

LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS

Feb 2 / Tuesday - FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

It is called Candlemas day when the Church blesses candles. There is usually a procession with lit candles, if not around the church, at least, indoors. The invitation of the procession, "Let us go in peace to meet the Lord" is a rich and astounding summary of this feast day. The people may bring their candles to be blessed and for use at home for family prayers and devotions.



Feb 3 / Wednesday - MEMORIAL OF ST. BLAISE

It is the traditional day for the blessing of throats with the blessed candles. St. Blaise was Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia and martyred in the 4th century during the persecution of the Emperor Licinius. Certain miracle stories associated him with the healing of throats. Usually, the prayer of blessing is given while two crossed candles are placed around a person's neck.

Next Sunday's Reading Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading

Responsorial Psalm

Job 7:1-4, 6-7

Psalm 147:1-6

Second Reading

Gospel

1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23 Mark 1:29-39

First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

This Reading represents Moses' cautionary words to the Israelites concerning the authority of prophets, or leaders, who will follow in his footsteps. These words from Moses occur near the end of his life, when Israel is about to end their forty years of wandering in the desert. Moses cautions them not to be swaved by the allure of the power of those who perform sorcery, but rather discern well the intentions of those who claim to speak on God's behalf.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 7:32-35

In this Reading, Paul's ideas of how to be free of anxieties may strike us as outdated. To say that being married or unmarried constitutes whether a person will be anxious about serving the Lord or preoccupied with the things of the world does not really fit into a contemporary world view. Paul's worldview was such that the Lord's return was on the horizon and that the people of his day should not make major life changes in anticipation of being ready for this catalytic event. Preparing for this overturning of life as we know it should draw the attention of all - married or unmarried — so that we would work to make that anxiety our primary joy.

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

This Gospel tells of the theory of the messianic secret unique to Mark, that demons are able to see who Jesus truly is. We see this in today's Gospel as the demon declares, "I know who you are—the Holy One of God." Understanding Mark's desire to conceal Jesus' identity helps us appreciate the way in which the Lord has to struggle to claim authority with his teaching and with his proclamation of God's Kingdom. The city of Capernaum in Galilee is the place where Jesus assumes the role of a rabbi as he enters the synagogue on the Sabbath and teaches with authority "and not as the scribes." What makes Jesus' teaching fundamentally different from that of the scribes is demonstrated by what appends next: Jesus heals a possessed with an unclean spirit. In Jesus, the Law is actualized in his extension of God's mercy.

*POSTCARD PROJECT

The Unitarian Church is engaged in a postcard project that urges legislators to support Faith Action's Carbon Cashback legislation, which would rein in climate change.

The Carbon Cashback bill would set a fee on fossil fuels entering Hawaii, which would have the effect of increasing prices to consumers. Revenue raised from the fee will be returned to citizens of Hawaii in equal shares in the form of a dividend. Most people would benefit because their dividend would be bigger than their spending due to price increases.




*Lito and Leah Centino continue to tend and beautify the side of the Hall, Rectory and Pastoral Center with garden plants from their own nursery.



You may have some moral or ethical concerns regarding the potential contents (compromised cell lines/ fetal cells) of these vaccines in relation to our Catholic teaching and faith.

During this global pandemic, we should continue to fulfill our obligation of charity to one another in preventing the spread of the disease. This includes following Center for Disease Control (CDC) and local government guidelines in masking, social distancing, gatherings, etc. and could include receiving a vaccine for the protection and dignity of the lives of those in our communities. The choice of whether to receive the vaccine rests with the individual or with parents/guardians of minors. One of the most difficult decisions I have had to make as a bishop was the suspension of public Masses due to the coronavirus pandemic from mid-March to late May 2020. Since then, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days has been dispensed. In light of the ongoing pandemic, I am extending the dispensation through Tuesday, February 16, 2021, the day before Ash Wednesday.

While I am extending this dispensation for the sake of those who are at higher risk if they should be infected with the COVID-19 virus, I would like to urge all our parishioners who can safely do so to return to worship at Sunday Mass.

The Eucharist is our unique physical encounter with our Lord Jesus Christ, who longs to be one with us and to strengthen us for our mission of living in his love and sharing his Good News with others.

This is why the Church insists that all its members, whenever they are not legitimately impeded, come together in intimate communion with the Body of Christ in the Eucharist, so that the Body of Christ can renew and transform our world with renewed vigor of the living Christ Jesus.

Yes, under our current circumstances, we do have to make adjustments and live a "new normal." But there is nothing that compares to the great gift of his Real Presence that Jesus offers us in the Eucharist. We look forward to welcoming you back!

