

LIVE-STREAM: MASS & WAY OF THE CROSS

"T will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living."



First Reading: Genesis 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18

This Reading depicts why Abraham is known as the "Father of Faith." One might question why Abraham did not struggle to defend his son's life. It is important to keep in mind what Isaac represents. Not only does he exist to engender the affection between a father and a son, he also stands as the gateway to the future. Since God had promised the aged Abraham that he would carve out a great nation from among Abraham's descendants, the death of Isaac would nullify God's covenant with Abraham. When Abraham ascends Mount Moriah with his son, God is able once again to speak words of blessing. God accepts Abraham's obedient faith and provides the ram by which Abraham is able to solemnly offer. Then God reiterates his promise to make of Abraham a great nation, with countless descendants.

Second Reading: Romans 8:31-34

In the Reading, Paul wants the Romans to be confident in all that God has done in handing over his own Son. If God is capable of permitting the suffering and death of his beloved, then surely God will not fail to provide for those who have been chosen through Christ.

Gospel: Mark 9:2-10

This Gospel tells the story of the Transfiguration which must be understood as a visible manifestation of God's glory. Because Jesus is accompanied on the mountain by Peter, James and John, the dramatic change in the Lord's appearance is intended to be witnessed and carried forth to others. Just as Moses appears to the Israelites with his face transfigured (Exodus 34:29-35), giving witness to the intimate relationship he shares with God, so does the Transfiguration of Jesus testify to God's intimacy with his Son. When God speaks, *"This is my beloved Son. Listen to him,"* Peter, James and John should have no doubt that Jesus is God's son, a relationship of unbreakable intimacy. The Transfiguration of Jesus is not a dramatic revelation to be contained on the mountaintop; it is meant to be taken out into the world.

Basic Stewardship Question: Am J Searching for God?

A priest told this story once to illustrate how important it is to identify what you truly value and then pursue it. He was a teenager, he said, and he and his cousin were playing basketball in his cousin's driveway. Suddenly, the cousin realized he had lost a contact lens. This was before the era of disposable contact lens. Back in those days, you bought one pair of hard contact lens and kept them until the next time you had an eye exam. They were costly, and people often found themselves on all fours searching for a missing contact.

So it was with the future priest and his cousin. They scoured the driveway and even looked in the surrounding grass. Alas, no contact lens was found, so they went inside to have a soda. In the house, they told the cousin's dad what had happened. He immediately went outside and started to search. *"It seemed that he was out there forever,"* said the priest. *"He looked and looked and looked. And amazingly, he found that contact lens. Why did he find the missing lens and we didn't? Because my cousin and I were looking for a contact, but my uncle was looking for a hundred dollars."*

To the priest, this humorous memory held a deeper truth: when we know the value of something, and desire it enough, we will be relentless in our search for it. For Christian stewards, the search for God in our lives can never be a half-hearted, tepid response. It must be all or nothing. The search is a lifelong commitment. Thomas Merton offered a basic principle of stewardship: *"A life is either all spiritual or not spiritual at all."* What is the stewardship question for me? Am I ready and willing to commit to the long search for God in my life?

UPDATES ON COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

Good Morning!

Effective tomorrow, **Thursday, February 25, 2021** the City and County of Honolulu (**Oahu Island**) will move to Tier 3. All other counties (islands) need to continue observing the rules promulgated by their respective Mayor's offices. An official declaration from the Mayor of Honolulu office is not yet published, so we don't have too many details regarding how it will affect our spiritual services and current practices. However, the following is already known:

1. Spiritual Services (i.e., Sunday and daily Mass, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, prayer groups, Stations of the Cross, etc.): **Allowed** at full capacity as long as we continue to maintain 6-foot distancing (not much change here from our current Tier 2 situation).

2. Social gatherings/meetings at church grounds: **Allowed** now for up to 10 people maintaining 6-foot social distancing.

3. Funeral Homes/Cemeteries: **Allowed** to have up to 25 people at their services (i.e. Vigil for the Deceased, Wakes, Funeral Liturgy outside Mass and burials).

4. Funeral Mass at Church continues with <u>an URN only</u> - at full capacity - as long as we maintain proper social 6-foot distancing (no change in this area).

5. Continue the **MANDATORY** use of mask/face shield by everyone at all times.

6. Continue the use of hand sanitizing and washing hands as often as possible.

7. Use of conference/breakrooms: Allowed - spaced 6-feet apart.


8. No change on current music/singing practices.

9. Religious Education continues as currently directed. Please check with the Office of Religious Education (*Jayne Mondoy*) and the Office of the YYAM (*Lisa Gomes*) for more information.

