Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Easter Sunday

First Reading
Acts of the Apostles

Responsorial Psalm *Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23*

Second Reading Colossians 3:1-4 Gospel John 20:1-9

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

This Reading constitutes the third of the four "Suffering Servant" songs of Isaiah. It is likely that these verses were sung among the Hebrew people during the years of exile in Babylon in recognition of the suffering they endured in their expulsion from their land. While they certainly looked forward to the day when a savior would come who would take their suffering upon himself and release them permanently from bondage, they understood themselves as a nation struggling to be faithful to God as they ensured the many trials and afflictions that accompanied exile.

Second Reading: Philippines 2:6-11

This hymn is sung throughout the year at Evening Prayer on Sundays. It praises Christ for his willingness to empty himself of divine power in order to become "obedient to the point of death." It is sung on a regular basis because it contains the primary description of what it means to be Christ-like. One cannot claim to be a follower of Christ if he or she is not willing to empty oneself for the sake of others. As a means of accepting the complete obedience of Jesus, the hymn states that God "greatly exalted him," by giving him a name that would call for the bowing low of every creature of the cosmos. When the profession "Jesus Christ is Lord" rings out throughout the universe, God's name is given further glory.

Gospel: Mark 14:1-15:47

The final line of Chapter 13, immediately prior to beginning of Mark's account of the Passion, contains Jesus' warning his disciples to "stay awake." With this warning in mind, Chapter 14 opens with Mark setting the stage for the chaos that is about to ensure. The first part is the timing: the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread are only two days away. This should be a time of preparation and joyful expectation. Instead, the chief priests and the scribes are plotting a way to put Jesus to death. A mixture of evil intent amongst the preparations for a festival are meant to permeate the Lord's Passion.



CHRISM MASS

*Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa – March 30 at 7:00 PM

The Holy Mass is presided by *Bishop Larry Silva* and attended by both priests and deacons together with the lay faithful. The Clergy will renew their Ordination promises. It is a sign of the unity and communion of the priests with their bishop. In this Mass, there will also be the blessing of holy oils of the Sick and of Catechumen and the consecration of the Chrism. The couple, *Carlito and Aurelia Centino*, will represent the OLM Church in receiving the holy oils for use in our parish. They will present the set of oils to the parish community at the Hoy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper.

THE SACRED PASCHAL TRIDUUM

*April 1-4

Within the Holy Week is the sacred Paschal Triduum. Also called Easter Triduum, it begins with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, continues with the commemoration of Christ's Passion and Death on Good Friday, culminates with the Resurrection celebration on Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday and ends with the conclusion of Vespers on Easter Sunday. "Since Christ accomplished his work of human redemption and of the perfect glorification of God principally through his Paschal Mystery, in which by dying he has de-









stroyed our death, and by rising restored our life, the sacred Paschal Triduum of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord shines forth as the high point of the entire liturgical year." (Ordo: *Universal Norms*, 18-19). On Good Friday, our parish will start the **novena to the Divine Mercy**.



❖REPAIR & MAINTENANCE

***CHURCH REPAIRS – The successive days of rain caused leaks on the walls behind the sanctuary creating cracks and moldy floors. *Roger Isidro* and *Rudy Fiesta* came to the rescue doing some patching on the concrete wall inside and outside. They also included to re-strengthen the beams for the bells at the belfry.

***HOME REPAIRS – Roger Isidro did some odd jobs of fixing the door latch, hinges and lock at the doorway, cabinets and storage room in the parish hall.

***CEMETERY MAINTENANCE – The Catholic cemetery caretaker, *Kalolo Tuihalafatai*, reported the completion of the cutting and hauling away of the storm-felled eucalyptus tree on the cemetery ground. With the approval of the Parish Facilities & Maintenance Committee *Puli Construction* was awarded the contract and did a great job of clearing the area of other rotting trees, stumps and debris. The contract price for labor, materials and equipment was \$5,200.00.

