

# The FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

January 3, 2021: The Feast of Epiphany celebrates the revelation of the birth of our Lord Jesus to the outside world. The light over the little town of Bethlehem has attracted magi from afar to the newborn king and revealed the light of the world to the ends of the earth..

The adoration of the Magi fulfills the oracle of Isaiah prophesying that the nations of the world would travel to the Holy City following a brilliant light and would bring gold and incense to contribute to the worship of God. Psalm 72 includes a verse about kings coming from foreign lands to pay homage to a just king in Israel. Paul's letter to the Church of Ephesus expresses God's secret plan in clear terms: "the Gentiles are...copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel."

If God permitted the Magi who were foreigners and pagans to recognize and give Jesus proper respect as the King of Jews, we should know that there is nothing in our lives that will keep God from bringing us to Jesus. Like the shepherds and the Magi we come to adore Jesus by worshiping at Mass with the gold of our love, the myrrh of our humility, and the frankincense of our adoration.

As the Magi chose another route to return to their homes, we need to choose a better way of life, abstaining from negative habits and repulsive behavior. We should also become stars leading others to Jesus as the star led the Magi to Jesus by removing the darkness of the evil around us and radiating Jesus' love through selfless service, fraternal fellowship, and compassionate care.

# Next Sunday's Reading The Baptism of the Lord

First Reading Isaiah 55:1-11

Responsorial Psalm

Isaiah 12:2-6

Second Reading 1 John 5:1-9 Gospel Mark 1:7-11

### First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6

In this Reading Isaiah proclaims the reclaimed beauty of Jerusalem after the years of darkness in exile. Isaiah heralds with joy: "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem." He announces to the people a message of vindication—"upon you the Lord shines and over you appears his glory." The reestablished radiance of Jerusalem comes with a hefty responsibility. While the people are meant to rebuild and reclaim their national status they are now to recognize that nations will be guided by the way in which they serve the Lord, The prosperity of Jerusalem is not for its own sake but so that God's light will radiate throughout the world. A renewed Jerusalem is a Jerusalem that will profit all the nations.

#### Second Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6

In this Reading, Paul declares that he is a steward of God's grace with the revelation of drawing people into Christ in order to unite them into one body. The grace revealed require unfailing commitment and self-sacrifice.

#### Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

This Gospel Reading establishes that Jesus is born in the line of David; he is not an outsider but is thoroughly Jewish. This is important because in the aftermath of the Temple's destruction, the objective is to convince Jews and Jewish Christians that Jesus is the fulfillment of the law. To-day's solemnity continues the celebration of the astonishing mystery of God's manifestation to the very ends of the earth. The visitors from the east symbolize the extent of God's salvation as it unfolds for peoples of every land. As they offer gifts, as would be fitting a king, they announce to the world that an astonishing event has taken place; all peoples will know the glory of God.

# PARISH STEWARDSHIP (contd)

- \*\*\*HANDICAP BATHROOM Parish volunteers, *Adriano Daligcon* and *Roger Isidro* repaired a leaking toilet bowl in the handicap bathroom by the sacristy and replaced a busted faucet in the rectory kitchen.
- \*\*\*SECURITY CAMERAS To augment security within the church compound, security cameras were purchased by *Fran Kovaloff* and installed as well as synchronized with the internet app by *Lambert Castillo*.
- \*\*\*CEMETERY ISSUES The cemetery caretaker, *Kalolo Tuhalafatai*, reported that an old *olo* tree fell to the ground because of strong winds last November. Another tree which is outside the perimeter fence is in danger of following suit. *Kalolo* recommended the cutting of the trees and look for a contractor to cut and dispose off the rubbish. Last week, *Kalolo* found out that the padlocks to the cemetery gate were extruded or removed intentionally by force. They have to be replaced so as to maintain the peace of the spirits resting there. A few days later, on December 15, one side of the gate was rammed and destroyed. *Kalolo* called the police officers to report the incident. He does not only maintain the upkeep of the area but also does some security responsibility and we are very grateful to him.
- **❖CHURCH ENVIRONMENT** Volunteer parishioners come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the weekend Masses. They spruce up the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other cleaning tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. During the time of the covid-19 pandemic, in compliance with the Diocese and government advisory they marked the seating in the pews and communion line for 6-ft distancing as well as place sanitizers for use by the mass-goers and disinfect the church. Included in this dedicated group are *Marivic Palting, Nellie Puzon, Bella Miranda, Ador Padilla, Doi Facuri, Gloria Rodrigues, Fran Kovaloff, Aida Isidro, Medy Macalma, Marichu Pe Benito and Corazon Orcino.

