*Please refer to the latest directives provided by the Diocese Office of Worship.

*The State has announced that 70% of the population must get covid vaccination to lift the imposed restrictions. Meanwhile, as we resume our public celebrations of the Holy Mass on days and weekends, we continue to observe health and safety protocols of keeping 6-ft distancing, hand-washing and hygiene practices, wear face covering, until we reach the 70% level.

*When you come for Holy Communion, receive the Body of Christ only with your hand and take off your mask only when you actually consume it.

*Dispensation for not attending mass in churches due to high risk or fear of infecting or contracting coronavirus has been lifted up by Bishop Larry Silva starting April 3, 2021. However, those who feel not really able yet to come for reason of sickness are not forced to come. Nevertheless, they are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed mass to fulfill their Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide the live-streamed Mass every Sunday at the 9:00am Mass. There are prayers available that we can use individually or as a family. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put an end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. Let us stay safe, healthy and blessed and continue to pray for one another and for the whole world.

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading 2 Kings 4:42-44

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 145:10-11, 15-18

Second Reading Ephesians 4:1-6 Gospel John 6:1-15

First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6

In this Reading, God speaks through Jeremiah who condemns the kings of Judah for their bad shepherding of the people of Israel. It is followed by a series of messages against false prophets who were associated with the priests of Jerusalem. But God, as the shepherd, will gather the remnant of those who had been taken into exile and bring them back to the land. Then God, will appoint other shepherds who will guide God's chosen to safety. Jeremiah goes on to write about the restoration of David's kingly dynasty. This future king will be a righteous branch from David's line. He will be just and right in conduct and in character. Christians understand this messianic prophecy to refer to Jesus.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18

Paul demonstrates to the Church of Ephesus the ways Jesus brought them closer, both to God and to each other. Christ reversed the state of humanity's alienation from God due to sin and who made humanity a new creation. Paul talks about Jesus as the one who effects reconciliation.

Gospel: *Mark* 6:30-34

Shepherding is the theme of the Gospel. Jesus welcomes the Twelve back from their missionary journey and listens to the reports of all that they had done. But the crowds that gathered around Jesus and the Twelve were overwhelming. Recognizing that they were exhausted from their journey, he takes them away by boat—they are near the Sea of Galilee—to find a deserted place where they can rest. But the crowds follow them and arrive even before they can disembark from the boat. Jesus' heart is *moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd*. He began to teach them many things.

Dear Pastors and parishioners,

Governor Ige's July 8 updates to the State's Safe Travels Program and Reopening Hawai'i Strategy did not change any restrictions for the Catholic Church, except for the increases in limits for indoor and outdoor events. See list below.

All other directives expressed in past communications, especially Bishop Larry's March 5, 2021 memo are still in place. While we do not enforce these policies, we continue to rely on the integrity of our pastors and parishes to consider the safety of our faithful with continued urgency and attention. New covid-19 cases and deaths are still a reality. Although at times frustrating, we must remain patient and understanding as we abide by national, state, city, and diocesan policies.

General

- Spiritual Services (i.e., Sunday and daily Mass, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, prayer groups, Stations of the Cross, etc.): Allowed at full capacity as long as we continue to maintain 6-foot distancing between singles (when alone) and 6' between households.
- · Masks must be worn by all who attend indoor functions such as Mass, other liturgical services, and meetings.
- Continue the use of hand sanitizing and washing hands as often as possible.

Holy Mass

- Social distancing and no-touch greetings and Sign of Peace remain the norms.
- Holy Communion is to be distributed only under one species, namely, the Body of Christ.
- Singing by the entire congregation is still discouraged. Follow your county guidelines.
- The use of a small choir is permitted. If the parish is using a choir, choir members need to continue following the rules for indoor singing as directed by the state: "Any person(s) singing shall maintain physical distancing of at least ten (10) feet from any other person(s) while singing. Members of the same performing group singing may be closer than ten (10) feet together while performing, provided the group consists of less than ten (10) persons. To the extent reasonable and practicable, a physical barrier (e.g., plexiglass) of sufficient size to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 shall separate any person(s) singing from any other person(s), but not including members of the same performing group."
- In addition to the Entrance, Offertory, Communion and Leave-taking hymns the Kyrie, Gloria, Responsorial Psalm, Gospel Acclamation and the rest of the Mass part responses could be sung by the choir, observing the proper precautions.
- A distance of 10 feet between the cantor and the congregation needs to be observed as much as possible.
- Sanitization is to continue between Masses.
- Social loitering/gatherings after Mass are discouraged.

Workplace

With the State of Hawaii now in Tier 5, supervisors have the authority to determine in-office scheduling for their direct reports. This means that employees may be required to work from the office full-time or a hybrid of remote working and in-office work. We are monitoring County and State requirements and will be issuing updates should the situation change.

The following directives remain in force for employees and volunteers:

- You must wear a mask indoors unless alone without others around.
- Maintain social distancing of 6 feet. We can now have an indoor meeting up to 25 people as long as all individuals even those fully vaccinated are masked and can space out 6 ft.
- Please regularly disinfect your workspace and other communal equipment and high touch items (copiers, mail machines, refrigerator door *handles*, doorknobs, light switches, etc.)
- No communal food, potluck, or "food tables" allowed. Be aware of spacing and sanitation in the lunch-room.

