A KEY TO GOOD STEWARDSHIP: Welcoming People Back To Mass



The COVID pandemic may not be over yet, but there are many hopeful signs we see all around us for a return to some sense of normalcy. One indicator is that more people are returning to the weekend Masses. We could see a return of parishioners and visitors to our parish for weekend liturgies as people begin to relax and travel in the summer months. The creative way we greet and provide hospitality for our guests during these times of social distancing says a lot

about our practice of good stewardship.

Providing hospitality to parishioners and strangers alike is a hallmark of Christian stewardship. In the Gospel of Matthew good stewards were commended for their hospitality: "I was a stranger and you welcomed me" (Matt. 25:35). Saint Benedict directed his followers to receive guests and travelers as if they were Christ. Extending hospitality is especially important when it comes to welcoming visitors who may be attending Mass at our parish for the first time. There is significant anecdotal evidence suggesting that the ability of a person to have a meaningful experience of Christ in the liturgy is directly impacted by the warmth of the welcome extended by the local worshipping community. When people say hello, the worship experience is enhanced. A warm welcome is part of evangelization, work necessary in a church's mission to help people discover or renew their faith in Christ. How do we treat the unknown person who walks by us in church, or who sits next to us at Mass? Do we ignore them? Talk around them? Look at them and say nothing? Do we take the initiative to greet them, smile and extend a warm welcome? Remember, we are Christ's ambassadors (2 Corinthians 5:20). Our actions and reactions toward returning parishioners and new visitors at Mass communicate who we are and who we represent. Let us take time to welcome others to our parish this summer. Welcoming gestures, however small, will not only have a positive impact on fellow parishioners and visitors, they will also make us more hospitable ambassadors of Christ.

"Lord, it is good to give thanks to you."

*<u>REMINDER</u>: The Bishop has lifted on April 3 the dispensation from attending the Holy Mass in person which was issued at the height of the covid pandemic. This means we are now obliged to be physically present in church to fulfill our Sunday obligation. However, for those who cannot go to church for serious reasons, we are extending the livestreaming of the Holy Mass from our Church to bring them the Lord's blessings.



First Reading: Ezekiel 17:22-24

This Reading tells that Jewish traditions sometimes compared God's work in the world to the growth of plants and trees. Ezekiel speaks for the Lord, who will take a shoot from a cedar and plant it *on the mountain heights of Israel*, where it will *bear fruit*.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:6-10

In this Second Reading, Paul writes that we walk by faith, not by sight. He writes to the Corinthian community about the future destiny of the believer in a section of his letter that focuses on the trials and tribulations of the ministry of evangelization. He says that suffering is to be welcomed because it joins us with the suffering Christ, but he also welcomes death, because he would then be able to join Christ in the resurrection. But Paul reminds the Corinthian church that what matters at that moment is preaching "Jesus Christ as Lord." This is the context for Paul's exhortation to courage in today's reading. He reminds his audience that we always "walk by faith, not by sight" and that our desire should always be to please Christ as we await our judgment and reward.

Gospel: Mark 4:26-34

In the Gospel, Jesus describes the kingdom of God using parables of a wheat field and a mustard seed. Jesus speaks his Word to the crowds in parables because that is how *they were able to understand it*. Today, he uses agrarian images. Although farming is dependent on many variables the farmer has no control over, the seed of faith planted on our hearts is totally in our control. Will we take the time to weed? Will we take the time to water?

P.S. GOOD TO KNOW UPDATES REGARDING TAX LAW AND CHARITABLE GIVING FOR 2021:

Charitable Contributions for Non-Itemizers – The Taxpayer Certainty and Disaster Tax Relief Act allows those who don't itemize their deductions a deduction of up to \$300 for cash contributions made during 2021. Married couples filing jointly are allowed a deduction of up to \$600 for the cash contributions they make during 2021. This is an increase from 2020, when the contribution was limited to \$300 regardless of filing status.

Cash Contributions for Itemizers – Under the CARES Act that was enacted in March 2020, the 60% deduction limit on cash contributions to most charities was suspended for 2020, thus allowing larger cash contributions during the COVID crisis—potentially up to 100% of the AGI. Under the Taxpayer Certainty and Disaster Tax Relief Act of 2020, the suspension of the 60% limit has been extended to 2021.



BEATING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

*Please refer to the latest directives provided by the Diocese Office of Worship.

*The government has announced that we are now in Tier 3 of the covid restrictions but as we resume our public celebrations of the Holy Mass on days and weekends, we continue to observe 6-ft safe distancing, hand-washing and hygiene practices, wear face covering, and avoid large gatherings outside the church.



*When you come for Holy Communion, receive the Body of Christ only with your hand and take off your mask only when you actually consume it.

*Dispensation for not attending mass in churches due to high risk or fear of infecting or contracting coronavirus has been lifted up by Bishop Larry Silva starting April 3, 2021. However, those who feel not really able yet to come for reason of sickness are not forced to come. Nevertheless, they are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed mass to fulfill their Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide the live-streamed Mass every Sunday at the 9:00am Mass. There are prayers available that we can use individually or as a family. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put an end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. \bullet BEATIFICATION AND CANONIZATION OF THE SERVANT OF GOD JOSEPH DUTTON, LAYMAN \bullet $\rm EDICT$

<TO THE FAITHFUL OF THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU>

At the request of the *"Joseph Dutton Guild," Dr. Waldery Hilgeman*, Diocesan Postulator, has presented me with the Written Request, required by Canon Law, to initiate the Cause for the Beatification and Canonization of the *Servant of God Joseph Dutton*.

The Servant of God Joseph Dutton was born in Stowe, Vermont on April 27, 1843, and was raised in Wisconsin. He was a soldier in the United States Civil War, serving in the Union Army. After the War, he entered a difficult marriage, which lasted only about a year, and he took to

drinking heavily. At the age of 40, he had a conversion experience and became a Catholic. He wanted to do penance for what he considered a wayward life, so he entered a monastery, only to discern that this was not his vocation. He heard about *Father Damien De Veuster* and *Sister Marianne Cope* and their heroic work with the patients with leprosy in Molokai. He volunteered to go there to help them, arriving on July 29, 1886. He humbly and faithfully served the patients of the settlement for 44 years, primarily caring for the young boys who lived at the Baldwin Home. He became ill and was transferred to St. Francis Hospital in Honolulu, where he died on March 26, 1931. [For more biographical information go to https://josephdutton.org.]



FREE GRAB 'N GO SUMMER MEALS FOR ALL SCHOOL KIDS STATEWIDE!