❖CHURCH ENVIRONMENT – Volunteer parishioners come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the weekend Masses. They spruce up the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other cleaning tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. During the time of the covid-19 pandemic, in compliance with the Diocese and government advisory they marked the seating in the pews and communion line for 6-ft distancing as well as place sanitizers for use by the mass-goers and disinfect the church. Included in this dedicated group are Marivic Palting, Nelie Puzon, Bella Miranda, Ador Padilla, Doi Facuri, Gloria Rodrigues, Fran Kovaloff, Aida Isidro, Medy Macalma, Marichu Pe Benito, Angie Sera and Corazon Orcino.

MAHALO to *Myra dela Cruz* who supplies our church with fresh flowers that bedeck the sanctuary. BIG THANKS also to *Tom & Olivia Mita* for donating 3 infra-red thermometers for use in covid-tracing. Likewise, to *Luida Susa* for donating \$500.00 for sanitizers and other needed paraphernalia for disinfection.

LITURGY - The livestreaming of OLM Sunday Mass at 9:00am for the sake of those sheltered-in during the covid-19 crisis will continue on via the OLM Facebook account and thru the kind services of the *Llamedo family*. The items for power-point projection at Mass include the readings and responses together with sacred graphics. For added health protection, *Andy Llamedo* installed a flexi-glass barrier at the lectern.

A new microphone on the lectern has been installed by *Jun Cortez*. His son, *Gene Cortez*, paid for the Shure Microflex microphone in the amount of \$236.17 as his stewardship offering to the Church. Much mahalo to *Gene! Jun* and wife, *Caridad,* installed wires for wi-fi connection and clearer live-streaming from the rectory to the church.

There is a wi-fi hook-up to the parish hall on the Sunday Eucharistic celebration in case of an overflow in the church. This is made possible thru the high-tech know-how of *Jun Cortez* and *Fidel Flores* who also donated and put up Wi-Fi boosters in the church and hall for wider coverage and for security camera operation. Designated to operate the power-point projection during the Masses are — *Malia Balbuena* at the 6:00pm Saturday Vigil Mass, *Jun Cortez* at the 6:30am Sunday Mass while *Marc & Clem Ulep* and their kids, *David & Gerald*, take care of the 9:00am Mass. More operators have been recruited to assist in case of need — *Luis Joseph & Nathaniel Culao; Adam & Mitchell Baron*.

For the power-point slides and peoples' viewing delight in the hall, a new Hisense LED LCD 50" TV unit was recently donated as Christmas gift by *Silverio Palting*. The TV base and support were assembled by *Jun Cortez* & supervised by his faithful co-worker and wife, *Caridad*. Recently, the parish purchased 2 chrome books to make the livestreaming and power-point presentation at the hall even better. *Continued*)

GREAT NEWS! COVID-19 VACCINATION AT OLM TODAY

When: March 28, 2021 > Sunday after the 9:00am Mass

This Sunday is the covid vaccination day at OLM. There are 100 vaccine slots available. The vaccine is Moderna. The vaccine is made available by *Project Vision* from the *UH John A. Burns School of Medicine*. This was made possible through the efforts of the *Fil-Com Center CARES Project* led by *Drs.: Agnes Malate, Amy Agbayani, May Rose Dela Cruz, Clementina Ceria-Ulep,* other *UH faculty, staff and students*. We are working in collaboration with the *Diocesan Congress of Filipino Catholic Clubs* and *Oahu Council of Filipino Catholic Clubs*.

Here are the eligibility criteria:

- 1) individuals who are 65 and older
- 2) individuals who are 16-64 years old with underlying conditions
- 3) essential worker as appropriate

*In the news last March 12, the State of Hawaii is opening vaccine eligibility to Hawaii residents 65 and older and those in the Phase 1C category starting Monday, March 15. This includes essential workers in the hospitality industry, food service, transportation, water/wastewater, construction, banking and finance, communications, energy, legal, media, public safety and public health workers, as well as 16- to 64-year-old with high-risk medical conditions.

