

Next Sunday's Reading Second Sunday of Advent

First Reading Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

Responsorial Psalm Psalm: 85:9-14

Second Reading

2 Peter 3:8-14

Gospel Mark 1:1-8

First Reading: Isaiah 63:16-17, 19; 64:2-7

The new Christian liturgical year begins with a fervent prayer for restoration. Although originally uttered in the context of the Hebrew people's return from captivity in Babylon in the sixth century BC, the words of the prophet Isaiah are just as powerful and poignant in our day. Great hope was certainly in the hearts of all those called to journey back to the land of their ancestors. Yet their return was far from joyful. Instead, they found their lands pillaged and burned. Even with this devastation before them, they called out in confidence to God, knowing that he alone could make their return a source of blessing.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

In this Reading, Paul instructs the Corinthians to recognize that God's faithfulness is directly tied to their being called to "fellowship with his Son." There is much to be thankful for in God's grace at work in the community at Corinth, but the desire to share various and unique gifts for the sake of unity remains a great challenge.

Gospel: Mark 13:33-37

The word "watch" is repeated several times in this short Gospel Reading. Here Jesus compares "the watch" to the work of a gatekeeper who vigilantly remains alert at the door for his master's return. The season of Advent is designed to be a time of fine-tuning our Christian attitude of hopeful, joyful watching. We are to hear and obey the summons of the Lord to be alert and watchful. Our watching constitutes yearning for a world renewed by God and be perfect by his love and mercy. Using our gifts for others is the best way to stand ready and alert.

TREMEMBERING OUR BELOVED DEAD

We have until the end of the month of November to honor and pray for our beloved dead. A Book of Remembrance is placed on the church table for anyone to inscribe the names of their deceased and we'll pray for them at every Mass. Other ways to honor them include lighting candles for them (there are two candlestands at the back of the church), visiting their graves and praying and offering Masses for them. You also brought their pictures and posted them on the Memorial Board. Offering Envelopes are placed on the church table for your use in memory of the dead.

PRAYERS AND PRACTICES FOR REMEMBERING THE DEAD IN THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

In countless cultures around the world, religious traditions honor those who have died. This is particularly prevalent in the month of November.

Throughout the last weeks of the Roman Catholic liturgical year, the Church reminds us of the "end times" with particular eschatological readings which refer to the coming of the Lord and the unpredictability of death. This year, the world has been especially visited by death. At this writing, the coronavirus pandemic has taken over 1,154,068 lives worldwide - about 4000 per day. In the United States, we have reached over 224,339 deaths. These are not empty statistics; these are very real children of God who were loved and valued and will be missed by those who knew them. Therefore, this year, let us be even more attentive to prayer. Let us be mindful of the power of the liturgy to transform the lives of those who participate in it. Let us draw from our rich treasury of orations and Scripture in order to give comfort to our people. Most of all, let us commend the Dead to the merciful embrace of almighty God. May these prayers increase our faith and console those who mourn.

*Subject: INVITATION TO RETURN TO MASS AND EXTENDED DISPENSATION FROM OBLIGATION

To: All Members of the Diocese of Honolulu

Aloha, Sisters and Brothers! Peace be with you!

This year of 2020 has brought us many unprecedented experiences and major adjustments to our lives and livelihoods due to the coronavirus pandemic. While we must not let down our guard and continue to observe prudent hygiene measures, we also want to look optimistically to the future. With Advent and Christmas coming, it is very important that we prepare ourselves well for these high holy days in which we celebrate the great gift of the Word of God taking flesh and dwelling among us. Therefore, I ask all the parishes to plan their Advent and Christmas schedules in such a way as to accommodate as many people as possible throughout these days.

Since mid-March through October 31, 2020 I have issued a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. I am hereby extending that dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation through **December 31, 2020**. As I do so, however, I urge everyone who is able to return to Mass, without undue risks to their health or the health of others, to do so. Please note that in the Diocese of Honolulu, besides all Sundays, the holy days of obligation are the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Tuesday, December 8; and Christmas on Friday, December 25. Again, while all are dispensed from the obligation of attending, I urge you to do so if you can.

It is highly recommended that those who do avail themselves of the dispensation substitute some other prayer experience so that worship of God does not lose its primary focus in our lives. One could do a home holy hour, pray the rosary, celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours, or do some reading of spiritual books and articles, especially the lives of the saints. Of course, we also encourage anyone who cannot attend Mass to watch a live-streamed Mass. Sites are posted on our diocesan website at www.catholichawaii.org.

We encourage everyone to reach out to those who may not hear this message on their own and invite them to "Come, let us adore him, Christ the Lord!

Aloha.

Governor David Y. Ige's latest FOURTEENTH PROCLAMATION RELATED TO THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY signed on October 13, 2020 (Exhibit H) directs "any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or any other location, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law."

Therefore, effective immediately and until further notice, all Funeral Masses in the presence of a body (casket) in the state of Hawaii are to be postponed OR celebrated without the presence of the body.

Our clergy can still offer the Vigil for the Deceased and/or a Funeral Liturgy outside Mass at the mortuary/ funeral home, or a Committal Service at the cemetery. As an <u>exception</u> during this time, a Funeral Mass at church in the presence of an Urn or without the presence of the body may still be celebrated before the Committal. In that case, the body should be blessed with holy water at the cemetery, and the Final Commendation and Farewell should be included in the Committal Service (See Order of Christian Funerals, Chapter 6.)

