

BLESSED PENTECOST SUNDAY!

Pentecost: Hearts on Fire for Jesus

In the weekend of May 22 and 23, we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples to bring fire and flame to their hearts' commitment to Jesus. The Holy Spirit continues to place our hearts on fire to know Jesus. But do we realize it? In this time of continued uncertainty, do we sense the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in our lives? Do we allow the Lord to inspire us to burn with a desire for greater intimacy? Next Sunday's Reading The Most Holy Trinity

First Reading Responsorial Psalm
Deuteronomy 4:32-34; 39-40 Psalm 33:4-6, 9, 18-20, 22

Second Reading Gospel

Romans 8:14-17 Matthew 28:16-20

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

This Reading tells that on the day of Pentecost all the believers were meeting together in one place. Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty windstorm, and it filled the house where they were sitting. Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

In this Reading, Paul tries to correct the people's fascination with speaking in tongues by saying that it is all about the Holy Spirit. The people cannot speak even the most basic statement of belief in Jesus except by the Holy Spirit. He likens the community of believers to a human body. He says that just as a body has many parts and these parts cannot exist except as one body the community is the one body of Christ.

Gospel: John 20:19-23

The Gospel tells the story of the risen Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the night of the Resurrection. The disciples had hidden themselves away in a locked room. But locked doors could not deter the risen Jesus. Jesus shows his wounded body to the disciples, demonstrating that he is alive, and offers them a greeting of peace. He announces that he is sending his disciples in the same way that the Father sent him. And now he breathes on them and sends the Holy Spirit upon them, just as he promised. With a little imagination, we might relate the action of "breathing" on them to the action of the second creation story in Genesis; God breathed into a lump of clay and gave Adam a life-giving spirit. Moreover, the Spirit will expose the world concerning sin, righteousness and judgment. Thus the disciples' ability to forgive and retain sins is closely tied to the promised activity of the Holy Spirit.

MOST RECENT COVID GUIDELINES IN THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU

*This message was sent with High importance. With the Easter Season ending after Pentecost Sunday, Bishop Larry extends the following guidelines into Ordinary Time, until further notice:

*Masks must be worn by all who attend Mass or other liturgical services.

*Social distancing and no-touch greetings and Sign of Peace remain the norms.

*Holy Communion is to be given only under the species of Bread.

*The use of a small choir is permitted. If the parish is using a choir, choir members need to continue following the rules for indoor singing as directed by the State ["Any person(s) singing shall maintain physical distancing of at least ten (10) feet from any other person(s) while singing. Members of the same performing group singing may be closer than ten (10) feet together while performing, provided the group consists of less than ten (10) persons. To the extent reasonable and practicable, a physical barrier (e.g., plexiglass) of sufficient size to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 shall separate any person(s) singing from any other person(s), but not including members of the same performing group."

*A distance of 10 feet between the cantor and the congregation needs to be observed as much as possible.

*In addition to the Entrance, Offertory, Communion and Leave-taking hymns – the Kyrie, Gloria, Responsorial Psalm, Gospel Acclamation, and the rest of the Mass part responses could be sung, observing the proper precautions.

*Sanitization is to continue between Masses.

*Social gatherings after Mass should not take place.

*We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website.

BEATING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

*Please refer to the latest directives provided by the Diocese Office of Worship.

*The government has announced that we are now in Tier 3 of the covid restrictions but as we resume our public celebrations of the Holy Mass on days and weekends, we continue to observe 6-ft safe distancing, handwashing and hygiene practices, wear face covering, and avoid large gatherings of more than 10 outside the church.

*When you come for Holy Communion, receive the Body of Christ only with your hand and take off your mask only when you actually consume it.

*Dispensation for not attending mass in churches due to high risk or fear of infecting or contracting coronavirus has been lifted up by Bishop Larry Silva starting April 3, 2021. However, those who feel not really able yet to come for reason of sickness are not forced to come. Nevertheless, they are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed mass to fulfill their Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide the live-streamed Mass every Sunday at the 9:00am Mass. There are prayers available that we can use individually or as a family. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put an end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. Let us stay safe, healthy and blessed and continue to pray for one another and for the whole world.

❖REPAIR & MAINTENANCE

***CHURCH REPAIRS – The successive days of rain caused leaks on the walls behind the sanctuary creating cracks and moldy floors. *Roger Isidro* and *Rudy Fiesta* came to the rescue doing some patching on the concrete wall inside and outside. They also included to re-strengthen the beams for the bells at the belfry.

***HOME REPAIRS – Roger Isidro did some odd jobs of fixing the door latch, hinges and lock at the doorway, cabinets and storage room in the parish hall.

***CEMETERY MAINTENANCE – The Catholic cemetery caretaker, *Kalolo Tuihalafatai*, reported the completion of the cutting and hauling away of the storm-felled eucalyptus tree on the cemetery ground. With the approval of the Parish Facilities & Maintenance Committee *Puli Construction* was awarded the contract and did a great job of clearing the area of other rotting trees, stumps and debris. The contract price for labor, materials and equipment was \$5,200.00.