**LITURGY** - The livestreaming of OLM Sunday Mass at 9:00am for the sake of those sheltered-in during the covid-19 crisis will continue on via the OLM Facebook account and thru the kind services of the *Llamedo family*. The items for power-point projection at Mass include the readings and responses together with sacred graphics. For added health protection, *Andy Llamedo* installed a flexi-glass barrier at the lectern.

A new microphone on the lectern has been installed by *Jun Cortez*. His son, *Gene Cortez*, paid for the Shure Microflex microphone in the amount of \$236.17 as his stewardship offering to the Church. Much mahalo to *Gene!* 

There is a wi-fi hook-up to the parish hall on the Sunday Eucharistic celebration in case of an overflow in the church. This is made possible thru the high-tech know-how of *Jun Cortez* and *Fidel Flores* who also donated and put up wi-fi boosters in the church and hall for wider coverage and for security camera operation. Designated to operate the power-point projection during the Masses are – *Malia Balbuena* at the 6:00pm Saturday Vigil Mass, *Jun Cortez* at the 6:30am Sunday Mass while *Marc & Clem Ulep* and their kids, *David & Gerald*, take care of the 9:00am Mass. More operators have been recruited to assist in case of need – *Luis Joseph & Nathaniel Culao; Adam & Mitchell Baron*.

For the power-point slides and peoples' viewing delight in the hall, a new Hisense LED LCD 50" TV unit was recently donated as Christmas gift by *Silverio Palting*. The TV base and support were assembled by *Jun Cortez* & supervised by his faithful co-worker and wife, *Caridad*. The choir loft is also prepared for additional accommodation. In both areas, the faithful can attend the Mass and ministers can go to give Holy Communion to them.



To: All Parishioners of the Diocese of Honolulu

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Peace be with you!

One of the most difficult decisions I have had to make as a bishop was the suspension of public Masses due to the coronavirus pandemic from mid-March to late May, 2020. Since then, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days has been dispensed. In light of the ongoing pandemic, I am extending the dispensation through Tuesday, February 16, 2021, the day before Ash Wednesday.

While I am extending this dispensation for the sake of those who are at higher risk if they should be infected with the COVID-19 virus, I would like to urge all our parishioners who can safely do so to return to worship at Sunday Mass.

Why does the Church put such great importance on our celebration of Sunday Mass that it is a serious obligation for all Catholics to attend every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation? It is because the Eucharist is our unique physical encounter with our Lord Jesus Christ, who longs to be one with us and to strengthen us for our mission of living in his love and sharing his Good News with others. The Eucharist is not simply a series of rituals in which we engage, but it is the Memorial that Jesus himself left us in which he makes himself present to us. He offers himself to us in a physical manner, hidden under the guise of bread and wine, which by the power of the Holy Spirit invoked by the priest in the midst of his beloved Bride, the Church, become his Body and Blood. Jesus died on the cross for us, rose from the dead, and ascended into heaven. But he is the "living bread come down from heaven," who offers himself as real food and real drink to give us eternal life. (See the Gospel of John, Chapter 6.)

When his disciples first encountered the risen Jesus, it changed them from deserters and cowards into bold proclaimers of his Gospel who found joy even in offering their lives for him. So Jesus wants to encounter us to transform us so that we can proclaim to a world gone astray that he is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Yes, we can encounter Jesus in our private prayer, in reading the Scriptures, in feeding the poor and doing the works of mercy – and we must do these things! – but there is nothing compared to a physical encounter with him in the Eucharist. This is why the Church insists that all its members, whenever they are not legitimately impeded, come together in intimate communion with the Body of Christ in the Eucharist, so that the Body of Christ can renew and transform our world with renewed vigor of the living Christ Jesus.

