





Fr. Edgar B. Brillantes was born in Trinidad, Davao del Sur, Mindanao, Philippines on October 30, 1954. He is the eldest of 8 children, 6 boys & 2 girls, to parents Augusto Brillantes & Tita Bueno, who were both teachers and now deceased.

He started his seminary formation at the Immaculate Conception Minor Seminary in Vigan, Ilocos Sur. He enrolled at the St. Louis University, Baguio City, as college freshman but completed his Bachelor of Arts degree at the Immaculate Conception Major Seminary in Vigan. He pursued his Theology degree at the ICST Regional Seminary of Northern Luzon. He was ordained to the Priesthood on April 14, 1980 in San Juan Bautista Parish, San Juan, Ilocos Sur, his hometown, for the Archdiocese of Nueva Segovia by the Archbishop Juan Sison.

In 1983, he was sent by Cardinal Jose T. Sanchez for further studies at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome, Italy, where he earned his Licentiate in Sacred Theology (STL).

His pastoral assignments in the Philippines included: Parochial Vicar at St. Paul Metropolitan Cathedral, Vigan City; Administrator of San Ildefonso Parish, San Ildefonso, Ilocos Sur; Pastor of Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, Sevilla, Sta. Cruz, Ilocos Sur; Pastor of San Juan de Sahagun Parish, Candon City; Spiritual Director & Professor at the Immaculate Conception School of Theology (ICST), Vigan City.

Fr. Edgar arrived in Hawai'i from the Philippines on August 6, 1999 to serve with the Filipino Ethnic Ministry in the Diocese of Honolulu. At the same time, Bishop Francis DiLorenzo appointed him as Administrates of St. John the Destint Parish in Kalibi Like, Handlulu, On Juli

trator of St. John the Baptist Parish in Kalihi Uka, Honolulu. On July 1, 2006, Bishop Larry Silva assigned him as Administrator of St. Joseph and Malia Puka O Kalani Parishes in Hilo, Hawai'i. On July 1, 2007, he was Appointed Administrator of Our Lady of Sorrows Parish in Wahiawa. He eventually became Pastor upon his incardination into the Diocese of Honolulu in April 2008. On July 1, 2012, he was installed Pastor of Saints Peter & Paul Parish in the Ala Moana District. Currently, Fr. Edgar is the Pastor of Our Lady of the Mount Church in Kalihi Valley since July 1, 2014.

Aside from his parochial positions in the Honolulu Diocese, Fr. Edgar has served as member of the Presbyteral Council; Spiritual Director for Knights of Columbus; Spiritual Director for Diocesan Congress of Filipino Catholic Clubs; Spiritual Advisor for Cursillos of Hawaii; and President of the Filipino Priests Association of Hawaii. *Fr. Adrian R. Gervacio* was born on September 8, 1939 in Bacarra, Ilocos Norte, Philippines. He arrived in Hawaii in August 1975. For five years, Father ministered to the Filipino communities in the diocese. He traveled to parishes and mission churches, working in each parish for a month, visiting families and preaching a mission for seven nights. This was very meaningful and fulfilling. He went to a radio station in Honolulu and gave a talk. On the neighbor islands, Father recorded talks to be played on the radio. Father was associate pastor at Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa for two years. In June 1977, Father was incarnated into the Diocese of Honolulu by the late Bishop John J. Scanlan. He was then the pastor at St. Anthony Parish in Kalihi for four years. In 1982, Fr. Adrian was appointed pastor of St. Anthony on Puuhale Road.

In 1986, Father requested of the late Bishop Joseph Ferrario to be endorsed for the Archdiocese for Military Services. The request was granted and Father was commissioned as a U. S. Navy chaplain in September of 1986. Father served with the Marine Corps in Okinawa; rode ships while stationed in Subic Bay, Philippines; went on to Guam; then to Guantanamo Bay; Charleston, South Carolina; Port Hueneme, California; and retired with the rank of Lt. Commander when he was stationed at Naval Air Weapons Station, China Lake, California. The varied ministries and going to different places enriched him as a priest. The many varied assignments contributed to a very meaningful priesthood.


