

We Celebrate As The Body Of Christ

WE REMEMBER * WE CELEBRATE * WE BELIEVE

On the weekend of June 5 and 6, Catholics in the United States celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We used to call it the Feast of Corpus Christi ("Body of Christ"), a feast that celebrates Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. The feast originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. In much of the world, it is celebrated on the Thursday following the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. In the United States it is celebrated on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday.

There are two major themes to this feast: the Body of Christ that is the Holy Eucharist and the Body of Christ that is our communion of faith, the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with us, his disciples. It is expressed in the New Testament by using the metaphor of a body in which Christ Jesus is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the rich diversity of our family of faith. When we gather for the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we become one with Christ, transformed by his loving gift. We become one with Christ in the person we may not know sitting next to us in the pew; in the crowds walking in Eucharistic processions in the Philippines; in the victims of parish bombings while at Mass in Nigeria; in the young Polish students getting ready for World Youth Day; and in the Peruvian children receiving Holy Communion for the first time, singing "Somos el Cuerpo de Cristo" "We Are the Body of Christ."

The feast encourages us to embrace the Eucharistic reality that although we may be strangers sharing the one Lord's table wherever we are, we are one, just as the many grains of wheat make up one loaf of bread, and the many grapes make up the shared wine in the Lord's cup of blessing. There should be a genuine connection between what we do in the Eucharistic celebration and the attitudes we embrace and the actions we take in our public and private lives. In the Eucharist, Christ has given us a share of God's mercy and hospitality. Let us pray that God will show us the way to unity through our devotion to Christ in the Eucharist so that we can offer a more genuinely compelling and fruitful witness to a world in need of God's love and compassion.

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Ezekiel 17:22-24

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 92:2-3, 13-16

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 5:6-10

Gospel Mark 4:26-34

First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8

In this Reading, Moses is invited to come up the mountain close to God and to ratify the covenant in a blood ritual. Moses writes down the words God had given to him and builds an altar for the sacrifice. Part of the blood to be sacrificed is sprinkled on the altar, which symbolizes God. Moses reads from the book of the covenant, and the people formally assent to it. Later, the rest of the blood is sprinkled on the people as Moses says, "This is the blood of the covenant which the Lord has made with you according to all these words." Sharing blood symbolizes the unity of God and the people; they are joined as one family by blood.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-15

This Reading contrasts the Blood of Christ with the blood of sacrifice for atonement in Leviticus 16. Aaron was forbidden to enter the Holy Place until he had sacrificed a bull to atone for his sins and a large goat to atone for the sins of the people. Jesus comes before God by way of his own blood. The blood of the old covenant, says the Letter to the Hebrews, sanctified the body; the blood of the new covenant sanctifies the mind and heart forever.

Gospel: *Mark* 14:12-16, 22-26

The Gospel tells of Jesus' last supper with his disciples as they celebrated the Passover meal, the great feast of liberation from slavery. At this Passover meal, meant to be a reminder of God's graciousness and protection of the Israelites as they were about to be released from captivity in Egypt, Jesus is surrounded by a broken "family," one that will suffer greatly when their shepherd is struck down. Knowing this, Jesus breaks bread as any other host of a Passover meal might have been doing in homes and guest rooms across Jerusalem, but he adds a new level of meaning to the feast by saying, "Take it; this is my body." Likewise, with the Passover cup of wine, he passed it to the disciples and adds, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." The celebration of the Passover is expanded and extended in hospitality to everyone in God's "broken" family. Moreover, it is not a Passover that ends in death but in newness of life in God's coming kingdom. This is what we celebrate when we gather for Eucharist, it is cause for great joy!

BEATIFICATION AND CANONIZATION OF THE SERVANT OF GOD JOSEPH DUTTON, LAYMAN

EDICT

TO THE FAITHFUL OF THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU

At the request of the "Joseph Dutton Guild," Dr. Waldery Hilgeman, Diocesan Postulator, has presented me with the Written Request, required by Canon Law, to initiate the Cause for the Beatification and Canonization of the Servant of God Joseph Dutton.

The Servant of God Joseph Dutton was born in Stowe, Vermont on April 27, 1843, and was raised in Wisconsin. He was a soldier in the United States Civil War, serving in the Union Army. After the War, he entered a difficult marriage, which lasted only about a year, and he took to drinking heavily. At the age of 40, he had a conversion experience and became a Catholic. He wanted to do penance for what he considered a wayward life, so he entered a monastery, only to discern that this was not his vocation. He heard about Father Damien De Veuster and Sister Marianne Cope and their heroic work with the patients with leprosy in Molokai. He volunteered to go there to help them, arriving on July 29, 1886. He humbly and faithfully served the patients of the settlement for 44 years, primarily caring for the young boys who lived at the Baldwin Home. He became ill and was transferred to St. Francis Hospital in Honolulu, where he died on March 26, 1931.

