Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading First Sunday in Lent

First Reading Genesis 9:8-15

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 25:4-10

Second Reading 1 Peter 3:8-22 Gospel Mark 1:12-15

First Reading: Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46

The Book of Leviticus contains the code of conduct belonging to priests of the tribe of Levi and designed to provide for its ongoing maintenance. It is particularly concerned with the behavior and ritual purity of those responsible for offering sacrifice on behalf of the community of Israel. This Reading confirms that purity is an important dimension of Hebrew Law because it represents wholeness. Those who suffer from leprosy or from any other severe form of skin disease had to be distanced from the camp. This isolation was understood not so much as a punishment but as a necessary precaution to ensure the holiness of the people. For the people to be God's holy people they had to be whole and without blemish.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1

Much of Paul's correspondence with the Christians in Corinth deals with their moral conduct. In this Reading, Paul gives them this instruction: "Whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God." To highlight God's glory at the expense of one's self-interest is precisely the example that Paul believes that he has shown the Corinthians. Thus, they would be very wise to be "imitators" of him, for he imitates Christ.

Gospel: Mark 1:40-45

The leper in today's Gospel clearly suffers from a visible impairment due to the affliction found on his skin. The law restricts this man from participation in the community; he is regarded as untouchable. He kneels before Jesus and begs him: "If you wish, you can make me clean." While many in the society of his day may have rushed to label this man as unclean, his most visible characteristic is his display of humility and faith, The intense desire on the part of this sick man is matched by Jesus' equally intense desire to heal him. Mark testifies that the disease left him "immediately."

At the same time, she took prudent precautions of hygiene to assure that she and her Sisters would not be infected.



LENTEN PRAYER JOURNAL:

Valentine's Day to Ash Wednesday



This February two events will take place in the same week. Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday are just three days apart. Valentine's Day encourages us to offer written expressions of our love and affection to others through cards and letters. Why not express our love for the Lord by keeping a prayer journal during Lent? The season of Lent can be a great time of spiritual growth and keeping a prayer journal can help strengthen our prayer life. Journaling can help us listen more intently to God's voice, track our spiritual growth, and deepen our relationship with the Lord.

There are different ways to keep a prayer journal. You can simply reflect on a passage from scripture, then write down your thoughts and feelings. Or, you can write down what the Holy Spirit places upon your heart during prayer. It's important to commit to a specific time and place each day to pray and spend time in silence with God. Then, as part of your prayer experience, write a few lines. Whether you want to express your gratitude, challenges, praises or laments, share them with the Lord in writing. RE: "DISPENSATION TO ATTEND MASS EXTENDED TO HOLY THURSDAY, APRIL 1"

February 1, 2021

Dear People of God of the Diocese of Honolulu,

Peace be with you!

As we go through the pandemic, we are enjoying the lifting of some restrictions, even as we still need to observe others for the safety and health of our community. I had extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation through February 16, 2021. I wanted to reinstate the obligation beginning with Lent, but since we still need to maintain social distancing in our churches, *I am hereby extending the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Mass through noon on Holy Thursday, April 1, 2021*, which marks the end of Lent. However, this time I am strongly urging that all who take the dispensation engage in some other form of prayer or worship as suggested below. While none of these can be the equivalent of attending Sunday Mass, they will serve to keep us connected to worship, especially during the penitential season of Lent. As I said in my last communication regarding the issue of Mass attendance, I urge all who are able to attend Sunday Mass to do so. There is nothing that substitutes completely for our weekly encounter with the risen Lord Jesus in the Eucharist. Nevertheless, if you cannot attend Sunday Mass, you are strongly encouraged to do one or more of the following:

- · Participate prayerfully in a live-streamed or televised Sunday Mass AND spend at least 15 minutes in meditation on the Scriptures, preferably those proclaimed at Mass. (These can be found at www.usccb.org/readings.)
- · Attend, in person, a weekday Mass AND spend at least 15 minutes on Sunday reading and meditating on the Sacred Scriptures.
- · Spend at least 30 minutes on Sunday prayerfully reading and meditating on the Sacred Scriptures.
- · Pray at least two rosaries on Sunday, meditating on the Glorious Mysteries and one other set of Mysteries you choose (i.e. Joyful, Sorrowful, Luminous).