Here's an important announcement and invitation to join a Covid-testing and Radiothon about covid-19:



A Radiothon Virtual Show on covid prevention and testing is being co-

sponsored by the Filipino Community Center and The Legal Clinic in cooperation with University of Hawaii Ethnic Education Program.

As you may or may not know, the Filipinos are in the top 3 in terms of infected cases in Hawaii. A group of Filipino leaders have come together to address the issue and they got funding from the Government CARES Act to do out-reach. The Filipino Catholic Club also plays an important role in this effort.

We invite you to tune in this <u>Saturday</u>, <u>November 28</u>, <u>from 10:00am to 12:00noon</u> on either of the 3 radio stations – KNDI or KPHI or KPRP. You can also log in to the *Facebook Page* of *Larry Ordonez* or the *Filcom Center Facebook Page*. Join and have a chance to win prizes with added entertainments.

The coordinators of the program will then schedule and administer covid-testing in different parish centers. Our Church at OLM is scheduled to hold the covid-testing for everyone this Sunday, November 29 after the 9:00am Mass.

• FAQ (Frequently asked questions):

♦ How will testing be done? > Just walk in because registration will be on-site.

❖Set up for testing: > The company that will be doing the testing will set up and clean up. The church as venue will provide: one 16 feet table; 4 chairs & power; specific location of testing. The open church ground is a good testing site.

❖What to bring? > *ID* and health insurance card. Important to wear face mask.

❖ Cost of testing: > The person tested does not have to pay. If the person has health insurance, the insurer will be billed. But you need to bring and show your health insurance card. For someone with no health insurance but wants to get tested, there is money available to pay for the test.

STEWARDSHIP—Deepening Our Lives In Christ

STEWARDSHIP > STEWARDSHIP BUILDS COMMUNITIES OF FAITH

In 2018, as part of the Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan, Cardinal Thomas Collins, archbishop of Toronto, instituted a stewardship pilot project to help promote Christian stewardship as a way of life in our parishes. From the spring of 2018, eight parishes, including Our Lady of Peace, participated in the project. The pilot project helped us examine the many different ways to engage parishioners to share their God-given gifts of time, talent and treasure in their parish communities. A team guided us to examine and to reflect on stewardship as "an expression of discipleship, with the power to change how we understand and live out our lives." We recognized that even though our parishes already have ministers serving in various ministries, the word "stewardship" was misunderstood and a few parishioners do everything. So, how do we inspire our parishioners to participate in fruitful stewardship? The project has given us some insight into what are considered to be best practices. These include ideas for stewardship in liturgy, spiritual formation and social activities, practices that have helped renew the spirit of stewardship in several parishes in other dioceses. We also learned about the effective communication methods suitable to our parishes to help with our parishioners' understanding of stewardship. We recognized that although our parishes may be different from each other because of the location or the backgrounds of the parishioners, activities like the celebration of Installation and Recognition ceremonies for ministers, Ministry Fair and creating an atmosphere of hospitality such as coffee Sundays have helped transform parishes into stewardship parishes.

At Our Lady of Peace, last October during our first Stewardship Week, we had lay witness talks that invited parishioners to reflect on their call to use their God-given gifts to live out their baptismal promises as faithful stewards. This year's celebration of Stewardship Sunday comes at a time of uncertainty due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but it can be an opportunity to reflect on how best to adapt our stewardship practices to meet the unique challenges of our current situation. It calls us to be creative and proactive in engaging our ministers who may not be in active ministry and also to attract more parishioners to become faithful stewards.

In his Pastoral Letter on Stewardship in 2018, Cardinal Collins wrote: "Stewardship is so deeply rooted in the foundational themes of the Gospel that it involves a permanent and continuous re-orientation of our approach to discipleship, and so provides a stable base for the life of faith in our communities." In fact, the life of faith in our communities is reflected on the blossoming of the fruits of the Archdiocesan Stewardship Project, the fruits being expressed during this COVID-19 pandemic. Since the lockdown, some ministers have been working behind the scenes to help run the parishes and to serve those in need in our communities. As the pilot project is extended to more parishes, it is our hope that more parishioners become involved in igniting the fire of stewardship in our parishes.

The reality of this COVID-19 pandemic is that despite the reduced attendance at Mass and reduced spiritual and social activities in our parishes, parishes will always be in need of ministers. Our celebration of Stewardship Sunday reminds us that when we strive to embrace stewardship, we transform our parish communities into vibrant places of Christian living where we serve to make the love of Christ real and present.

HELP CRS EMERGENCY EFFORTS FOR TYPHOON GONI & TYPHOON VAMCO RELIEF, PHILIPPINES

While the Philippines battles high levels of COVID-19 infection rates, residents are also struggling to recover from two major typhoons that slammed the country in a span of two weeks. Super Typhoon Goni (also known as Typhoon Rolly) was a Category 5 storm that swept through the main island of Luzon on November 1, impacting more than 2 million people with severe flooding, landslides and mass evacuations. It was the strongest cyclone on record eclipsing the previous record held by Haiyan and Meranti in November 2013.



While emergency efforts were still underway, Typhoon Vamco followed with more devastation,

striking Metro Manila on November 11. The storm caused more heavy rains, damaged homes, and increased displacement for families.

Fortunately, Catholic Relief Services, the international relief arm of the U.S. Catholic Bishops continues leading disaster recovery efforts. Because of its geographic location, the Philippine islands are prone to regular cyclone activity, heavy rains, and flooding. For this reason, CRS maintains a permanent presence in the Philippines, helping communities with disaster preparedness and working on the ground, ready to respond when storms strike. *<u>November 21-22</u> > *"Helping People Help Themselves"* > Second Collection




