# Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Second Sunday of Lent

First Reading Responsorial Psalm Genesis 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18 Psalm 116:10, 15-19

**Second Reading** *Romans* 8:31-34 **Gospel** *Mark* 9:2-10

First Reading: Genesis 9:8-15

This Reading tells that after the flood God made a covenant with Noah. He promises never to destroy creation and sets a sign of the covenant in the heavens, a rainbow. The rainbow, like the dove, becomes a sign of peace. So, despite the terrors of war, the upheavals of nature, the catastrophes of human judgment, God's graciousness ensures stability "for all future generations." The reestablishment of God's orderly rule after the flood would have had a strong impact on the community hoping to regroup after the disaster of the exile.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 3:8-22

In this Reading, Peter tells of Jesus going to make a proclamation to the spirits in prison who had disobeyed in the time of Noah. The precise meaning of this passage is hard to grasp, but the general sense seems clear: Christ's death is a powerful Gospel for all times and people, admitting people into a new spiritual Noah's ark that saves them through the ritual flood of Baptism.

**Gospel:** *Mark* 1:12-15

In this Gospel, Mark depicts Jesus being tempted in the wilderness by Satan. It contains a variety of characters that are important in contemplating the nature of Jesus' temptation. The First is the Spirit who is responsible for driving Jesus into the desert for the duration of forty days. Next appears Satan, who is mentioned simply as tempting Jesus. Also in the story are the wild beasts, who certainly represent the mystery of nature. Finally, there appear the angels, who are responsible for ministering to the Lord.

been a special day of devotion for Catholics. This year, of course, will be different as Ash Wednesday, celebrated on February 17, is situated in a time when health and safety precautions are of the utmost importance. We are in the middle of a pandemic. Nevertheless, Ash Wednesday continues to be an outward sign of the beginning of a season of penitence and we embrace the call.

Wednesday heralds. Christian of the semestimate the call. Wednesday heralds. Christian stewards will greet Lent with the best of intentions. But sometimes, we reach Easter disappointed in our own efforts. Here are some suggestions for keeping us on task during this Lenten season:

- Plan ahead Give thought and prayer to what will most help you draw closer to Jesus during this special season. Write your intentions down, and review them often.
- Keep it simple Like those folks who sign up for gym memberships on January 1 and give up by January 15, sometimes we approach Lent with too many resolutions. Be realistic and don't set yourself up for guilt.
- Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the pillars of Lent Try to do one thing in each of these categories. Stretch yourself a bit and come up with something new and challenging.
- Keep your eyes on Jesus Coming closer to him through his passion and resurrection is our goal.
- Prepare your home with Lenten reminders If you have no crucifix in your living areas, place one there. If you have a crucifix, perhaps affix a spot of purple to it as a reminder of Lent. Find a special picture or holy card that speaks to you and display it.
- Simplify something tangible in your daily life, like your closet or your schedule.
- Place a special candle on the dining room table, and when your family says grace each evening, encourage them to share the struggles and joys of their Lenten resolutions, or perhaps an act of kindness they did that day. This is a good activity for kids.
- If possible and safe, take your family to the Stations of the Cross at least once.
- Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and encourage your family to do so.
- Make it a point to prepare for and participate in the beautiful Triduum liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and even the Easter Vigil even if you can only do this online. Celebrate the completion of your Lenten exercises.
- After Easter, reflect on your Lenten practices Remember, God's mercy to us is unlimited. It's not all about what "we" did, but what God does within us.

# FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP

RE: "DISPENSATION TO ATTEND MASS EXTENDED TO HOLY THURSDAY, APRIL 1"

February 1, 2021

Dear People of God of the Diocese of Honolulu,

Peace be with you!

As we go through the pandemic, we are enjoying the lifting of some restrictions, even as we still need to observe others for the safety and health of our community. I had extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation through February 16, 2021. I wanted to reinstate the obligation beginning with Lent, but since we still need to maintain social distancing in our churches, *I am hereby extending the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Mass through noon on Holy Thursday, April 1, 2021*, which marks the end of Lent. However, this time I am strongly urging that all who take the dispensation engage in some other form of prayer or worship as suggested below. While none of these can be the equivalent of attending Sunday Mass, they will serve to keep us connected to worship, especially during the penitential season of Lent. As I said in my last communication regarding the issue of Mass attendance, I urge all who are able to attend Sunday Mass to do so. There is nothing that substitutes completely for our weekly encounter with the risen Lord Jesus in the Eucharist. Nevertheless, if you cannot attend Sunday Mass, you are strongly encouraged to do one or more of the following:

- · Participate prayerfully in a live-streamed or televised Sunday Mass AND spend at least 15 minutes in meditation on the Scriptures, preferably those proclaimed at Mass. (These can be found at <a href="https://www.usccb.org/readings">www.usccb.org/readings</a>.)
- · Attend, in person, a weekday Mass AND spend at least 15 minutes on Sunday reading and meditating on the Sacred Scriptures.
- · Spend at least 30 minutes on Sunday prayerfully reading and meditating on the Sacred Scriptures.
- · Pray at least two rosaries on Sunday, meditating on the Glorious Mysteries and one other set of Mysteries you choose (i.e. Joyful, Sorrowful, Luminous).

Note that anyone who is sick should not attend Mass and is not obliged to do so. The above alternative spiritual exercises are strongly urged for those who are physically able to fulfill them. As we prepare for Lent, I also urge you to celebrate the sacrament of Penance. Consult with your parish for opportunities for communal Penance services or individual confessions. The gift of the Lord's mercy and healing is readily available to us in this beautiful sacrament. May you have a holy and renewing Lent as you prepare for the great celebration of the Paschal Mystery of the Death and Resurrection of the Lord!

# **MEMORANDUM**

To: Clergy and Parishes

Date: December 7, 2020

### \*REMINDERS FROM PRIOR DIOCESAN DIRECTIVES AND/OR PROTOCOLS

- \* <u>WEARING OF MASK OR MASK/FACE SHIELD</u> In response to the Office of the Governor's "13<sup>th</sup> Proclamation related to the COVID-19 Emergency" (dated September 22, 2020): "All persons must wear face coverings in compliance with county orders, rules and directives." Our diocesan directive stands as promulgated in our latest MEMO: "Face coverings (masks or mask/face shields) will be worn at ALL times by ALL who participate at the Mass during the liturgical celebration. For those ministers with respiratory issues the use of a face shield instead of a face mask is highly recommended."
- \* Priests, deacons and other duly commissioned extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who are not at high risk of infection themselves may continue to take Communion to the homebound, always exercising proper hygiene procedures and wearing masks.
- \* In-person church meetings may continue (with no more than 5 people), <u>IF</u> proper social distancing and the wearing of masks is observed. Otherwise, meetings should continue to be conducted virtually.
- We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies (especially during the Christmas season) to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website. Daily and Sunday Masses are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. For a comprehensive and updated list please visit our website at <a href="https://www.catholichawaii.org">www.catholichawaii.org</a>.
- \* FUNERAL SERVICES: In compliance with the Office of the Governor's "14<sup>th</sup> Proclamation related to the COVID 19 Emergency" (dated October 13, 2020) (Exhibit H) directs "any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or any other location, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law." Therefore, all Funeral Masses in the presence of a body (casket) in the state of Hawaii are to be postponed OR celebrated without the presence of the body.
- \* Our clergy can still offer the Vigil for the Deceased and/or a Funeral Liturgy outside Mass at the mortuary/funeral home, or a Committal Service at the cemetery.
- \* As an exception during this time, a Funeral Mass at church in the presence of an Urn or without the presence of the body may still be celebrated before the Committal. In that case, the body should be blessed with holy water at the cemetery, and the Final Commendation and Farewell should be included in the Committal Service (See Order of Christian Funerals, Chapter 6.)
- \* Religious Education, Youth and Young Adult Ministry and Faith Formation may continue following the proper guidelines provided by the Office of Religion Education and Faith Formation.
- \* All prior memos, directives and protocols are still in effect unless changed in this memo. For any additional questions or concerns contact me at <a href="mailto:mcchawaii.org">mcchawaii.org</a> or (808) 585-3342.



The items for power-point projection at Mass include the readings and responses together with sacred graphics. 



This week's message from Faith Action is an update from Foo Pham, chair of our Housing Task Force, which is called Housing Now! Foo provides news about the five issues which his task force is pursuing with the legislature.

FAITH ACTION TASK FORCE UPDATE -- HOUSING HousingNOW! is the Faith Action Task Force to address housing issues. Its five Steering Committee-approved issues include: 1) an empty homes fee; 2) a community-led housing mandate; and 3) the affordable, locally owned homes for all (A.L.O.H.A.) Homes proposal. 4) Taxation of real estate investment trusts (REITs), corporations profiting off revenue-generating real estate investments, has returned as a fourth issue for Faith Action. 5) The fifth issue is the redevelopment of Aloha Stadium into the New Aloha Stadium Entertainment District (NASED).






