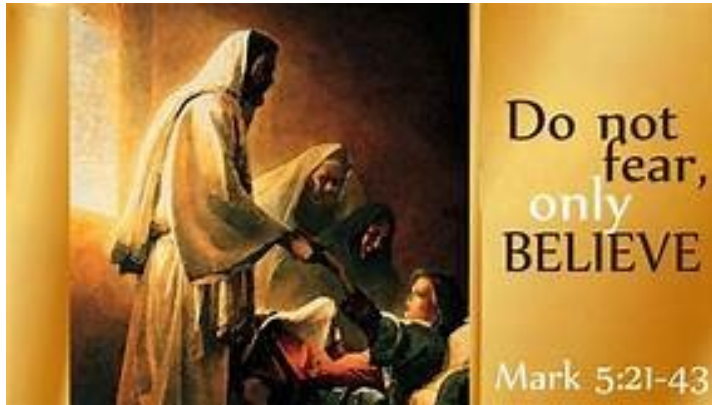

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Ezekiel 2:2-5

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 123:1-4

Second Reading
2 Corinthians 12:7-10

Gospel
Mark 6:1-6

First Reading: *Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24*

This Reading asserts that God created all things wholesome and good and that humans are made in the image of God, imperishable. Sin, suffering, and death, are the consequence of human choice.

Second Reading: *2 Corinthians 8:7, 9-13-15*

In this Reading, Paul is appealing to the community to support his collection for the Christian church in Jerusalem, which was undergoing severe persecution. He appeals to their self-importance, praises them for the many gifts they have received and his love for them to convince them to excel in their giving. He appeals to the example of Jesus Christ, because he wants the community not only to give but to give willingly. He continues that he is not asking much of them. He is only asking for equity for those who have little.

Gospel: *Mark 5:21-43*

This Gospel tells of Jesus healing two daughters of Israel. Jairus sought out Jesus to assist his sick daughter. Jesus' path to the Jairus' house was interrupted by a crowd. In the crowd, a bold, unnamed woman, approached Jesus secretly in spite of her impure condition (continuous bleeding) that she had suffered for twelve years. The woman touched only his clothes and was immediately healed. The bleeding stopped. She fell before Jesus and told him the whole truth of her condition. He told her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you!"

The narrative returns to the journey to Jairus' house. The delay — to "heal" and "converse" with the unnamed woman — led to a report from Jairus' household that his daughter had already died. Jesus was too late. Jesus challenged Jairus to hold on to his faith, to "only believe" to a faith that led him to the healer in the first place. Unlike other healing accounts, Jesus speaks Aramaic here: *talitha koum*, which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl of twelve arose immediately and walked around. The message of these interrelated stories is that despite one's fear, faith, (trust in Jesus) can save you and make you whole.

<TO THE FAITHFUL OF THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU>

At the request of the "*Joseph Dutton Guild*," *Dr. Waldery Hilgeman*, Diocesan Postulator, has presented me with the Written Request, required by Canon Law, to initiate the Cause for the Beatification and Canonization of the *Servant of God Joseph Dutton*.

The *Servant of God Joseph Dutton* was born in Stowe, Vermont on April 27, 1843, and was raised in Wisconsin. He was a soldier in the United States Civil War, serving in the Union Army. After the War, he entered a difficult marriage, which lasted only about a year, and he took to drinking heavily. At the age of 40, he had a conversion experience and became a Catholic. He wanted to do penance for what he considered a wayward life, so he entered a monastery, only to discern that this was not his vocation. He heard about *Father Damien De Veuster* and *Sister Marianne Cope* and their heroic work with the patients with leprosy in Molokai. He volunteered to go there to help them, arriving on July 29, 1886. He humbly and faithfully served the patients of the settlement for 44 years, primarily caring for the young boys who lived at the Baldwin Home. He became ill and was transferred to St. Francis Hospital in Honolulu, where he died on March 26, 1931.

P.S. GOOD TO KNOW UPDATES REGARDING TAX LAW AND CHARITABLE GIVING FOR 2021:

Charitable Contributions for Non-Itemizers – The Taxpayer Certainty and Disaster Tax Relief Act allows those who don't itemize their deductions a deduction of up to \$300 for cash contributions made during 2021. Married couples filing jointly are allowed a deduction of up to \$600 for the cash contributions they make during 2021. This is an increase from 2020, when the contribution was limited to \$300 regardless of filing status.

Cash Contributions for Itemizers – Under the CARES Act that was enacted in March 2020, the 60% deduction limit on cash contributions to most charities was suspended for 2020, thus allowing larger cash contributions during the COVID crisis—potentially up to 100% of the AGI. Under the Taxpayer Certainty and Disaster Tax Relief Act of 2020, the suspension of the 60% limit has been extended to 2021.



BEATING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

*Please refer to the latest directives provided by the Diocese Office of Worship.

*The government has announced that we are now in Tier 3 of the covid restrictions but as we resume our public celebrations of the Holy Mass on days and weekends, we continue to observe 6-ft safe distancing, hand-washing and hygiene practices, wear face covering, and avoid large gatherings outside the church.

