUND: For anyone who cannot leave their home for various reasons, including Covid restrictions, they too can obtain the Plenary Indulgence by "uniting themselves spiritually to other members of the faithful". In this case, the condition of being "completely detached from sin" and the intention of completing the other requirements for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence remain. These conditions are Sacramental Confession, reception of Holy Communion and a prayer for the Holy Father's intentions. The Decree suggests that such prayer take place before an "image of Jesus or the Blessed Virgin Mary". Among the various prayers that are recommended are "prayers for the deceased, Morning or Evening Prayer from the Office of the Dead, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, meditating on various Gospel passages proposed for the liturgy of the Dead, or completing a work of mercy by offering to God the suffering and discomforts of one's own life." Directing a word to priests, the Decree asks that they make the Sacrament of Confession generously available and that they make Holy Communion available to the sick. In addition, all priests are invited to offer three Masses on All Souls' Day.

To: All Members of the Diocese of Honolulu

Aloha, Sisters and Brothers! Peace be with you!

This year of 2020 has brought us many unprecedented experiences and major adjustments to our lives and livelihoods due to the coronavirus pandemic. While we must not let down our guard and continue to observe prudent hygiene measures, we also want to look optimistically to the future. With Advent and Christmas coming, it is very important that we prepare ourselves well for these high holy days in which we celebrate the great gift of the Word of God taking flesh and dwelling among us. Therefore, I ask all the parishes to plan their Advent and Christmas schedules in such a way as to accommodate as many people as possible throughout these days.

Since mid-March through October 31, 2020 I have issued a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. I am hereby extending that dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation through **December 31, 2020**. As I do so, however, I urge everyone who is able to return to Mass, without undue risks to their health or the health of others, to do so. Please note that in the Diocese of Honolulu, besides all Sundays, the holy days of obligation are the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Tuesday, December 8; and Christmas on Friday, December 25. Again, while all are dispensed from the obligation of attending, I urge you to do so if you can.

It is highly recommended that those who do avail themselves of the dispensation substitute some other prayer experience so that worship of God does not lose its primary focus in our lives. One could do a home holy hour, pray the rosary, celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours, or do some reading of spiritual books and articles, especially the lives of the saints. Of course, we also encourage anyone who cannot attend Mass to watch a live-streamed Mass. We encourage everyone to reach out to those who may not hear this message on their own and invite them to "Come, let us adore him, Christ the Lord!

# **RE: NEW PANDEMIC RESTRICTIONS REGARDING FUNERALS**

Aloha.

Governor David Y. Ige's latest FOURTEENTH PROCLAMATION RELATED TO THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY signed on October 13, 2020 (Exhibit H) directs "any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or any other location, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law."

Therefore, effective immediately and until further notice, all Funeral Masses in the presence of a body (casket) in the state of Hawaii are to be postponed OR celebrated without the presence of the body.

Our clergy can still offer the Vigil for the Deceased and/or a Funeral Liturgy outside Mass at the mortuary/ funeral home, or a Committal Service at the cemetery. As an <u>exception</u> during this time, a Funeral Mass at church in the presence of an Urn or without the presence of the body may still be celebrated before the Committal. In that case, the body should be blessed with holy water at the cemetery, and the Final Commendation and Farewell should be included in the Committal Service (See Order of Christian Funerals, Chapter 6.)

# STEWARDSHIP > TRANSFORM NOVEMBER INTO A MONTH OF THANKSGIVING



Very soon Americans will celebrate the Thanksgiving holidays. Even during these uncertain times, we will have the urge to gather for sumptuous meals highlighted by turkey and pumpkin pie, traveling to and from the ancestral home, enjoying family, feasting on leftovers and perhaps even watching football. For many of us, Thanksgiving Day is so full of activity that there is a tendency to forget

what's at the heart of Thanksgiving, offering our thanks to God for the many gifts that have been bestowed upon us. Although sometimes the reason for the holiday is forgotten in our secular culture today, good stewards of their life and faith recognize that Thanksgiving should be directed primarily in God's direction.

Because the "busyness" of Thanksgiving Day can easily distract us from slowing down to a pace more suitable to adequately expressing our gratitude to God, perhaps this November we might allow Thanksgiving to permeate our lives for more than just a day. How about the entire month? Expressing gratitude is at the heart of good stewardship. So, let's dedicate a little time each day in November to giving thanks for our blessings.

Begin with Sunday, November 1 and Monday, November 2, All Saints Day and All Souls Day. Spend a few minutes each of those days thanking God for all the people in your life who have gone before you. Then, each day thereafter, set aside a few minutes to remember all that God has given you and say "Thank you."

Take part of a day and walk or hike down a woodland path. Express your gratitude for the beauty of God's autumn creation. Take a minute each day to thank the people in your life who matter to you. Tell them you're thankful for them. Drop someone a note, place a short phone call or maybe a video chat is in order. Telling people you're thankful for them will enrich your life as well as theirs.

Make a point to attend at least one Mass outside the regular weekend Masses. Going to Mass on Thanksgiving morning is an excellent way to enhance that holiday. As a community of faith, we know that giving glory to God in this way is an important aspect of our communal life of faith. Transform the month of November into a month of Thanksgiving. If you do, you will find your celebration of Thanksgiving Day a richer and fuller experience than you could have imagined. In fact, you might just discover that your overall happiness with life improves. May this month of Thanksgiving be a time when we not only say "Thank You" to God, family and neighbor, but a time when our hearts draw us much closer to the Lord.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least of my brothers you did for me." (Matthew 25:31 - Passage from Gospel Reading for the Feast of Christ the King).

On November 22, the Solemnity of Christ the King, our diocese will take up the U.S. Bishops' annual national second collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). The CCHD collection is more important than ever because the COVID-19 pandemic has had an especially severe impact on the vulnerable poor. In the Dioceses of Yakima and Spokane in central and eastern Washington, CCHD funds parish programs with Spanish -speaking pregnant migrant mothers and their farmworker families. In Hawaii this past year, CCHD funds donated from the Honolulu Diocese parish collections have helped homeless and formerly incarcerated women into housing and job training.

Please remember 25% of the CCHD collection stays in our diocese to build the Kingdom of God with some of the most vulnerable in our own islands.

RESPECT LIFE

As a ministry we would like to continue to Educate, Inform and bring Awareness and Provide Resources to the Public on issues focusing on the Sanctity of Life on a continual basis and Advertising the needs of the Pro Life ministries on a continual basis.

These are some things you should know:

Senate Bill 2237 Born Alive Infant Protection Act (Infanticide). We are encouraged to write to our representatives and senators not to pass this bill.

- ❖ Physician Assisted Suicide called Our Care, Our Choice Act, became law January 2019, we are the 7th state to legalize it in the U.S..
- ❖Did you know that Hawaii has introduced TelAbortion? What is TelAbortion?
- We are one of four states that have agreed to be part of this pilot program. It involves all the same steps and procedures as an in-person medical abortion, but you do not have to travel to an abortion clinic. Instead an abortion provider conducts a video evaluation over the internet. Any tests that may be needed are done at medical facilities close to your home.
- The abortion pills are then sent to you by mail.
- Hawaii is one of the four states currently using this pilot program.

We need to be aware of issues currently in our legislature that may become laws. We are for Pro-Life and need to take a stand in calling our legislatures how we feel and what we believe.
