

❖ HAPPY INDEPENDENCE DAY 2021! ❖


It's the Fourth of July! We take this national holiday and weekend an opportune occasion --

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading Amos 7:12-15 Responsorial Psalm Psalm 85:9-14

Second Reading

Gospel

Ephesians 1:3-14

Mark 6:7-13

First Reading: Ezekiel 2:2-5

In this Reading, Ezekiel witnesses an elaborate vison of God's throne. He hears the heavenly voice, which addresses him as "son of man." It is God's way of addressing the prophet as a human representing the human community; Ezekiel is a creature and not God. Ezekiel is called to deliver a message of condemnation against his fellow Israelites for refusing to abide by God's covenant with an invitation to repentance. The heavenly voice tells him that the task is not easy; the people will resist. But they will know that a prophet has spoken.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 12:7-10

This Reading tells that all is not well in the Christian community in Corinth. Paul boasts of the many sufferings he endured for the sake of preaching the message of Jesus Christ. He speaks of a "thorn in the flesh" which has traditionally been interpreted to be a physical disability or a psychological disorder. But it could also refer to his opponents because of their persistent attacks. However, Paul makes sense of his never-ending suffering for the sake of God's work. In his weakness, Paul says, the power of Christ is able to dwell in him. Such is the mystery of the cross.

Gospel: Mark 6:1-6

The Gospel tells that Jesus came to his native place but was rejected by the hands of his own people. Jesus called disciples, taught with authority, and performed many miracles. However, the Jewish religious authorities joined the Herodians in a plot to get rid of Jesus. They view Jesus as a threat to their power. The witnesses to Jesus' teaching ask where he got his knowledge and power, meaning, who was his teacher. What they do not understand is that God is his teacher and the source of his power. The crowd belittles Jesus, calling him a carpenter and son of a woman. Jesus recites a proverb that we still hear today: "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." Jesus could do no miracles there, not because his power was diminished, but because of the crowd's lack of faith.



BEATING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

*Please refer to the latest directives provided by the Diocese Office of Worship.

*The State has announced that we are 55% in covid vaccination but as we resume our public celebrations of the Holy Mass on days and weekends, we continue to observe health and safety protocols of keeping 6-ft distancing, hand-washing and hygiene practices, wear face covering, until we reach the 70% level.



*When you come for Holy Communion, receive the Body of Christ only with your hand and take off your mask only when you actually consume it.

*Dispensation for not attending mass in churches due to high risk or fear of infecting or contracting coronavirus has been lifted up by Bishop Larry Silva starting April 3, 2021. However, those who feel not really able yet to come for reason of sickness are not forced to come. Nevertheless, they are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed Mass to fulfill their Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide the live-streamed Mass every Sunday at the 9:00am Mass. There are prayers available that we can use individually or as a family. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put an end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. STEWARDSHIP & LEISURE TIME

The number of travelers on the highways and in airports is a hopeful sign that those nightmarish months, filled with anxiety and stress, are over. Some business analysts suggest that Americans may have a tendency to want to "catch up" with the work they have not been able accomplish these past 14-16 months. Those in the mental health fields argue, however, for extended periods of rest and relaxation, especially now in the summer months. They argue for longer respites from work and even trips that take us away from cell phone coverage, internet and Zoom meetings. Maybe we are not in a position to take much time off, but all of us can resonate with the need to really "get away" from work or the daily grind or the constant demands of social media. Even the Gospels suggest that good steward-

ship of our bodies, minds and souls obliges us to get away on a regular basis (see Luke 5:16).

As Christian stewards, we aren't just encouraged but obligated to consider how we approach our stewardship of leisure time. Stewards are aware of their need to be busy doing God's work, but often forget that down time is equally important to spiritual growth. Leisure time, whether it's our evenings, our weekends, or our vacation, provides spiritual, physical, mental and emotional recharging. Leisure is necessary for human wholeness. Leisure reconnects us to the wider mysteries of our world and our God. It helps us daydream, imagine, pray. It refreshes our spirit.

Today, connectivity has become almost an obsession. People check their emails, their messages and calls with alarming repetitiveness. Accidents, both pedestrian and automobile, happen because people can't put down their phones. Employers expect their workers to be available for evening emails. The lines between work and free time increasingly blur, as do the lines between solitude and always being present "online." We can't imagine putting aside screens for a two-week vacation. But we must give ourselves time to renew and recharge, not just two weeks of the year, but each day and each week.

July offers an opportunity to reconnect with the rhythms of God and nature. We need to take time off from screens and phones, and practice giving undivided attention to the things before us. When we pray, we commit time and silence. When we enjoy time with our friends and family, we practice being totally present. When we sit on the patio or at the beach, we give ourselves wholly to the wind or the waves. Be a good steward of your body, mind and soul. Don't overschedule your time off. Listen to the quiet whisper of God encouraging you to relax. (Lifted from *ICSC e-bulletin, July 2021*)


