

## \*HOLY ROSARY & FLORAL OFFERING TO MARY\*

## FLORES DE MAYO

May is marked by Catholics as the month of Mary. On every Sunday of May, the *Filipino Catholic Club* (FCC) headed by the President *Fe Go* has been spearheading the communal praying of the holy rosary and floral offering to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary. This has been a cherished traditional religious devotion that expresses the peoples' love and affection for the Blessed Virgin Mary who is our heavenly Mother and intercessor. The *Flores de Mayo* consists mainly of praying the holy rosary and offering of flowers. It eventually got associated with *Santacruzan* which commemorates the finding of the true cross of the Lord Jesus by the Christian *Queen Helena*, the mother of the *Roman Emperor Constantine*. It is a festive celebration which includes the re-enactment of the finding of the Cross with royal figures and processions.

This Sunday is the culmination of the *Flores de Mayo* and due to the covid restrictions there are yet no processions or festive fellowships. There will be the usual recitation of

the holy rosary and the offering of flowers by the people capped by the crowning of Mary's image by the previous FCC Charity Queen, *Olivia Mita*. The ceremonial rites start at 8:15 AM before the 9:00 AM Mass. Everyone is welcomed to join and receive the Blessed Mother's blessings.



# Pastor's Corner

## 1 Call Day

Next Sunday's Reading
The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

First Reading Exodus 24:3-8

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 116-12-13, 15-18

Second Reading Hebrews 9:11-15 **Gospel** *Mark* 14:12-16, 22-26

#### First Reading: Deuteronomy 4:32-34; 39-40

The feast of the Most Holy Trinity was not included in the liturgical calendar until the fourteenth century when it is designated for the Sunday after Pentecost. Therefore, we should not find a fully formed doctrine of the Trinity in the Bible. Yet, we find allusions to the Trinitarian God, even in the Old Testament. Like in this Reading, Moses speaks to the Israelites before their entry into the Promised Land. He reminds them of God's amazing deeds on behalf of humanity from the time of creation and of God's special care of God's chosen ones, demonstrated in presence and power. The mention of creation and the image of fire allude to the Holy Spirit. The breathing into Adam to make the human a living being is an image associated with God's presence. It also reminds us of the Christian Pentecost story, when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples in tongues of fire.

#### Second Reading: Romans 8:14-17

This Reading is part of a long section of the Letter to the Romans. Here he writes that, through the Holy Spirit, the Christian believer has received a spirit of adoption that makes them children of God and that allows them to cry, "Abba, Father." Abba is an affectionate form of "father."

#### Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

This Gospel Reading is known as the "Great Commission," which is often used as a biblical warrant for missionary activity. This is the only account of the risen Christ's commissioning of the eleven to go out and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them and teaching all that Jesus had taught them. It bears the authority of the risen Christ, which was conferred on him by God. Jesus assures that he will be with them always. We go to the beginning where God's angel tells Joseph that the child with whom Mary is pregnant will fulfill the prophecy of Isaiah, "and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means "God with us."

## LET'S JOIN POPE FRANCIS IN PRAYING THE HOLY ROSARY FOR THE END OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

On April 25, the Holy Father asked us all to pray the rosary every day during May so that we might be united in prayer to end the pandemic. In his letter to the Faithful, Pope Francis wrote: The month of May is a time when the People of God express with particular intensity their love and devotion for the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is traditional in this month to pray the Rosary at home within the family...or done as a group or individually. Contemplating the face of Christ with the heart of Mary our Mother will make us even more united as a spiritual family and will help us overcome this time of trial. I keep all of you in my prayers, especially those suffering most greatly, and I ask you, please, to pray for me. I thank you, and with great affection I send you my blessing.



Even though the month of May is ending we continue to pray the holy rosary and entrust our lives, safety and well-being in the hands of Mary, Mother of the Church and Mother of Perpetual Help.





#### MOST RECENT COVID GUIDELINES IN THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU

\*This message was sent with High importance. With the Easter Season ending after Pentecost Sunday, Bishop Larry extends the following guidelines into Ordinary Time, until further notice:

- \*Masks must be worn by all who attend Mass or other liturgical services.
- \*Social distancing and no-touch greetings and Sign of Peace remain the norms.
- \*Holy Communion is to be given only under the species of Bread.
- \*The use of a small choir is permitted. If the parish is using a choir, choir members need to continue following the rules for indoor singing as directed by the State ["Any person(s) singing shall maintain physical distancing of at least ten (10) feet from any other person(s) while singing. Members of the same performing group singing may be closer than ten (10) feet together while performing, provided the group consists of less than ten (10) persons. To the extent reasonable and practicable, a physical barrier (e.g., plexiglass) of sufficient size to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 shall separate any person(s) singing from any other person(s), but not including members of the same performing group."
- \*A distance of 10 feet between the cantor and the congregation needs to be observed as much as possible.
- \*In addition to the Entrance, Offertory, Communion and Leave-taking hymns the Kyrie, Gloria, Responsorial Psalm, Gospel Acclamation, and the rest of the Mass part responses could be sung, observing the proper precautions.
- \*Sanitization is to continue between Masses.
- \*Social gatherings after Mass should not take place.
- \*We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website.

\*The government has announced that we are now in Tier 3 of the covid restrictions but as we resume our public celebrations of the Holy Mass on days and weekends, we continue to observe 6-ft safe distancing, handwashing and hygiene practices, wear face covering, and avoid large gatherings of more than 10 outside the church.