When coming for your vaccination, you need to <u>bring an ID, must wear a facial mask and observe 6 feet distancing when standing in line.</u>

Those who signed up and were called by the Outreach Team will surely have their moment. Kindly listen to the instruction of the medics when you're done.

*BREAKING NEWS FROM FRAN KOVALOFF & CLEMENTINA CERIA-ULEP

The Vaccine Clinic Staff came to OLM last Friday, March 26, for a site visit.

There were two teams: Team 1 - *Agnes Malate* and *Josie* * Team 2 - *Nurses, Darrah and Kelly*.

- > The clinic at OLM is confirmed for Sunday, March 28, 2021.
- > There are 79 appointments. The appointment times are set:
 - * The first is Fr. Edgar at 11:00 and the last is Fr. Sebastian Soosai at 12:18pm.
- > They do not want to disrupt Mass. They understand that the start time may be delayed, dependent when Mass is done.
- > Calls will be made to registered people with their appointment times. The calls will be done by the *Fil-Com CARES Project* staff and volunteers, most of the volunteers are *Filipino UH students*. The calls will be done tomorrow afternoon.
- > They will bring their own supplies. OLM will supplement with hand sanitizers, disinfectant spray and paper towels should they need more.
- > Their arrival time at OLM is around 10:45 am. The nurses will park alongside the Hall; easy to transport their supplies to/from the Hall.
- > Best location to vaccinate left side of Hall; with 3 tables set up. The tables will not take away any chair space.
- > Announcement at Mass: "Everyone, please exit the church parking to clear the lot for those coming to get vaccinated."
- > Kalihi-Uka School parking will be open from 6:00am. Will add to the announcements.
- > After the Mass, those attending in the Hall will be directed to exit the back door (by the stage).
- > Those with appointments will wait outside the hall along the 6'- distanced yellow tape.
- > Chairs already set up in the Hall will remain the same.
- > Each vaccination takes about 2 minutes.
- > Chairs along the windows will be the waiting area for those requiring further observation.
- > EMTs will be on site for any emergencies.
- > Each one needs to complete a form. OLM can make copies and distribute so they can be filled before their appointment time, at home or while they wait in line.
- > The list with the appointment times was sent via email so will be able to answer those who call inquiring for their appointment time.
- > A survey will follow at the end. The survey is conducted by one of the Fil-Com CARES Project lead, *Dr. May Rose dela Cruz*, who is a faculty and researcher from the UH Office of Public Health.






PRIESTHOOD ORDINATION OF DEACON ESE'ESE (ACE) TUI

At the start of 2021 our Faith Action staff and some of our Board members began having one-on-one meetings with all Steering Committee representatives from each member unit. Subject: NEW PANDEMIC RESTRICTIONS REGARDING FUNERALS

Aloha,

Governor David Y. Ige's latest FOURTEENTH PROCLAMATION RELATED TO THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY signed on October 13, 2020 (Exhibit H) directs "any cemetery, cemetery authority, mortuary, mortuary authority, or person engaged in the provision of funeral services or who embalms bodies is prohibited from transporting a body to a residence or <u>any other location</u>, unless it is the location of burial authorized by law." Therefore, effective immediately and until further notice, all Funeral Masses in the presence of a body (casket) in the state of Hawaii are to be postponed OR celebrated without the presence of the body.

Our clergy can still offer the Vigil for the Deceased and/or a Funeral Liturgy outside Mass at the mortuary/funeral home, or a Committal Service at the cemetery. As an exception during this time, a Funeral Mass at church in the presence of an Urn or without the presence of the body may still be celebrated before the Committal. In that case, the body should be blessed with holy water at the cemetery, and the Final Commendation and Farewell should be included in the Committal Service (See Order of Christian Funerals, Chapter 6.)

To: All Pastors and Parishioners

From: Bishop Larry Silva Date: March 5, 2021

Peace be with you!