*When you come for Holy Communion, receive the Body of Christ only with your hand and take off your mask only when you actually consume it.

*Dispensation for not attending mass in churches due to high risk or fear of infecting or contracting coronavirus has been lifted up by Bishop Larry Silva starting [April 3, 2021](#). However, those who feel not really able yet to come for reason of sickness are not forced to come. Nevertheless, they are highly encouraged to join the tele-vised or livestreamed mass to fulfill their Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide the live-streamed Mass every Sunday at the 9:00am Mass. There are prayers available that we can use individually or as a family. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put an end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. Let us stay safe, healthy and blessed and continue to pray for one another and for the whole world.

infection, but never let anyone be left without the care and concern of others in the community.

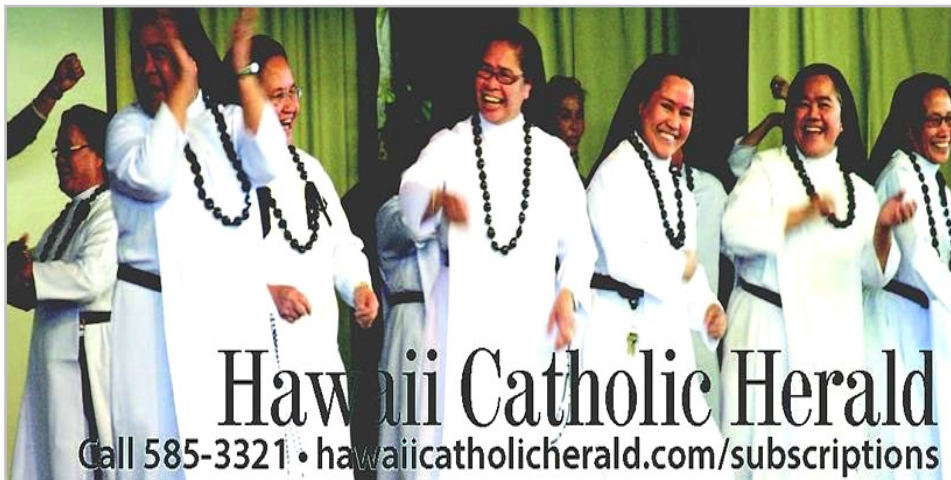
As our Diocese of Honolulu has been dedicated to the Divine Mercy, we pray with confidence,

This week's message is a plea for more units to respond to our on-line issues survey, which is intended to help steer the organization in 2022.

MESSAGE

Throughout its 25-year history, Faith Action has sought to identify its key issues via face-to-face discussions within each unit. This past year, Covid-19 made such personal meetings impossible. So, we turned to an on-line survey as the best possible alternative to define our 2022 issues. To date, though, only 8 of our 25 units have taken advantage of this option. Please read this message from Faith Action's Executive Director, Ashleigh Loa. (And yes, even for the 8 units who have responded, additional input is still welcome.)

Aloha Faith Action members!

We recently sent out a Faith Action Organizing 2021 survey to gather input from our member units. Of Faith Action's 25 member units, only eight (8) units were represented in the survey - Trinity UMC, St. John Vianney Parish, Keolumana UMC, Christ Church Uniting, Harris UMC, Church of the Crossroads, First Unitarian, and Central Union Church - and several community members. Mahalo to those who took time to participate!

To ensure that Faith Action's work is representative of our entire membership, we will extend the deadline to allow time for more responses until we achieve ~75% response rate from member units. This means we need 18-19 units to respond. Please urge your Steering Committee representatives to complete the survey as soon as possible. Steering Committee representatives may also ask an additional 3-5+ congregation members to participate.

Again, *mahalo* plenty to those who kindly submitted their responses! We look forward to hearing from you!

**FREE GRAB 'N GO SUMMER MEALS FOR ALL SCHOOL KIDS STATEWIDE!**

The [Hawaii State Department of Education \(DOE\)](#) has announced it will be continuing its **Grab-and-Go meal service** to all children ages 18 and younger regardless of their enrollment status. Lunch distribution will begin on June 4, 2021 thru July 19, 2021. Pick-ups will include one lunch for that day and one breakfast for the following day.

Parents will be allowed to pick-up lunch for their children if they provide verification such as their child's Student ID, a report card, birth certificate, etc.

The items for power-point projection at Mass include the readings and responses together with sacred graphics. For added health protection, *Andy Llamedo* installed a plexiglass barrier at the lectern.

The TV base and support were assembled by *Jun Cortez* & supervised by his faithful co-worker and wife, *Caridad*. The choir loft is also prepared for additional accommodation. In both areas in the choir loft and parish hall, the faithful can attend the Mass and the Eucharistic ministers can go to give Holy Communion to them.

**Clemente Fontanilla* mows the grasses.

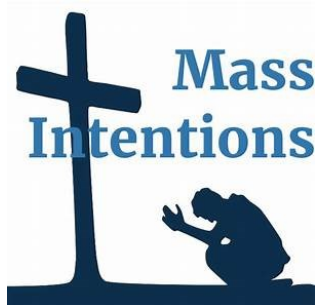