#### ❖REPAIR & MAINTENANCE

\*\*\*CHURCH REPAIRS – The successive days of rain caused leaks on the walls behind the sanctuary creating cracks and moldy floors. *Roger Isidro* and *Rudy Fiesta* came to the rescue doing some patching on the concrete wall inside and outside. They also included to re-strengthen the beams for the bells at the belfry.

\*\*\*HOME REPAIRS – Roger Isidro did some odd jobs of fixing the door latch, hinges and lock at the doorway, cabinets and storage room in the parish hall.

\*\*\*CEMETERY MAINTENANCE – The Catholic cemetery caretaker, *Kalolo Tuihalafatai*, reported the completion of the cutting and hauling away of the storm-felled eucalyptus tree on the cemetery ground. With the approval of the Parish Facilities & Maintenance Committee *Puli Construction* was awarded the contract and did a great job of clearing the area of other rotting trees, stumps and debris. The contract price for labor, materials and equipment was \$5,200.00.

❖CHURCH ENVIRONMENT – Volunteer parishioners come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the weekend Masses. They spruce up the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other cleaning tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. During the time of the covid-19 pandemic, in compliance with the Diocese and government advisory they marked the seating in the pews and communion line for 6-ft distancing as well as place sanitizers for use by the mass-goers and disinfect the church. Included in this dedicated group are Marivic Palting, Nelie Puzon, Bella Miranda, Ador Padilla, Doi Facuri, Gloria Rodrigues, Fran Kovaloff, Norma Daligcon, Aida Isidro, Medy Macalma, Olivia Mita, Marichu Pe Benito, Angie Sera and Corazon Orcino.

MAHALO to *Myra dela Cruz* who supplies our church with fresh flowers that bedeck the sanctuary. BIG THANKS also to *Tom & Olivia Mita* for donating infra-red thermometers for use in covid-tracing and Easter lilies for the sanctuary decors. Likewise, to *Luida Susa* for donating \$500.00 for sanitizers and other needed paraphernalia for disinfection.

We thank *Cleto Patoc* and *Jun Cortez* for installing the Easter baptismal font that adorned the church throughout the Easter season. They dismantled it after Pentecost Sunday and kept it in storage for next year.

**LITURGY** - The livestreaming of OLM Sunday Mass at 9:00am for the sake of those sheltered-in during the covid-19 crisis will continue on via the OLM Facebook account and thru the kind services of the *Llamedo family*. The items for power-point projection at Mass include the readings and responses together with sacred graphics. For added health protection, *Andy Llamedo* installed a flexi-glass barrier at the lectern.

A new microphone on the lectern has been installed by *Jun Cortez*. His son, *Gene Cortez*, paid for the Shure Microflex microphone in the amount of \$236.17 as his stewardship offering to the Church. Much mahalo to *Gene! Jun* and wife, *Caridad,* installed wires for wi-fi connection and clearer live-streaming from the rectory to the church.

There is a wi-fi hook-up to the parish hall on the Sunday Eucharistic celebration in case of an overflow in the church. This is made possible thru the high-tech know-how of *Jun Cortez* and *Fidel Flores* who also donated and put up wi-fi boosters in the church and hall for wider coverage and for security camera operation. Designated to operate the power-point projection during the Masses are — *Malia Balbuena* at the 6:00pm Saturday Vigil Mass, *Jun Cortez* at the 6:30am Sunday Mass while *Marc & Clem Ulep* and their kids, *David & Gerald*, take care of the 9:00am Mass.

The TV base and support were assembled by *Jun Cortez* & supervised by his faithful co-worker and wife, *Caridad*. 

## Stewardship Saint for May



St. Philip Neri was born in 1515 in Florence, Italy, during a time of intensive reform and vigorous renewal in the Church. The Council of Trent convened on three occasions during his lifetime.

He went to Rome in 1532 where he lived in extreme poverty, but devoted himself to visiting the sick and helping poor children. With his engaging style, he evangelized young Florentines of the banking and merchant class. He arranged informal prayer and discussion groups.

In 1548 he established an organization to provide hospitality for pilgrims to Rome and to care for shut-ins. At the urging of his confessor, Philip at age 36

was ordained a priest. He soon earned a reputation for being an outstanding confessor and spiritual director; gifted with being able to pierce the pretenses and illusions of others and to help them see the truth about themselves. He received penitents and visitors from all walks of life, from cardinals to the very poor. Many were attracted by the warmth of his personality, his wit, unpretentiousness and cheerfulness.

Some of Philip's followers became priests. Five of them lived together with him in community and began to share a common life under his direction. The group eventually grew and became the *Congregation of the Oratory*, which was approved in 1575. They are best known in England through their most famous member, *Cardinal John Henry Newman*. Philip and the Oratorians introduced a new style of personal spirituality for the laity, and encouraged them to give public testimony to their faith, put on theatrical productions and compose and play songs with religious themes. Philip suffered a stroke on May 25, 1595 and died the next morning. He was canonized a saint in 1622, although many church leaders considered him a saint even in his lifetime. He was known as the "apostle of Rome" for evangelizing and reviving a spirit of faith among the city's populace. His many friends included *St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Francis Xavier, St. Charles Borromeo and St. Francis de Sales*. He is the patron saint of the city of Rome. His feast day is May 26. Philip received penitents and visitors from all walks of life.