Other Concerns

- [UPDATED] Indoor events/meetings: Allowed now for up to 25 people maintaining 6-foot social distancing and masked
- [NEW] Outdoor events: Allowed up to 75 people with appropriate Covid-19 mitigation efforts in place.
- No communal food, potluck, or "food tables" allowed at parish events.
- Funeral Mass at Church continues with an URN only at full capacity as long as we maintain proper social 6-foot distancing (no change in this area). Bodies are not allowed to be transported to Houses of Worship per the Governor's Exhibit G of his 21st Proclamation.
- Use of conference/breakrooms: Allowed spaced 6-feet apart.
- Religious Education continues as currently directed. Please check with the Office of Religious Education (Jayne Mondoy) and the Office of the YYAM (Lisa Gomes) for more information.

When the Son of God entered into his public ministry, he called to himself the Twelve Apostles, upon whom he entrusted his own power and authority to cast out demons, cure diseases, and to preach the kingdom of God and to heal (c.f. Lk. 9:1-2). Yet our Lord and his Apostles were not without support in their ministry. Certain women, some who were acknowledged by name, and many other people who were acknowledged only anonymously, provided for them out of their means (cf. Lk. 8:1-3). To this day, our Lord continues to call certain men to himself for the sake of priestly ministry, and the need for provision crucially remains. especially during the time of a man's formal academic formation within the seminary system.

Not including the overhead and operational expenses typically associated with managing an Office of Vocations, the education costs alone (tuition, room and board) per each seminarian total approximately \$320,000 over the course of his four years of undergraduate studies in philosophy, four

years of graduate studies in Theology, and one year of

pastoral formation within a parish community. Because of these costs, and despite the generosity of so many of the faithful, the Office of Vocations operates, on average, annually at a deficit of over \$200,000.

HOUSING AFFORDABLE FOR US. CHANGE RULES ON WHO QUALIFIES.

This is a summary of the third of a six-part series covering concepts the May 2021 housing opinion survey the *HousingNOW! Task Force* gave to members. It's part of preparations for the next legislative session.

Ninety-eight percent of Faith Action members agree housing subsidized by the state should be restricted to Hawaii residents who rent/own only the subsidized home provided them. We cover three qualifications or requirements for gaining a state subsidized housing unit: 1) you must be a Hawaii resident, 2) you must live in your subsidized unit, and 3) you must own no other real property.

While Hawaii residency is easily established, state subsidized housing should be reserved for those who qualify as Hawaii residents. These residents and their families must live in the units that state subsidies make possible. If they sell or vacate, the same rules apply to any new owners or tenants. Also, all home occupants must own no other real property. Absentee owners control too much Hawaii housing, while too many Hawaii residents play at buying, renting, and flipping for profit.

State subsidized units should be low-cost. That means "no-frills" projects with small (600 sq. ft.) units and utilitarian entry halls, but with low maintenance fees, nearby common area recreation, and proximity to store fronts, medical facilities, and restaurants generating income to support the project. The projects will attract those most needing a home, while sending higher income earners elsewhere, resulting in no formal income limitations.

STEWARDSHIP: PASTORAL LEADERSHIP

*(This is the second in a series of articles by Dr. Dan R. Ebener on leading stewardship and evangelization in the Catholic Church. They are based on his book, Pastoral Leadership: How to Lead in a Catholic Parish, published by Paulist Press and the Villanova University Center for Church Management. Dr. Ebener teaches at St. Ambrose University in Davenport, Iowa.)

The Church needs spiritual revitalization of the heart and minds of our people -A deeper sense of lay engagement and conscious participation.

The pastor concluded, "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." The people replied, "Thanks be to God." The end of each Mass is a new beginning. As the people of God, we are welcomed at the beginning of each Mass to "come and see" (John 1:39 and John 1:46) as disciples, members and stewards. By the end of the liturgy, we are beckoned to "go and tell" (Matt 28:19; Mark 16:15; Luke 14:23) as apostles, leaders and evangelists. The dismissal at the end of each Mass is a call to stewardship, evangelization and leadership. We are sent forth to love, serve and evangelize the world. It is an invitation to live like disciples (who are "called forth") and to lead like apostles (who are "sent forth"). Many people would love to join a parish full of joyful, lively enthusiasm for Christ. Social neuroscience demonstrates that human beings long for a sense of purpose and connectivity. We want to know we are making a difference on something that matters. And we want to be connected to people who are making that difference.

If the purpose of the parish is to form disciples, we need leaders who can breathe new life into our parishes. Such leadership can emerge from anyone, anywhere. The Church needs leadership because we need "adaptive change", that which cannot happen with an easy fix. What kind of adaptive change? Spiritual revitalization of the heart and minds of our people. A deeper sense of lay engagement and conscious participation. Joyful celebrations of the liturgy. A warmer sense of hospitality. A burning passion to share the mission of Jesus. A clearer vision of the Kingdom of God. Dialogue about what matters most. These are challenges in search of leadership. Challenges seek leaders. Leaders seek challenges. The Church needs servant leaders to take up these challenges.