❖CHURCH ENVIRONMENT – Volunteer parishioners come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the weekend Masses. They spruce up the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other cleaning tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. During the time of the covid-19 pandemic, in compliance with the Diocese and government advisory they marked the seating in the pews and communion line for 6-ft distancing as well as place sanitizers for use by the mass-goers and disinfect the church. Included in this dedicated group are Marivic Palting, Nelie Puzon, Bella Miranda, Ador Padilla, Doi Facuri, Gloria Rodrigues, Fran Kovaloff, Norma Daligcon, Aida Isidro, Medy Macalma, Olivia Mita, Marichu Pe Benito, Angie Sera and Corazon Orcino.

MAHALO to *Myra dela Cruz* who supplies our church with fresh flowers that bedeck the sanctuary. BIG THANKS also to *Tom & Olivia Mita* for donating infra-red thermometers for use in covid-tracing and Easter lilies for the sanctuary decors. Likewise, to *Luida Susa* for donating \$500.00 for sanitizers and other needed paraphernalia for disinfection.

LITURGY - The livestreaming of OLM Sunday Mass at 9:00am for the sake of those sheltered-in during the covid-19 crisis will continue on via the OLM Facebook account and thru the kind services of the *Llamedo family*. The items for power-point projection at Mass include the readings and responses together with sacred graphics. For added health protection, *Andy Llamedo* installed a flexi-glass barrier at the lectern.

A new microphone on the lectern has been installed by *Jun Cortez*. His son, *Gene Cortez*, paid for the Shure Microflex microphone in the amount of \$236.17 as his stewardship offering to the Church. Much mahalo to *Gene! Jun* and wife, *Caridad*, installed wires for wi-fi connection and clearer live-streaming from the rectory to the church.

There is a wi-fi hook-up to the parish hall on the Sunday Eucharistic celebration in case of an overflow in the church. This is made possible thru the high-tech know-how of *Jun Cortez* and *Fidel Flores* who also donated and put up wi-fi boosters in the church and hall for wider coverage and for security camera operation. Designated to operate the power-point projection during the Masses are — *Malia Balbuena* at the 6:00pm Saturday Vigil Mass, *Jun Cortez* at the 6:30am Sunday Mass while *Marc & Clem Ulep* and their kids, *David & Gerald*, take care of the 9:00am Mass.

For the power-point slides and peoples' viewing delight in the hall, a new Hisense LED LCD 50" TV unit was recently donated as Christmas gift by *Silverio Palting*. The TV base and support were assembled by *Jun Cortez* & supervised by his faithful co-worker and wife, *Caridad*. Recently, the parish purchased 2 chrome books to make the livestreaming and power-point presentation at the hall even better.

The choir loft is also prepared for additional accommodation. In both areas in the choir loft and parish hall, the faithful can attend the Mass and the Eucharistic ministers can go to give Holy Communion to them.



Mastoral Leadership

*This is the first in a series of articles by *Dr. Dan R. Ebener* on leading stewardship and evangelization in the Catholic Church. They are based on his book, *Pastoral Leadership: How to Lead in a Catholic Parish*, published by Paulist Press and the Villanova University Center for Church Management. Dr. Ebener teaches at St. Ambrose University in Davenport, Iowa.

The purpose of every Catholic parish is to form disciples of Jesus. To fulfill that mission, we need change. We need more joyful evangelization, more generous stewardship, more gracious hospitality, more genuine faith formation, more conscious participation in the liturgy, more courageous social action, and more loving outreach. In most places, the Church is over-managed and under-led. To turn this around, we need clergy who are free to lead more and manage less. We need lay people to step up to manage more of the day-to-day operations so the clergy can be clergy and fulfill their pastoral ministries.

When the clergy step back, the lay people are more likely to step up. Pastors can be pastors. Deacons can be volunteers during the summer.

Parish outreach ministries have suffered this past year and need financial contributions to continue during the summer weeks. Christian stewards are well aware of summer needs, as well as being aware of their own need to give throughout the year. For Christian stewards, the spirituality of gratitude to God is part of their everyday lives and motivates their generosity. Let's not forget our parishes when we make our summer plans. Let's make sure to increase our gifts to make up for the past year. Also, many diocesan appeals take place in the spring and summer. Giving to the diocesan annual appeal is an excellent way to support the ministries of the local church that no single parish could undertake by itself. This summer may offer a chance to renew our quest for fun and relaxation in a way that the pandemic, the economy and closures would not allow last summer.

Let us be mindful of our parishes, diocesan ministries and other charities that are in need of our support. A plan to continue our generous habits this summer can serve as a great blessing to those in need and serve as an authentic witness to the renewal of our Baptismal promises at Easter. The clergy can focus on ministry and not so much on administration. They can be more pastoral and less managerial. It's time for lay people to take more responsibility for the business side of parish life. We also need lay people to lead. The beautiful thing about servant leadership – which is "leading like Jesus" – is that we can practice it with or without authority. Leading with authority is a challenge because of the temptation to rely excessively on the use of one's perceived authority. Leading without authority is a challenge because it relies on those in authority to provide the opportunity, support and feedback that makes leadership happen. The purpose of this series is to improve the way we lead and manage so that we can become better disciples who draw closer to Jesus Christ. If the Church is to address its challenges, it will need more authentic leadership coming from multiple directions. We are all called to lead in the Church at some point and in some manner. The question is whether we can hear and heed that call.