Note that anyone who is sick should not attend Mass and is not obliged to do so. The above alternative spiritual exercises are strongly urged for those who are physically able to fulfill them. As we prepare for Lent, I also urge you to celebrate the sacrament of Penance. Consult with your parish for opportunities for communal Penance services or individual confessions. The gift of the Lord's mercy and healing is readily available to us in this beautiful sacrament. May you have a holy and renewing Lent as you prepare for the great celebration of the Paschal Mystery of the Death and Resurrection of the Lord!

Re: ASH WEDNESDAY

You will recall that the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments issued two decrees last year (dated March 19 and March 25) that provided special guidance for the celebration of Holy Week during the pandemic. The instructions that were given were intended mostly to assist priests in circumstances in which the presence of a congregation would be impossible. Those provisions, however, were explicitly granted only for the year 2020. As Lent approaches, we will have to wait to see whether the Holy See will issue similar guidance this year, should the situation continue to warrant it.

In the meantime, the Congregation has issued a "Note on Ash Wednesday," and the Committee on Divine Worship wishes to offer some brief observations on it.

DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES ON ASH WEDNESDAY (February 17)

While Ash Wednesday is not a holyday of obligation and while there is no requirement for the clergy and faithful to receive the imposition of ashes, it is rightly observed as a celebration of high importance, and many will surely wish to participate even amid the current difficulties. During this time of pandemic, the Holy See has modified the method of distributing the ashes, as outlined in the following "NOTE":

- *These changes minimize the necessity of physical contact between minister and recipient and remove the need for the minister to speak while in close proximity to the recipient.
- *The distribution of ashes via sprinkling is a common practice in some countries but is not well known here.
- *Therefore, the Committee encourages ministers to provide some explanation to the faithful, to avoid unnecessary confusion.

*Note also that the Book of Blessings provides instructions for the distribution of ashes outside of Mass (nos. 1656-1678). As we move closer to Holy Week, the Committee on Divine Worship will continue to monitor developments and offer further observations for your consideration.

*REMINDERS FROM PRIOR DIOCESAN DIRECTIVES AND/OR PROTOCOLS

- * <u>WEARING OF MASK OR MASK/FACE SHIELD</u> In response to the Office of the Governor's "13th Proclamation related to the COVID-19 Emergency" (dated September 22, 2020): "All persons must wear face coverings in compliance with county orders, rules and directives." Our diocesan directive stands as promulgated in our latest MEMO: "Face coverings (masks or mask/face shields) will be worn at ALL times by ALL who participate at the Mass during the liturgical celebration. For those ministers with respiratory issues the use of a face shield instead of a face mask is highly recommended."
- * Priests, deacons and other duly commissioned extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who are not at high risk of infection themselves may continue to take Communion to the homebound, always exercising proper hygiene procedures and wearing masks.
- * In-person church meetings may continue (with no more than 5 people), <u>IF</u> proper social distancing and the wearing of masks is observed. Otherwise, meetings should continue to be conducted virtually.
- We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies (especially during the Christmas season) to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website. Daily and Sunday Masses are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. For a comprehensive and updated list please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org.
- * FUNERAL SERVICES: In compliance with the Office of the Governor's "14th Proclamation related to the COVID 19 Emergency" (dated October 13, 2020) (Exhibit H) directs "any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or any other location, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law." Therefore, all Funeral Masses in the presence of a body (casket) in the state of Hawaii are to be postponed OR celebrated without the presence of the body.
- * Our clergy can still offer the Vigil for the Deceased and/or a Funeral Liturgy outside Mass at the mortuary/funeral home, or a Committal Service at the cemetery.
- * As an exception during this time, a Funeral Mass at church in the presence of an Urn or without the presence of the body may still be celebrated before the Committal. In that case, the body should be blessed with holy water at the cemetery, and the Final Commendation and Farewell should be included in the Committal Service (See Order of Christian Funerals, Chapter 6.)
- * Religious Education, Youth and Young Adult Ministry and Faith Formation may continue following the proper guidelines provided by the Office of Religion Education and Faith Formation.
- * All prior memos, directives and protocols are still in effect unless changed in this memo. For any additional questions or concerns contact me at mccdero@rcchawaii.org or (808) 585-3342.
