

BEATING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

*Please refer to the latest directives provided by the Diocese Office of Worship.

*The State has announced that 70% of the population must get covid vaccination to lift the imposed restrictions. Meanwhile, as we resume our public celebrations of the Holy Mass on days and weekends, we continue to observe health and safety protocols of keeping 6-ft distancing, hand-washing and hygiene practices, wear face covering, until we reach the 70% level.

*When you come for Holy Communion, receive the Body of Christ only with your hand and take off your mask only when you actually consume it.

*Dispensation for not attending mass in churches due to high risk or fear of infecting or contracting coronavirus has been lifted up by Bishop Larry Silva starting April 3, 2021. However, those who feel not really able yet to come for reason of sickness are not forced to come. Nevertheless, they are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed mass to fulfill their Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide the live-streamed Mass every Sunday at the 9:00am Mass. There are prayers available that we can use individually or as a family. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put an end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. Let us stay safe, healthy and blessed and continue to pray for one another and for the whole world.

DIOCESE OF HONOLULU MEMORANDUM **NEW COVID GUIDELINES ON FUNERALS**

Subject: UPDATE - FUNERALS DURING THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC

Bishop Larry Silva has made the following change to the Diocesan Guidelines for COVID-19 effective immediately:

Funerals in churches are allowed with the body of the deceased present if the mortuary is permitted to transport the body.

The Funeral Mass or Funeral Liturgy outside of Mass may be at full capacity with 6' social distancing and the indoor mask mandate enforced.

It should be noted that if the body is not permitted to be taken to the church, the Funeral Mass may still be celebrated without the presence of the body, and the rites of blessing the body and Commendation and Farewell can take place as a part of the Committal service. This should be at the discretion of the family of the deceased.

As a reminder, our Catholic funeral rites are intended to bring consolation to those who are grieving, affirm our faith in Jesus Christ and his victory over sin and death, and express our Christian hope in eternal life.

The three principal rites together - Vigil, Funeral Liturgy, and Committal - form an integrated sequence of rites. Pastors should ensure the Church's pastoral care for the bereaved.

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS: The Joy of Opening Our Hearts to Christ



*Excerpt from a homily by the *Most Reverend Thomas Wenski*, archbishop of Miami, at the Eucharistic celebration to open the 59th annual conference of the *International Catholic Stewardship Council* in Orlando, Florida, on September 12, 2021.

In Saint Mark's Gospel we have witnessed the beginning of Jesus' ministry when he gathered a group of disciples to himself, and he went about Galilee doing good through some remarkable miracles. As I remind the priests in the Archdiocese of Miami, Jesus didn't start off talking about the cross. He started off by first making friends, establishing relationships with people; people whom he met at their level,

speaking their language. I think this is perhaps the genius of Pope Francis. He understands that evangelization is first about an encounter. "Come and see," Jesus tells those first disciples. They come, they spend time with him and they follow him because his personality, his words, his deeds are attractive. In a word, they experience the joy of the Gospel.

"Restore our Joy!" This is a wonderful theme for the ICSC conference this week, especially as you prepare for a transformational future beyond this current Coronavirus environment. But I would be remiss if I did not thank you, not only in my name, but also in the name of all the bishops for gathering together to pray, reflect and strengthen each other for the task ahead and for all that you do for the Church to promote stewardship.

All of our parishes and dioceses have experienced some financial pain during these past several months in which the normality of our lives has been disrupted. Our diocesan stewardship offices around the country have done great work in encouraging people to give online, not only to help our parishes but to help our people who also were hurting financially because of this virus. Even if it did not infect all of us, it certainly has affected every one of us.

Of course, stewardship is not about increasing the Sunday offertory collection. It is not about fundraising. Stewardship is not a program. It is a way of life. It is the way of life for those who have opened wide the doors of their hearts to Christ. The road map towards a transformational future and the restoration of our joy lies in presenting Christ as he really is. For to be a Christian is not a burden but a gift, having encountered him is the best thing that has happened to us and to share him with others by the gifts of our time, talent and treasure, even at the cost of our very selves, is good stewardship. And it brings us joy.