After retiring from the Navy in 2006, Father was sent to St. John Apostle and Evangelist Church in Mililani where he served as interim administrator. In June 2007, Father took an assignment as pastor of Our Lady of the Mount in Kalihi Valley. Father retired from active ministry in June 2014.

On March 18, 2017, Fr. Adrian celebrated the 50th Anniversary of his ordination into the priesthood. In the Hawaii Catholic Herald on April 20, 2017, Hawaii's 2017 Jubilarians, Fr. Adrian, other priests, clergy and religious members were honored. A Mass of gratitude was celebrated by Bishop Larry Silva at the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa on May 6, 2017. Fr. Adrian remains at Our Lady of the Mount Parish as Pastor-Emeritus.

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks against intolerance, referring to someone who is not a follower who is driving out demons. He says: *Whoever is not against us is for us*.



keep us mindful that we live for Christ and not for ourselves,


and that to be good stewards of his Gospel should be our goal each and every day.

LETTER FROM BISHOP LARRY SILVA

July 22, 2021

Dear Fellow Priests,

Peace be with you!

As many of you are aware, the Diocese and several of our faith communities have faced significant financial challenges in recent years. Through it all we have continued to work together as 'Ohana in Christ, providing vital services, and supporting important ministries. I thank you very much for all your efforts and your prayerful stewardship of time, talent and treasure.

During the past year, I asked the Stewardship and Development Commission to form a sub-committee of clergy and lay leaders. Their task was to study ways to generate new funding streams to support areas formerly funded, in whole or part, by the *With Grateful Hearts* capital campaign. Specifically, these areas include our priests' needs, seminary formation, deacon formation, Youth and Young Adult Ministry, and those most in need through our various social ministries.

After meeting monthly and reviewing various options, it was evident that most initiatives would require time and an extended effort. Consequently, they recommended and I decided to move ahead with the proposal to rebrand the current Bishop's Circle Appeal and broaden its participation by asking each parish to play an active part by raising awareness of our wider church mission and services, as well as helping to raise the funds to sustain them through an annual diocesan appeal.

To this point, a special appeal and collection is scheduled for the weekend of **October 2-3, 2021**. Each parish will be assigned a target goal of 25% of their assessment for the current year. Promotional resources, assistance, and some flexibility will be provided in year one. For a preview, attached are proofs of the poster and prayer card for:


CARDENING – There are wonderful people who volunteer with the upkeep of the church grounds. *Clemente Fontanilla* mows the grasses.

BEATING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

*Please refer to the latest directives provided by the Diocese Office of Worship.

*The State has announced that 70% of the population must get covid vaccination to lift the imposed restrictions. Meanwhile, as we resume our public celebrations of the Holy Mass on days and weekends, we continue to observe health and safety protocols of keeping 6-ft distancing, hand-washing and hygiene practices, wear face covering, until we reach the 70% level. *When you come for Holy Communion, receive the Body of Christ only with your hand and take off

your mask only when you actually consume it.

Nevertheless, they are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed mass to fulfill their Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide the live-streamed Mass every Sunday at the 9:00am Mass. There are prayers available that we can use individually or as a family. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put an end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. Let us stay safe, healthy and blessed and continue to pray for one another and for the whole world.

Subject: UPDATE - FUNERALS DURING THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC

Bishop Larry Silva has made the following change to the Diocesan Guidelines for COVID-19 effective immediately:

Funerals in churches are allowed with the body of the deceased present if the mortuary is permitted to transport the body.

The Funeral Mass or Funeral Liturgy outside of Mass may be at full capacity with 6' social distancing and the indoor mask mandate enforced.

It should be noted that if the body is not permitted to be taken to the church, the Funeral Mass may still be celebrated without the presence of the body, and the rites of blessing the body and Commendation and Farewell can take place as a part of the Committal service. This should be at the discretion of the family of the deceased.

