Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading

Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading

Responsorial Psalm

Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31

Psalm: 128:1-5

Second Reading

Gospel

1 Thessalonians 5:1-6

Matthew 25:14-30

First Reading: Wisdom 6:12-16

Wisdom is intimately related to God. In this Reading, Wisdom is described as the divine breath or spirit, a pure outpouring of the glory of the Almighty, the mirror of divine power, and the image of divine goodness. Those who recognize the value of Wisdom's companionship are always on the lookout for her. Wisdom waits at the gate of those who seek her, delighted each day to set out with them on new adventures.

Second Reading: Thessalonians 4:13-18

In this Reading, St. Paul uses apocalyptic imagery, "the voice of an archangel and the trumpet of God coming from heaven," to convey symbolically the divine plan. In contrast to the more familiar idea that the dead "go up" to heaven to be with the Lord, in this passage, the Lord comes down from there. During the descent, the dead and those still living will be caught up together "in the clouds." They will meet the Lord "in the air," a term which scholars think denotes the earth's atmosphere. Since Christ died and rose, there is—in him—a seamlessness between the physical and spiritual worlds which allows the dead to remain somehow connected with the living.

Gospel: Matthew 25:1-13

In this Gospel, Matthew gathers Jesus' teachings about the end time, especially the final judgment. It compares the kingdom of heaven to ten virgins who go out to meet the bridegroom. Since there is no scheduled time for his arrival, the wise ones bring flasks of extra oil but the foolish ones do not. Their lamps begin to go out and they presume that the wise will share their oil. The oil, in this passage, represents something that cannot be shared; each person must provide it for himself or herself. While the foolish go off to purchase oil, the bridegroom comes and the wise go into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked. The foolish arrive and asks, "Lord, Lord, open the door for us!" Just as they expected the wise virgins to assist them they now expected the Lord to ignore their negligence and let them in. They hear a voice behind the door saying, "I do not know you." This parable warns that there will come a time when it's "too late" to do anything. Those who claim to be his disciples could, like the foolish virgins, find themselves standing for all eternity, watching the light from their lamps—lamps lit too late—bounce off that door that will never open again.

PRAYERS AND PRACTICES FOR REMEMBERING THE DEAD DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

In Loving Memory

In countless cultures around the world, religious traditions honor those who have died. This is particularly prevalent in the month of November.

Throughout the last weeks of the Roman Catholic liturgical year, the Church reminds us of the "end times" with particular eschatological readings which refer to the coming of the Lord and the unpredictability of death. This year, the world has been especially visited by death. At this writing, the coronavirus pandemic has taken over 1,154,068 lives worldwide – about 4000 per day. In the United States, we have reached over 224,339 deaths. These are not empty statistics; these are very real children of God who were loved and valued and will be missed by those who knew them. Therefore, this year, let us be even more attentive to prayer. Let us be mindful of the power of the liturgy to transform the lives of those who participate in it. Let us draw from our rich treasury of orations and Scripture in order to give comfort to our people. Most of all, let us commend the Dead to the merciful embrace of almighty God. May these prayers increase our faith and console those who mourn.

POPE FRANCIS EXTENDS INDULGENCES THROUGHOUT NOVEMBER 2020

PLENARY INDULGENCE DURING MONTH OF NOVEMBER: Due to the coronavirus pandemic and the need to avoid large groups, the Plenary Indulgence applicable to the deceased by those who visit a cemetery has been extended beyond the normal dates of November 1-8. This year, the indulgence can be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, even if only mentally, on any day in November, and devoutly prays for the faithful departed. PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR FEAST OF ALL SOULS' DAY: Regarding the Plenary Indulgence attached to All Souls' Day, this year, it can be obtained not only on the preceding or succeeding Sunday, or on the actual Feast day, but on any other day of the month chosen by each member of the faithful. In this case, the indulgence is obtained by "devoutly visiting a church or an oratory", along with the recitation of the Our Father and the Creed, and the other requirements associated with a Plenary Indulgence.

THE HOMEBOUND: For anyone who cannot leave their home for various reasons, including Covid restrictions, they too can obtain the Plenary Indulgence by "uniting themselves spiritually to other members of the faithful". In this case, the condition of being "completely detached from sin" and the intention of completing the other requirements for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence remain. These conditions are Sacramental Confession, reception of Holy Communion and a prayer for the Holy Father's intentions. The Decree suggests that such prayer take place before an "image of Jesus or the Blessed Virgin Mary". Among the various prayers that are recommended are "prayers for the deceased, Morning or Evening Prayer from the Office of the Dead, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, meditating on various Gospel passages proposed for the liturgy of the Dead, or completing a work of mercy by offering to God the suffering and discomforts of one's own life." Directing a word to priests, the Decree asks that they make the Sacrament of Confession generously available and that they make Holy Communion available to the sick. In addition, all priests are invited to offer three Masses on All Souls' Day.

Aloha, Sisters and Brothers! Peace be with you!

