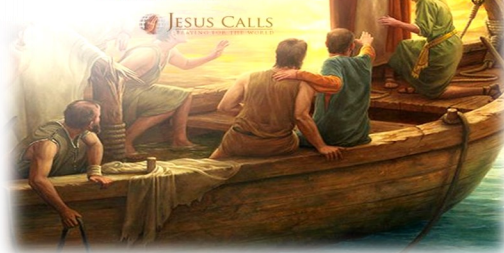

STEWARDSHIP: *The Path of Discipleship*

*By the Most Reverend Thomas Wenski, Archbishop of Miami, excerpted from his 2019 pastoral letter "Stewardship and the Theology of the Gift."

I wish to share with you some reflections on stewardship. A proper understanding of our role as "stewards of God's varied grace" can help us truly be "missionary disciples." Made in His own image and likeness, God made us for Himself and in his plan; he has made us stewards of his creation that we might respond to his love in kind so that, cooperating with him, we use our gifts for his greater honor and glory.

Stewardship — placing our time, talent and treasure at his disposal — is then the path of discipleship by which we grow in our friendship with God, and with one another, becoming in Christ, through the gift of the Holy Spirit, the persons that God meant for us to be. Of course, in inviting us to "come, follow him," Jesus calls us to walk the "narrow path." As we make our life's pilgrimage through this "vale of tears," this path will take us by the Way of the Cross, the way of Jesus who sacrificed himself for us and for our salvation. In fact, the Bishops at the Second Vatican Council insisted that as human beings we can only fully realize ourselves through the sincere gift of ourselves in imitation of Christ.

Seen in this way, stewardship is not just a "program" to increase the Sunday offertory. It is really something much more demanding. More than a "fundraising" gimmick, stewardship rightly understood is a way of life. So, it is something much more difficult than just writing a check. Becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ, given our fallen human nature, goes against the grain of our propensity for self-seeking, self-assertion and self-realization. (Isn't the multiplication of warehouses that rent space for "self-storage" a sad commentary on our culture of acquisitiveness?) But a good steward accepts joyfully the risks of discipleship. To be a friend of Jesus calls us to "come out of ourselves." However, this is not a burden imposed upon us. To be a Christian is far from being a burden, it is a gift — and, to follow Christ, offering him in return our own gifts of time, talent and treasure, brings us joy, a joy that gives meaning and direction to our lives.

❖BEATIFICATION AND CANONIZATION OF THE SERVANT OF GOD JOSEPH DUTTON, LAYMAN❖
EDICT

<TO THE FAITHFUL OF THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU>

At the request of the “*Joseph Dutton Guild*,” *Dr. Waldery Hilgeman*, Diocesan Postulator, has presented me with the Written Request, required by Canon Law, to initiate the Cause for the Beatification and Canonization of the *Servant of God Joseph Dutton*.

The *Servant of God Joseph Dutton* was born in Stowe, Vermont on April 27, 1843, and was raised in Wisconsin. He was a soldier in the United States Civil War, serving in the Union Army. After the War, he entered a difficult marriage, which lasted only about a year, and he took to drinking heavily. At the age of 40, he had a conversion experience and became a Catholic. He wanted to do penance for what he considered a wayward life, so he entered a monastery, only to discern that this was not his vocation. He heard about *Father Damien De Veuster* and *Sister Marianne Cope* and their heroic work with the patients with leprosy in Molokai. He volunteered to go there to help them, arriving on July 29, 1886. He humbly and faithfully served the patients of the settlement for 44 years, primarily caring for the young boys who lived at the Baldwin Home. He became ill and was transferred to St. Francis Hospital in Honolulu, where he died on March 26, 1931.

P.S. GOOD TO KNOW UPDATES REGARDING TAX LAW AND CHARITABLE GIVING FOR 2021:

Charitable Contributions for Non-Itemizers – The Taxpayer Certainty and Disaster Tax Relief Act allows those who don’t itemize their deductions a deduction of up to \$300 for cash contributions made during 2021. Married couples filing jointly are allowed a deduction of up to \$600 for the cash contributions they make during 2021. This is an increase from 2020, when the contribution was limited to \$300 regardless of filing status.

Cash Contributions for Itemizers – Under the CARES Act that was enacted in March 2020, the 60% deduction limit on cash contributions to most charities was suspended for 2020, thus allowing larger cash contributions during the COVID crisis—potentially up to 100% of the AGI. Under the Taxpayer Certainty and Disaster Tax Relief Act of 2020, the suspension of the 60% limit has been extended to 2021.

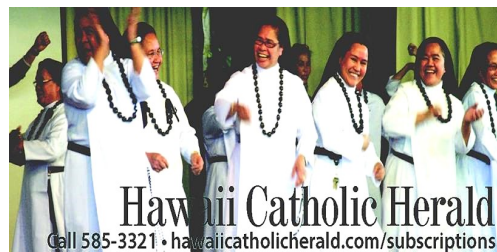

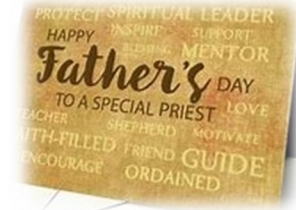
T-SHIRT ANNOUNCEMENT

The items for power-point projection at Mass include the readings and responses together with sacred graphics. For added health protection, *Andy Llamedo* installed a plexiglass barrier at the lectern.

The TV base and support were assembled by *Jun Cortez* & supervised by his faithful co-worker and wife, *Caridad*. Recently, the parish purchased 2 chrome books to make the livestreaming and power-point presentation at the hall even better.

The choir loft is also prepared for additional accommodation. In both areas in the choir loft and parish hall, the faithful can attend the Mass and the Eucharistic ministers can go to give Holy Communion to them.

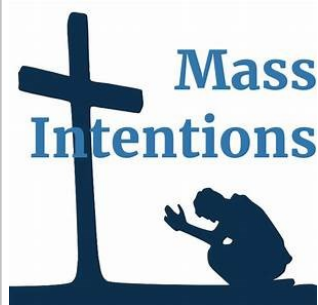