I will send more information out as soon as the new proclamation is issued by the office of the Mayor of Honolulu.

RE: "DISPENSATION TO ATTEND MASS EXTENDED TO HOLY THURSDAY, APRIL 1"

February 1, 2021

Dear People of God of the Diocese of Honolulu,

Peace be with you!

As we go through the pandemic, we are enjoying the lifting of some restrictions, even as we still need to observe others for the safety and health of our community. I had extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation through February 16, 2021. I wanted to reinstate the obligation beginning with Lent, but since we still need to maintain social distancing in our churches, *I am hereby extending the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Mass through noon on Holy Thursday, April 1, 2021*, which marks the end of Lent. However, this time I am strongly urging that all who take the dispensation engage in some other form of prayer or worship as suggested below. While none of these can be the equivalent of attending Sunday Mass, they will serve to keep us connected to worship, especially during the penitential season of Lent. As I said in my last communication regarding the issue of Mass attendance, I urge all who are able to attend Sunday Mass to do so. There is nothing that substitutes completely for our weekly encounter with the risen Lord Jesus in the Eucharist. Nevertheless, if you cannot attend Sunday Mass, you are strongly encouraged to do one or more of the following:

• Participate prayerfully in a live-streamed or televised Sunday Mass AND spend at least 15 minutes in meditation on the Scriptures, preferably those proclaimed at Mass. (These can be found at <u>www.usccb.org/</u> readings.)

· Attend, in person, a weekday Mass AND spend at least 15 minutes on Sunday reading and meditating on the Sacred Scriptures.

· Spend at least 30 minutes on Sunday prayerfully reading and meditating on the Sacred Scriptures.

• Pray at least two rosaries on Sunday, meditating on the Glorious Mysteries and one other set of Mysteries you choose (i.e. Joyful, Sorrowful, Luminous).

Note that anyone who is sick should not attend Mass and is not obliged to do so. The above alternative spiritual exercises are strongly urged for those who are physically able to fulfill them. As we prepare for Lent, I also urge you to celebrate the sacrament of Penance. Consult with your parish for opportunities for communal Penance services or individual confessions. The gift of the Lord's mercy and healing is readily available to us in this beautiful sacrament. May you have a holy and renewing Lent as you prepare for the great celebration of the Paschal Mystery of the Death and Resurrection of the Lord!

*****HOME REPAIRS** – *Roger Isidro* did some odd jobs of fixing the door latch, hinges and lock at the doorway, cabinets and storage room in the parish hall.

***CEMETERY MAINTENANCE – The Catholic cemetery caretaker, *Kalolo Tuihalafatai,* reported the completion of the cutting and hauling away of the storm-felled eucalyptus tree on the cemetery ground. With the approval of the Parish Facilities & Maintenance Committee *Puli Construction* was awarded the contract and did a great job of clearing the area of other rotting trees, stumps and debris. The contract price for labor, materials and equipment was \$5,200.00.

CHURCH ENVIRONMENT – Volunteer parishioners come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the weekend Masses. They spruce up the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other cleaning tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. During the time of the covid-19 pandemic, in compliance with the Diocese and government advisory they marked the seating in the pews and communion line for 6-ft distancing as well as place sanitizers for use by the mass-goers and disinfect the church. Likewise, to *Luida Susa* for donating \$500.00 for sanitizers and other needed paraphernalia for disinfection.

CITURGY - The livestreaming of OLM Sunday Mass at 9:00am for the sake of those sheltered-in during the covid-19 crisis will continue on via the OLM Facebook account and thru the kind services of the *Llamedo family*. The items for power-point projection at Mass include the readings and responses together with sacred graphics. For added health protection, *Andy Llamedo* installed a flexi-glass barrier at the lectern.

A new microphone on the lectern has been installed by *Jun Cortez*. His son, *Gene Cortez*, paid for the Shure Microflex microphone in the amount of \$236.17 as his stewardship offering to the Church. Much mahalo to *Gene! Jun* and wife, *Caridad*, installed wires for wi-fi connection and clearer live-streaming from the rectory to the church.

There is a wi-fi hook-up to the parish hall on the Sunday Eucharistic celebration in case of an overflow in the church. This is made possible thru the high-tech know-how of *Jun Cortez* and *Fidel Flores* who also donated and put up wi-fi boosters in the church and hall for wider coverage and for security camera operation. For the power-point slides and peoples' viewing delight in the hall, a new Hisense LED LCD 50" TV unit was recently donated as Christmas gift by *Silverio Palting*. Recently, the parish purchased 2 chrome books to make the livestreaming and power-point presentation at the hall even better.


