#### First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

The Acts of the Apostles contains the stories of the Holy Spirit's activity in the lives of early church leaders. In this Reading, a centurion named Cornelius had a vision that prompted him to ask Peter to visit him. Luke describes Cornelius as a Gentile who was interested in Judaism and was a generous contributor to the needs of the Jewish community in Caesarea. Peter had a vision the same time as Cornelius and was told to eat ritually unclean animals. Peter responded, "Certainly not!" Even though Peter was unsure of the meaning of the vision, he went to the home of Cornelius. Cornelius asked Peter to speak to the his family and colleagues. As Peter spoke he saw the Holy Spirit descend on the gathering. He though the Holy Spirit was reserved for only the Jews. But "God shows no partiality." Peter needed no further confirmation and baptized Cornelius and his household. "All are one in Christ Jesus."

#### Second Reading: 1 John 4:7-10

Love spoken in this Reading is agape love. It is self-giving love that expects no return. The author of this letter admonishes the beloved members of the community, saying that they ought to love one another, because God is love and love is God. The love of God consists in God loving us first and always.

#### Gospel: John 15:9-17


Today's Gospel is a continuation of last Sunday's reading from John, it is part of the "vine and the branches" section of the farewell discourse that Jesus delivers to his disciples before this arrest and crucifixion. Jesus is trying to prepare His disciples for the violent and chaotic days ahead. He warns them of the world's hate, and he tells them that they should not be surprised that they will be persecuted just as he was, because no slave is greater than his master." Amazingly, the anecdote to the world's hate is love. It is the kind of love that changes the disciples' status from slaves to friends; it brings them into an intimacy with Christ such that only his dearest friends know what the Father shares with him. They did not choose Jesus. Rather, Jesus chose them, and now they must go out and bear fruit by loving one another.

\*\*\*CEMETERY MAINTENANCE – The Catholic cemetery caretaker, *Kalolo Tuihalafatai,* reported the completion of the cutting and hauling away of the storm-felled eucalyptus tree on the cemetery ground. With the approval of the Parish Facilities & Maintenance Committee *Puli Construction* was awarded the contract and did a great job of clearing the area of other rotting trees, stumps and debris. The contract price for labor, materials and equipment was \$5,200.00.

MAHALO to *Myra dela Cruz* who supplies our church with fresh flowers that bedeck the sanctuary. BIG THANKS also to *Tom & Olivia Mita* for donating infra-red thermometers for use in covid-tracing and Easter lilies for the sanctuary decors. Likewise, to *Luida Susa* for donating \$500.00 for sanitizers and other needed paraphernalia for disinfection.

**CITURCY** - The livestreaming of OLM Sunday Mass at 9:00am for the sake of those sheltered-in during the covid-19 crisis will continue on via the OLM Facebook account and thru the kind services of the *Llamedo family*. The items for power-point projection at Mass include the readings and responses together with sacred graphics. For added health protection, *Andy Llamedo* installed a flexi-glass barrier at the lectern.

## Stewardship: To Love As Jesus Loves - An Easter Reflection

Jesus has given each baptized Catholic a mission: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt 28:19-20). Our mission is to live this calling every day of our lives. People are at the heart of the mission of the Church. Strengthening relationships, boldly growing engagement and connecting people to the mission are simple ways to bring people to Jesus. It is not complicated – we just need to bring people to Jesus. God is always drawing closer to us, so we can rest assured that he is the one doing the hard work – not us! In order to bring people to Jesus, we must start with loving and caring for people one at a time. It has to come from a genuine desire to love and show people that they matter. After all,

why would anyone listen to the Good News from us, if we haven't shown them God's love? If we are all God's children, then we have a responsibility to help each other. We are meant to live in relationship, and to be the living presence of God in the world – to show his love to the people around us. This means treating people like family, not transactions. It's easy to do this with the people we enjoy being around. It's a lot harder to put into practice when we are talking about a coworker or acquaintance who drives us crazy. But like it or not, we are all called to this. For me this is a revolutionary idea: I am not better than anyone else. The world tries to separate us all the time by putting us into categories of race, gender or socioeconomic status. Those don't really matter. We are all children of God. It is important for all of us to try to see the people in front of us and love them like Jesus does. I invite you to join me in that, to strive each day to see people as your brothers and sisters and to treat them accordingly.



If you or someone you know is suffering from job or income loss due to the coronavirus, help is on the way! The City and County of Honolulu has just secured \$114 million in federal COVID-19 relief funds to launch a new <u>Rent and Utility Relief</u> <u>program</u> that became available to Oahu applicants Easter Monday, April 5.

Hawaii's 9.2% unemployment rate is reported to be the highest in the country according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics February 2021 report. And although our economy is slowly re-opening, the lack of job opportunities and delays in unemployment insurance payments have left many residents struggling to pay for food, shelter and basic household expenses. Depending on a person's financial situation, gualified 'Oahu applicants may receive funding for up to 12 months.

#### **MINI-RECAP OF FAITH ACTION'S LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES FOR 2021**

Three different Faith Action Task Forces were busy at the Legislature this year. A full description of both their "wins" and their "losses" is available on the Faith Action website at: https://www.faithactionhawaii.org/post/faith-action-legislativewrap-up-2021.

The losses, unfortunately, were several. Very briefly, the two task forces with "wins" were these:

The Housing Now! Task Force enjoyed limited success. The Legislature passed HB 286, which forces REITs to declare their Hawaii-based revenue. Bill passage means we will finally document how much in total corporate taxes REITs would pay.

The Environmental Justice Task Force celebrated the passage of Senate Concurrent Resolution 44, which makes Hawaii the first state to declare a climate emergency. Also passed was HB 1142, which creates a funding mechanism for the installation of electric vehicle charging systems. It is hoped this will encourage the purchase of more electric vehicles.

Many community advocates were disappointed in what they considered to be the Legislature's inadequate response to many other issues facing Hawaii, such as climate change, affordable housing, housing security, living wage, agriculture, food security, public education, homelessness, gun safety, long-term care and government transparency. But, Faith Action realizes that very few bills get passed in their first legislative session. It usually takes years, and that is why advocates must be persistent if they hope to ultimately be successful. Faith Action looks forward to the 2022 legislative session and is already making plans for it.