PRAYER FOR DELIVERANCE FROM THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC

Dear God of all the living, you sent your Son Jesus to heal us from illness and sin. to his healing power in this time of anxiety over the pandemic of this potentially deadly virus.

St. Damien and St. Marianne Cope dedicated their lives to the service of those who had an infectious disease. St. Marianne Cope said, "I am not afraid of any disease," because she was confident in your power to save. At the same time, she took prudent precautions of hygiene to assure that she and her Sisters would not be infected. Let us learn from this example to put our trust in you to save us from the ravages of disease and to take prudent measures to prevent its spread. Guide us to know when to isolate ourselves from the possibility of infection, but never let anyone be left without the care and concern of others in the community.

LITURGICAL REMINDERS DURING THE TIME OF COVID-19

To: All Pastors and Parishioners

Date: September 17, 2021

*This message was sent with High importance.

Dear Fathers et al,

With the numerous inquiries to the Office of Worship and the Covid-19 Taskforce, we would like to send out the following liturgical reminders and clarifications:

- Parish churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions will continue offering in person services (i.e. Daily and Sunday Mass, Funeral Masses, Weddings, Baptisms, Confirmation/first Holy Communion Masses) and other spiritual services. During in-person spiritual services, Churches are exempt from the 10 indoor/25 outdoor restriction. Funeral and Wedding Liturgies fall under that exemption. The capacity may be the same as Daily and Sunday Masses.
- Masks must be worn by all who attend Mass or other liturgical services.
- Social distancing and no-touch greetings and Sign of Peace remain the norm.
- Holy Communion is to be given only under the species of Bread.
- Communion on the hand (one hand held open above the other) is encouraged for the greater health and safety of all, though Communion on the tongue is not prohibited. The Precious Blood will only be taken by the priest.
- All ministers of Holy Communion, including the clergy, will sanitize their hands immediately before distributing Communion and immediately after doing so. (A small table or stand may be placed next to each Communion station, so that if a minister feels his or her hands may have been contaminated, the paten/ciborium can be placed on the table momentarily while the minister sanitizes his or her hands.)
- · Sanitization is to continue between Masses.
- We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website.
- Homebound Ministry and administering the Anointing of the Sick is not prohibited and should continue. Please follow and maintain all proper safety protocols (i.e. wear mask/face shield at all times, gloves if applicable, no touching, hugging, kissing, stay 6' apart as much as possible) by the volunteers and/or ministers. We recommend to keep visits short (no more than 15 mins).



TRANSFORMATIVE JUSTICE TASK FORCE

"Continue to remember those in prison as if you were together with them in prison, and those who are mistreated as if you yourselves were suffering." (Hebrews 13:3)

Aloha from the Transformative Justice Task Force! We are a new task force with a lot of enthusiasm and commitment. We have members from Oʻahu, Hawaiʻi Island, and Kauaʻi, We invite you to join us. We meet every other week, and our next gathering will be on Wednesday, October 6. The Zoom link can be found on the Faith Action calendar.

Our educational and legislative focus is eliminating cash bail and drawing attention to alternate ways of caring for communities in a true sense of public safety.

Incarceration is deeply traumatizing and creates inequities in attaining housing, education, employment and child custody just for starters. Pre-trial detention permanently derails the trajectory of both an incarcerated person's life and the lives of their loved ones.

Native Hawaiians are overrepresented at every level of the criminal legal system in addition to the myriad of racial disparities that perpetuate their inability to afford bail. Dismantling disadvantaged peoples' lives cannot be the goal of our criminal legal system.

We ask that you consider supporting the elimination of monetary bail, or "cash bail", which is the front door of our punitive carceral system, in the 2022 Hawai'i State legislative session.