This year of 2020 has brought us many unprecedented experiences and major adjustments to our lives and livelihoods due to the coronavirus pandemic. While we must not let down our guard and continue to observe prudent hygiene measures, we also want to look optimistically to the future. With Advent and Christmas coming, it is very important that we prepare ourselves well for these high holy days in which we celebrate the great gift of the Word of God taking flesh and dwelling among us. Therefore, I ask all the parishes to plan their Advent and Christmas schedules in such a way as to accommodate as many people as possible throughout these days.

Since mid-March through October 31, 2020 I have issued a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. I am hereby extending that dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation through **December 31, 2020**. As I do so, however, I urge everyone who is able to return to Mass, without undue risks to their health or the health of others, to do so. Please note that in the Diocese of Honolulu, besides all Sundays, the holy days of obligation are the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Tuesday, December 8; and Christmas on Friday, December 25. Again, while all are dispensed from the obligation of attending, I urge you to do so if you can.

It is highly recommended that those who do avail themselves of the dispensation substitute some other prayer experience so that worship of God does not lose its primary focus in our lives. One could do a home holy hour, pray the rosary, celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours, or do some reading of spiritual books and articles, especially the lives of the saints. Of course, we also encourage anyone who cannot attend Mass to watch a live-streamed Mass. Sites are posted on our diocesan website at www.catholichawaii.org.

We encourage everyone to reach out to those who may not hear this message on their own and invite them to "Come, let us adore him, Christ the Lord!

Aloha.

Governor David Y. Ige's latest FOURTEENTH PROCLAMATION RELATED TO THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY signed on October 13, 2020 (Exhibit H) directs "any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or any other location, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law."

Therefore, effective immediately and until further notice, all Funeral Masses in the presence of a body (casket) in the state of Hawaii are to be postponed OR celebrated without the presence of the body.

Our clergy can still offer the Vigil for the Deceased and/or a Funeral Liturgy outside Mass at the mortuary/ funeral home, or a Committal Service at the cemetery. As an <u>exception</u> during this time, a Funeral Mass at church in the presence of an Urn or without the presence of the body may still be celebrated before the Committal. In that case, the body should be blessed with holy water at the cemetery, and the Final Commendation and Farewell should be included in the Committal Service (See Order of Christian Funerals, Chapter 6.)

STEWARDSHIP > DEEPENING OUR LIVES IN CHRIST

A number of years ago, I visited with the pastoral council of a local parish. It was the first meeting of the season for the council, and the first meeting for newly appointed members. I was asked to provide a brief introduction to stewardship. After prayer, I asked the group



"when I say the word 'stewardship' what first comes to mind?" This particular group's sharing was insightful: God asks us to care for all that we are and all that is; stewardship is about sharing what we have; it is a faith-response to Christ; stewardship is about using well something that is really God's. It was heartening to hear such understanding from this council and encouraging that I have heard similar responses from many groups in the past few years.

No longer, it seems, is "money" the first thing that comes to everyone's mind when they hear the word "stewardship." This increase in understanding is the result of the hard work, dedication, and leadership of many ICSC members: bishops, clergy and lay leaders. It is borne of consistent efforts to teach stewardship as a way of life. And just as stewardship itself is an expression of discipleship, applied in the daily circumstances of our lives, forming people as stewards requires us to continue to spread the message throughout the year.

I am grateful to know that many of us will gather together for our annual ICSC conference. This is our yearly opportunity to grow as leaders and as stewards; and most especially, to deepen our lives in Christ. Like the *pastoral* council with whom I met, we recognize that all we are and all we have truly are God's. Our time together to learn, explore and grow as stewardship leaders is a way of stewarding well our talents, knowledge, time, and friendship, as people who are committed to Christ's sacrificial way. Let us take this moment to re-dedicate ourselves as stewardship leaders, trusting in the providence of our good and gracious God in whose image we are created.

In the recently ended 2020 Census, Hawaii is among a dozen states which reached 99.9% of their households. This is great news!



FREE GRAB & GO MEALS FOR ALL KEIKI!



As part of a national effort to ensure no child ever goes to school hungry, the Hawaii Department of Education has launched a new program to feed ALL students for FREE for the remainder of the Fall 2020 semester. Thanks to additional funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Free Grab & Go meals will be available for pickup at 203 public schools across the state during regularly scheduled school days through Friday December 18. Distributions will be given to all keiki, regardless of whether or not they are enrolled in public school or have received free or reduced meals before the pandemic. Even children who are homeschooled or attend private schools are included. Please visit the DOE website for a complete list of participating campuses. Schools that are not listed will continue to provide meals during normal school schedules at the regular price.

If parents or guardians are picking up meals, they must provide one of the following verification documents:

- Official letter or email from school listing child(ren) enrolled
- Recent student report card(s)
- Attendance record(s) from parent portals of school websites
- Birth certificate(s) of child(ren)
- Student ID card(s)
- Driver's permit(s)/license(s) for high school students
- State-issued ID of the student

Meals are distributed at lunchtime only. Breakfast for the following day will also be given at that time. Children who require modified meals must email or call a request at specialdiets@k12.hi.us or call (808) 784-5500.