Yes, under our current circumstances, we do have to make adjustments and live a "new normal." But there is nothing that compares to the great gift of his Real Presence that Jesus offers us in the Eucharist. We look forward to welcoming you back!

RE: LITURGICAL DIRECTIVES FOR THE CHRISTMAS SEASON DURING THE TIME OF PANDEMIC

\*REMINDERS FROM PRIOR DIOCESAN DIRECTIVES AND/OR PROTOCOLS:

- \* WEARING OF MASK OR MASK/FACE SHIELD In response to the Office of the Governor's "13<sup>th</sup> Proclamation related to the COVID-19 Emergency" (dated September 22, 2020): "All persons must wear face coverings in compliance with county orders, rules and directives." Our diocesan directive stands as promulgated in our latest MEMO: "Face coverings (masks or mask/face shields) will be worn at ALL times by ALL who participate at the Mass during the liturgical celebration. For those ministers with respiratory issues the use of a face shield instead of a face mask is highly recommended."
- \* Priests, deacons and other duly commissioned extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who are not at high risk of infection themselves may continue to take Communion to the homebound, always exercising proper hygiene procedures and wearing masks.
- \* In-person church meetings may continue (with no more than 5 people), <u>IF</u> proper social distancing and the wearing of masks is observed. Otherwise, meetings should continue to be conducted virtually.
- \* We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies (especially during the Christmas season) to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log -in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website. Daily and Sunday Masses are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. For a comprehensive and updated list please visit our website at <a href="https://www.catholichawaii.org">www.catholichawaii.org</a>.
- \* <u>FUNERAL SERVICES</u>: In compliance with the Office of the Governor's "14<sup>th</sup> Proclamation related to the COVID 19 Emergency" (dated October 13, 2020) (Exhibit H) directs "any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or <u>any other location</u>, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law." Therefore, all Funeral Masses in the presence of a body (casket) in the state of Hawaii are to be postponed OR celebrated without the presence of the body.
- \* Our clergy can still offer the Vigil for the Deceased and/or a Funeral Liturgy outside Mass at the mortuary/ funeral home, or a Committal Service at the cemetery.
- \* As an exception during this time, a Funeral Mass at church in the presence of an Urn or without the presence of the body may still be celebrated before the Committal. In that case, the body should be blessed with holy water at the cemetery, and the Final Commendation and Farewell should be included in the Committal Service (See Order of Christian Funerals, Chapter 6.)
- \* Religious Education, Youth and Young Adult Ministry and Faith Formation may continue following the proper guidelines provided by the Office of Religion Education and Faith Formation.

#### The USSCB article reads:

On December 14, Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades of Fort Wayne-South Bend, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Doctrine, and Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City in Kansas, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued a statement on the new COVID-19 vaccines. In their statement, the bishops address the moral concerns raised by the fact that the three vaccines that appear to be ready for distribution in the United States all have some connection to cell lines that originated with tissue taken from abortions.

"In view of the gravity of the current pandemic and the lack of availability of alternative vaccines, the reasons to accept the new COVID-19 vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna <u>are sufficiently serious to justify their use</u>, despite their remote connection to morally compromised cell lines."

"Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good."

With regard to the AstraZeneca vaccine, the bishops found it to be "more morally compromised" and consequently concluded that this vaccine "should be avoided" if there are alternatives available. "It may turn out, however, that one does not really have a choice of vaccine, at least, not without a lengthy delay in immunization that may have serious consequences for one's health and the health of others," the bishop chairmen stated. "In such a case ... it would be permissible to accept the AstraZeneca vaccine."

At the same time, the bishops also warned that Catholics "must be on guard so that the new COVID-19 vaccines do not desensitize us or weaken our determination to oppose the evil of abortion itself and the subsequent use of fetal cells in research."