P.S. GOOD TO KNOW UPDATES REGARDING TAX LAW AND CHARITABLE GIVING FOR 2021:


Charitable Contributions for Non-Itemizers – The Taxpayer Certainty and Disaster Tax Relief Act allows those who don't itemize their deductions a deduction of up to \$300 for cash contributions made during 2021. Married couples filing jointly are allowed a deduction of up to \$600 for the cash contributions they make during 2021. This is an increase from 2020, when the contribution was limited to \$300 regardless of filing status.

Cash Contributions for Itemizers – Under the CARES Act that was enacted in March 2020, the 60% deduction limit on cash contributions to most charities was suspended for 2020, thus allowing larger cash contributions during the COVID crisis—potentially up to 100% of the AGI. Under the Taxpayer Certainty and Disaster Tax Relief Act of 2020, the suspension of the 60% limit has been extended to 2021.

BRIEF RECAP Steering Committee Meeting on May 22, 2021

Representatives from nine different member units were present at the first Faith Action Steering Committee meeting of 2021 held on May 22nd. As part of an opening prayer, attendees shared in the Zoom Chat their visions and dreams for an equitable community and just world: solidarity, love, compassion, empathy, everyone having the same facts, following the Golden Rule, sacrificing privilege, to name a few. SOME HIGHLIGHTS

*Board members shared about trainings for members and a fellowship opportunity for young/early-career clergy in the works, upcoming fundraising trainings in June to prepare for 2021 Faith Action investment drives, and the updating of our by-laws.

*Summer Pulpit Supply: Faith Action Organizer and recent Master of Divinity graduate Cassie Chee will be available to preach at member units' services this summer to strengthen the connection between our faith and the values we act on.

*2021 Legislative Recap: Nicole Woo (member of Harris United Methodist Church and also a policy analyst for Hawaii Appleseed Center for Law and Economic Justice) shared updates about the recent legislative session which reminds us that there is still much work to be done.

*Hawai'i became the first state to declare a climate emergency (supported by the Environmental Justice Task Force)

*A "halfway" step to taxing REITs (supported by the HousingNOW! task force passed in a bill that requires REITs to report their income and assets.

*For the Environmental Justice Task Force it was announced that Susan Gorman-Chang (Trinity United Methodist Church) will be the new chair.

*New feature being added to the website: MEMBERS CORNER (tab on the menu of faithactionhawaii.org) will give members access to organizational documents, annual meetings, membership, and resources.

*The Steering Committee voted to: • Welcome Chuukese Ministry Church to officially join the Faith Action 'ohana! Pastor Eha was present to say hello and share about their church.

*Approve the creation of a Transformative Justice Task Force which will begin by defining together what transformative justice looks like in our context.

MOST RECENT COVID GUIDELINES IN THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU

*This message was sent with High importance. With the Easter Season ending after Pentecost Sunday, Bishop Larry extends the following guidelines into Ordinary Time, until further notice:

- *Masks must be worn by all who attend Mass or other liturgical services.
- *Social distancing and no-touch greetings and Sign of Peace remain the norms.
- *Holy Communion is to be given only under the species of Bread.
- *The use of a small choir is permitted. If the parish is using a choir, choir members need to continue following the rules for indoor singing as directed by the State ["Any person(s) singing shall maintain physical distancing of at least ten (10) feet from any other person(s) while singing. Members of the same performing group singing may be closer than ten (10) feet together while performing, provided the group consists of less than ten (10) persons. To the extent reasonable and practicable, a physical barrier (e.g., plexiglass) of sufficient size to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 shall separate any person(s) singing from any other person(s), but not including members of the same performing group."
- *A distance of 10 feet between the cantor and the congregation needs to be observed as much as possible.
- *In addition to the Entrance, Offertory, Communion and Leave-taking hymns the Kyrie, Gloria, Responsorial Psalm, Gospel Acclamation, and the rest of the Mass part responses could be sung, observing the proper precautions.
- *Sanitization is to continue between Masses.
- *Social gatherings after Mass should not take place.
- *We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website.

BEATING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

*Please refer to the latest directives provided by the Diocese Office of Worship.

*The government has announced that we are now in Tier 3 of the covid restrictions but as we resume our public celebrations of the Holy Mass on days and weekends, we continue to observe 6-ft safe distancing, handwashing and hygiene practices, wear face covering, and avoid large gatherings of more than 10 outside the church.

*When you come for Holy Communion, receive the Body of Christ only with your hand and take off your mask only when you actually consume it.

*Dispensation for not attending mass in churches due to high risk or fear of infecting or contracting coronavirus has been lifted up by Bishop Larry Silva starting April 3, 2021. However, those who feel not really able yet to come for reason of sickness are not forced to come. Nevertheless, they are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed mass to fulfill their Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide the live-streamed Mass every Sunday at the 9:00am Mass. There are prayers available that we can use individually or as a family. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put an end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. Let us stay safe, healthy and blessed and continue to pray for one another and for the whole world.