As we continue on our Lenten journey, we look forward to the joyful celebration of the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, the greatest event in the history of the world. We have been living in this strange time of the pandemic, and now with decreasing numbers of cases, increasing accessibility to vaccines, and "herd immunity" on the horizon, we should be able to celebrate Easter in a more normal fashion this year. Since our Sunday encounter with the Risen Lord in the Eucharist is the source and summit of who we are as Christians, it is important that we return to our weekly celebrations.

Effective Easter Sunday, April 4 (or as of the Easter Vigil, April 3), I am ending the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass, which has been in effect since mid-March, 2020. However, anyone who is sick, may have been exposed to anyone with COVID19, or who has a health condition that would endanger themselves or others by being present in church, continues to be dispensed.

In order to better accommodate larger numbers of people, especially on Easter Sunday, pastors are to determine whether extra seats can be added on lanais, additional Masses can be added to the schedule, or live-streaming in the parish hall can be done and Holy Communion taken to those who participate by this means. If anticipated numbers simply cannot be safely accommodated in a particular parish, a pastor can dispense from the Sunday Mass obligation, either for individual parishioners or certain groups of parishioners, and for a specified period of time not to exceed two months without consultation with the Bishop of Honolulu.

At the same time, I realize that we must stay vigilant about our health protocols, and so the following norms must continue to be observed:

- · Masks must be worn by all who attend Mass or other liturgical services.
- · Social distancing and no-touch greetings and Sign of Peace remain the norms.
- · Holy Communion is to be given only under the species of Bread.
- The use of a small choir is permitted during Holy Week and the Easter season. If the parish is using a choir, choir members need to continue following the rules for indoor singing as directed by the state ["Any person(s) singing shall maintain physical distancing of at least ten (10) feet from any other person(s) while singing. Members of the same performing group singing may be closer than ten (10) feet together while performing, provided the group consists of less than ten (10) persons. To the extent reasonable and practicable, a physical barrier (e.g., plexiglass) of sufficient size to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 shall separate any person(s) singing from any other person(s), but not including members of the same performing group.]
- · A distance of 10 feet between the cantor and the congregation needs to be observed as much as possible.
- · In addition to the Entrance, Offertory, Communion and Leave-taking hymns the Kyrie, Gloria, Responsorial Psalm, Gospel Acclamation and the rest of the Mass part responses could be sung during Holy Week and the Easter season, observing the proper precautions.
- · Sanitization is to continue between Masses.
- · Social gatherings after Mass should still not take place.
- · We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website.

UPDATES ON COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

Good Morning!

Effective tomorrow, **Thursday, February 25, 2021** the City and County of Honolulu (**Oahu Island**) will move to Tier 3. All other counties (islands) need to continue observing the rules promulgated by their respective Mayor's offices. An official declaration from the Mayor of Honolulu office is not yet published, so we don't have too many details regarding how it will affect our spiritual services and current practices. However, the following is already known:

- 1. Spiritual Services (i.e., Sunday and daily Mass, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, prayer groups, Stations of the Cross, etc.): **Allowed** at full capacity as long as we continue to maintain 6-foot distancing (not much change here from our current Tier 2 situation).
- 2. Social gatherings/meetings at church grounds: **Allowed** now for up to 10 people maintaining 6-foot social distancing.
- 3. Funeral Homes/Cemeteries: **Allowed** to have up to 25 people at their services (i.e. Vigil for the Deceased, Wakes, Funeral Liturgy outside Mass and burials).
- 4. Funeral Mass at Church continues with **an URN only** at full capacity as long as we maintain proper social 6-foot distancing (no change in this area).
- 5. Continue the **MANDATORY** use of mask/face shield by everyone at all times.
- 6. Continue the use of hand sanitizing and washing hands as often as possible.
- 7. Use of conference/breakrooms: Allowed spaced 6-feet apart.
- 8. No change on current music/singing practices.
- 9. Religious Education continues as currently directed. Please check with the Office of Religious Education (*Jayne Mondoy*) and the Office of the YYAM (*Lisa Gomes*) for more information.

I will send more information out as soon as the new proclamation is issued by the office of the Mayor of Honolulu.