As a reminder, our Catholic funeral rites are intended to bring consolation to those who are grieving, affirm our faith in Jesus Christ and his victory over sin and death, and express our Christian hope in eternal life.

The three principal rites together - Vigil, Funeral Liturgy, and Committal - form an integrated sequence of rites. Pastors should ensure the Church's pastoral care for the bereaved.



LITURGICAL REMINDERS DURING THE TIME OF COVID-19

To: All Pastors and Parishioners Date: September 17, 2021 *This message was sent with High importance. Dear Fathers et al,

With the numerous inquiries to the Office of Worship and the Covid-19 Taskforce, we would like to send out the following liturgical reminders and clarifications:

• Parish churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions will continue offering in person services (i.e. Daily and Sunday Mass, Funeral Masses, Weddings, Baptisms, Confirmation/first Holy Communion Masses) and other spiritual services. During in-person spiritual services, Churches are exempt from the 10 indoor/25 outdoor restriction. Funeral and Wedding Liturgies fall under that exemption. The capacity may be the same as Daily and Sunday Masses.

• Masks must be worn by **all** who attend Mass or other liturgical services.

• Social distancing and no-touch greetings and Sign of Peace remain the norm.

• Holy Communion is to be given only under the species of Bread.

• Communion on the hand (one hand held open above the other) is encouraged for the greater health and safety of all, though Communion on the tongue is not prohibited. The Precious Blood will only be taken by the priest.

• All ministers of Holy Communion, including the clergy, will sanitize their hands immediately before distributing Communion and immediately after doing so. (A small table or stand may be placed next to each Communion station, so that if a minister feels his or her hands may have been contaminated, the paten/ciborium can be placed on the table momentarily while the minister sanitizes his or her hands.)

• Sanitization is to continue between Masses.

• We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website.

• Homebound Ministry and administering the Anointing of the Sick is not prohibited and should continue. Please follow and maintain all proper safety protocols (i.e. wear mask/face shield at all times, gloves if applicable, no touching, hugging, kissing, stay 6' apart as much as possible) by the volunteers and/or ministers. We recommend to keep visits short (no more than 15 mins).

A Letter to Governor Ige From Faith Action: "Translating Belief of Love into Action"

The continuing rise of COVID-19 cases and its heart-breaking effects led to two Faith Action town hall meetings in September. There, members expressed their heartfelt concerns about the pandemic and shared ideas on how people of faith will be heard by the Governor. The result is a letter to the Governor. Below is a short version. The complete letter is at website, faithactionhawaii.org.

Dear Governor Ige,

As faith communities in Hawai'i, we recognize the pain — physical, emotional, economic, and spiritual — being felt by many as a result of Covid19.

We know there are no easy answers. We know the foundation of all our religious beliefs is love — love for our Creator and for our neighbors as ourselves. Thus we feel compelled to take personal action and encourage additional action from you.

Translating belief into action, we pledge to become more vocal and more visible, and to take some or all of the following measures in the weeks and months ahead:

* Support mandatory vaccination as we preach from our pulpits the importance of showing love for our neighbors by getting vaccinated. We deny religious exemptions.

* Maintain all safety protocols, even though churches are exempt from some limits.

* Encourage sharing of stories among our members, to address fears or misconceptions about vaccination.

* When possible, open our church facilities as sites for vaccinations.

* Promote health literacy to help ourselves understand the facts of viruses

* Support expanded or complete shutdown of the state, when needed to save lives.

We also encourage you, as Governor, to take additional actions for the good of the state.

• Work with the State Board of Education to improve the safety of schools for our keiki

• Reduce barriers to Covid testing

• Step up special efforts with those populations where mortality rates are high (Filipinos, Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders; empower their leaders to share accurate health information

• Send the message repeatedly that exemption from vaccination does not exempt you from the consequences of being unvaccinated (i.e., you cannot access any setting where vaccination is required)

• Impose a complete shutdown, if Covid numbers continue to rise to dangerous levels.
