

First Reading

FOCUS: The road to the Kingdom is paved with love for God and for our neighbor.

The greatest commandments are these; to love God first with our whole heart, soul, mind, and strength, and then to love our neighbor as ourselves. Jesus tells us there are none greater than these, and understanding and living these commands brings us ever closer to the kingdom of God

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS: Solemnity of All Saints *CELEBRATING THE STEWARDS OF THEIR FAITH

On November 1, the Solemnity of All Saints celebrates the triumph of Christ's Gospel in the lives of every person who now enjoys the friendship of God in phayer. This feast embraces not only those who have been officially recognitive.



heaven. This feast embraces not only those who have been officially recognized by the Church as saints, it also includes those who had a reputation for holiness but whose causes for canonization have not yet been completed, as well as those women and men whose lives of sanctity were known only to their family, friends and associates, or to members of their parish, diocese or religious community. The twenty-second great council of the Catholic Church, the Second Vatican Council, offers an explanation for this solemnity in its Dogmatic Constitution on the Church (*Lumen gentium*, "Light of nations"): "In the lives of those companions of ours who are more perfectly transformed into the image of Christ (see 2 Corinthians 3:18) God shows, vividly, to humanity his presence and his face. He speaks to us through them and offers us a sign of his Kingdom, to which we are powerfully attracted, so great a cloud of witnesses are we given (see Hebrews 12:1) and such an affirmation of the truth of the Gospel ... Our communion with the saints joins us to Christ, from whom as from its fountain and head flow all grace and life of the people of God itself" (n. 50).

The beginnings of this feast can be traced back to the 4th century where the Church in the East had a collective celebration of all the Christian martyrs on the Friday after Easter Sunday. Chaldean-rite Catholics still celebrate the feast on that day. Origins of the feast for the Church in the West are not precisely known. The first mention of November 1 as the day for observing the feast came from England in the 8th century. A 9th century liturgical calendar from England lists All Saints as a major feast on November 1. Arguably, Rome adopted this day to celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints when Pope Gregory IV (828-844) transferred the feast from May to November 1 because Rome could not accommodate the number of pilgrims who came for the feast in late spring. In England and Ireland, the feast of All Saints was formerly known as "All Hallows." This explains the name for the secular celebration of Halloween, on the "eve" of the feast itself, "Hallowe'en", meaning "Hallow evening."

The Solemnity of All Saints should remind us of our communion with all the saints who have gone before us as well as the universal call to exercise perfect stewardship of our faith through the love of Christ and under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Let us pray to conduct our lives as Jesus would have it. For he said, "You, therefore, must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48).



On November 1-5, the audit team of KMHLLP will come to check our parish books and finances. This is mandated by the Diocese and is done every two years.

PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL REPORT

* FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2020 - JUNE 30, 2021 *

We would like to express our gratitude to our beloved parishioners who have continued to share their financial blessings with our parish. Amidst the pandemic, your offerings made it possible for the parish to continue its operation and ministry.

Our 2020-2021 financial report shows that the church generated a net income of \$31,204 as compared to a budgeted deficit of \$78,891. This was due to an increase in the Sunday offerings and Holy Day offerings, controlling the expenses, and a federal grant for the Payment Protection Program for the Church staff, with equivalent support from the diocese to pay the priest's salary.

You have demonstrated love in action! Despite the challenges many have had to endure for another year due to COVID, our parish continues to thrive.

Thank you so much for your generosity. Our parish family here at Our Lady of the Mount is truly blessed and resilient. *Father Edgar* and your *Parish Finance Council* would like to thank everyone for your ongoing support and wish all of you and your families a blessed upcoming holiday season.

Peace be with you!

Pope Francis has announced a Synod of Bishops, which is to take place in October 2023 in Rome. In preparation for that Synod, he has asked every diocese in the world to conduct its own consultation process between October 17, 2021 and February 2022. I therefore invite all in our diocese to carefully read this Request for Input and to respond as requested. The documents issued by the Vatican describe a rather complex process, and anyone who wants to read them can do so at Vescovi (vatican.va) and Vescovi (vatican.va). I have attempted to simplify the process to make it more effective in our diocese.

The Synod consultation process involves these steps:

Pray, using the Scripture readings provided.

Reflect on the readings, on the Synod questions, and most of all on the **ONE KEY QUESTION** being asked of everyone in our Diocese of Honolulu.

Have a discussion with ANY group on the ONE KEY QUESTION. (E.g. parish pastoral council, finance council, school board; Legion of Mary, Knights of Columbus, Filipino Catholic Clubs; households; neighbors; a small group from your parish; a small group at your workplace; attendees at youth sports; youth groups; young adult groups; senior groups; etc.). The objective is to be as inclusive as possible.

Collate responses in a brief summary and submit them to https://bit.ly/SynodResponses.

Repeat this consultation process with other people or groups, especially with those who are not a part of our normal parish groups.

Responses submitted will be collated into a diocesan report of ten pages or less and submitted to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. The USCCB will summarize all reports from the U.S. dioceses. A continental consultation will follow when the Canadian Catholic Conference will join in with the USCCB. Then all the combined summarized reports will be sent to the Vatican in preparation for the October 2023 Synod of Bishops, where representative bishops and others from countries throughout the world will meet with our Holy Father, Pope Francis.

Thank you for your participation in this Synod consultation process. May it bear much good fruit for our diocese and for the Catholic Church throughout the world!





LITURGICAL REMINDERS DURING THE TIME OF COVID-19

To: All Pastors and Parishioners

Date: September 17, 2021

*This message was sent with High importance.

Dear Fathers et al,

With the numerous inquiries to the Office of Worship and the Covid-19 Taskforce, we would like to send out the following liturgical reminders and clarifications:

- Parish churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions will continue offering in person services (i.e. Daily and Sunday Mass, Funeral Masses, Weddings, Baptisms, Confirmation/first Holy Communion Masses) and other spiritual services. During in-person spiritual services, Churches are exempt from the 10 indoor/25 outdoor restriction. Funeral and Wedding Liturgies fall under that exemption. The capacity may be the same as Daily and Sunday Masses.
- Masks must be worn by all who attend Mass or other liturgical services.
- Social distancing and no-touch greetings and Sign of Peace remain the norm.
- Holy Communion is to be given only under the species of Bread.
- Communion on the hand (one hand held open above the other) is encouraged for the greater health and safety of all, though Communion on the tongue is not prohibited. The Precious Blood will only be taken by the priest.
- All ministers of Holy Communion, including the clergy, will sanitize their hands immediately before distributing Communion and immediately after doing so. (A small table or stand may be placed next to each Communion station, so that if a minister feels his or her hands may have been contaminated, the paten/ciborium can be placed on the table momentarily while the minister sanitizes his or her hands.)
- · Sanitization is to continue between Masses.
- We encourage parish priests to start/continue live-streaming their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website.
- Homebound Ministry and administering the Anointing of the Sick is not prohibited and should continue. Please follow and maintain all proper safety protocols (i.e. wear mask/face shield at all times, gloves if applicable, no touching, hugging, kissing, stay 6' apart as much as possible) by the volunteers and/or ministers. We recommend to keep visits short (no more than 15 mins).