*REMINDERS FROM PRIOR DIOCESAN DIRECTIVES AND/OR PROTOCOLS

- * <u>WEARING OF MASK OR MASK/FACE SHIELD</u> In response to the Office of the Governor's "13th Proclamation related to the COVID-19 Emergency" (dated September 22, 2020): "All persons must wear face coverings in compliance with county orders, rules and directives." Our diocesan directive stands as promulgated in our latest MEMO: "Face coverings (masks or mask/face shields) will be worn at ALL times by ALL who participate at the Mass during the liturgical celebration. For those ministers with respiratory issues the use of a face shield instead of a face mask is highly recommended."
- * Priests, deacons and other duly commissioned extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who are not at high risk of infection themselves may continue to take Communion to the homebound, always exercising proper hygiene procedures and wearing masks.
- * In-person church meetings may continue (with no more than 5 people), <u>IF</u> proper social distancing and the wearing of masks is observed. Otherwise, meetings should continue to be conducted virtually.
- We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies (especially during the Christmas season) to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website. Daily and Sunday Masses are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. For a comprehensive and updated list please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org.
- * FUNERAL SERVICES: In compliance with the Office of the Governor's "14th Proclamation related to the COVID 19 Emergency" (dated October 13, 2020) (Exhibit H) directs "any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or any other location, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law." Therefore, all Funeral Masses in the presence of a body (casket) in the state of Hawaii are to be postponed OR celebrated without the presence of the body.
- * Our clergy can still offer the Vigil for the Deceased and/or a Funeral Liturgy outside Mass at the mortuary/funeral home, or a Committal Service at the cemetery.
- * As an exception during this time, a Funeral Mass at church in the presence of an Urn or without the presence of the body may still be celebrated before the Committal. In that case, the body should be blessed with holy water at the cemetery, and the Final Commendation and Farewell should be included in the Committal Service (See Order of Christian Funerals, Chapter 6.)
- * Religious Education, Youth and Young Adult Ministry and Faith Formation may continue following the proper guidelines provided by the Office of Religion Education and Faith Formation.
- * All prior memos, directives and protocols are still in effect unless changed in this memo. For any additional questions or concerns contact me at mccdero@rcchawaii.org or (808) 585-3342.

MEMORANDUM

Re: Ash Wednesday and the memorial of St. Blaise in 2021

You will recall that the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments issued two decrees last year (dated March 19 and March 25) that provided special guidance for the celebration of Holy Week during the pandemic. The instructions that were given were intended mostly to assist priests in circumstances in which the presence of a congregation would be impossible. Those provisions, however, were explicitly granted only for the year 2020. As Lent approaches, we will have to wait to see whether the Holy See will issue similar guidance this year, should the situation continue to warrant it.

In the meantime, the Congregation has issued a "Note on Ash Wednesday," and the Committee on Divine Worship wishes to offer some brief observations on it and on the celebration of the memorial of St. Blaise.

BLESSING OF THROATS ON THE MEMORIAL OF ST. BLAISE (February 3)

Note that the Book of Blessings contains the following provision for this rite: No. 1628. If, for pastoral reasons, each individual cannot be blessed in the manner described in no. 1627, for example when great numbers are gathered for the blessing or when the memorial of Saint Blaise occurs on a Sunday, a priest or deacon may give the blessing to all assembled by extending hands, without the crossed candles, over the people while saying the prayer of blessing. A lay minister says the prayer proper to lay ministers without making the sign of the cross. The current circumstances would certainly be considered a sufficient pastoral reason to avoid administration of the blessing to individuals in the usual manner, should there be any concern of danger due to the ongoing pandemic.

DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES ON ASH WEDNESDAY (February 17)

While Ash Wednesday is not a holyday of obligation and while there is no requirement for the clergy and faithful to receive the imposition of ashes, it is rightly observed as a celebration of high importance, and many will surely wish to participate even amid the current difficulties. During this time of pandemic, the Holy See has modified the method of distributing the ashes, as outlined in the following "NOTE":

- *These changes minimize the necessity of physical contact between minister and recipient and remove the need for the minister to speak while in close proximity to the recipient.
- *The distribution of ashes via sprinkling is a common practice in some countries but is not well known here.
- *Therefore, the Committee encourages ministers to provide some explanation to the faithful, to avoid unnecessary confusion.

*Note also that the Book of Blessings provides instructions for the distribution of ashes outside of Mass (nos. 1656-1678). As we move closer to Holy Week, the Committee on Divine Worship will continue to monitor developments and offer further observations for your consideration.


