#### Next Sunday's Reading First Sunday of Advent

First Reading
Jeremiah 33:14-15

Responsorial Psalm Psalm: 25:4-5, 8-10, 14

Second Reading

Gospel

1 Thessalonians 3:12-42

Luke: 21:25-28, 34-36

FOCUS: Christ's dominion is eternal.

Today's solemnity, by which we close the liturgical year, reminds us that Christ is king and ruler of all. He is the *firstborn* of the dead in whom all power and authority has been invested. By our baptism we share in that holy and royal identity so that we might witness to his glory and kingship before the world.

First Reading: Daniel 7:13-14

Daniel has a vision of one like a Son of Man coming, on the clouds of heaven, receiving dominion and kingship over all

creation.

Re.: Prayers for the U.S. Supreme Court and a pending pro-life decision

Dear Priests and Deacons of the Diocese,

Peace be with you!

In the early days of December, the U.S. Supreme Court will deliberate on Dobbs vs. Jackson Women's Health, a ruling that could possibly lead to the reversal of Roe vs. Wade, which has allowed the abortion of over 60 million girls and boys in our country. While the Supreme Court should not be influenced by public opinion, its wisdom can certainly be guided by fervent prayer. Therefore, I am asking that each parish urge its parishioners to pray that the Supreme Court be guided by the Holy Spirit in this decision.

Moreover, I am asking each parish to conduct Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament the evening of Saturday, November 27 through the morning of Sunday, November 28, to pray for this very important prolife intention. Adoration could begin immediately after the Saturday evening Mass and continue all night, ending just before the first Mass on Sunday morning. For those parishes that are simply not able to hold the all-night Adoration, we urge you to at least conduct Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for at least one hour on Saturday evening, November 27.

I apologize for the very short notice on this initiative, but I hope that every parish will be able to organize this communal prayer for the sake of all the unborn babies and their mothers and families.



#### PETITION NOT TO EXCLUDE CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

We need your help to ensure the Build Back Better Act does not effectively exclude Catholic schools from child-care and pre-K programs, thereby severely limiting options for families.

## SYNOD OF BISHOPS - Diocese of Honolulu Phase REQUEST FOR INPUT REGARDING THE SYNODAL NATURE OF THE CHURCH

To: The Clergy, Religious and Faithful of the Diocese of Honolulu

#### Peace be with you!

Pope Francis has announced a Synod of Bishops, which is to take place in October 2023 in Rome. In preparation for that Synod, he has asked every diocese in the world to conduct its own consultation process between October 17, 2021 and February 2022. I therefore invite all in our diocese to carefully read this Request for Input and to respond as requested. The documents issued by the Vatican describe a rather complex process, and anyone who wants to read them can do so at <a href="Documento Preparatorio della XVI Assemblea Generale Ordinaria del Sinodo dei Vescovi (vatican.va)">Vescovi (vatican.va)</a> and <a href="For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission Vademecum for the Synod on Synodality (vatican.va)">Vescovi (vatican.va)</a>. I have attempted to simplify the process to make it more effective in our diocese.

The Synod consultation process involves these steps:

Pray, using the Scripture readings provided.

Reflect on the readings, on the Synod questions, and most of all on the **ONE KEY QUESTION** being asked of everyone in our Diocese of Honolulu.

Have a discussion with ANY group on the ONE KEY QUESTION. (E.g. parish pastoral council, finance council, school board; Legion of Mary, Knights of Columbus, Filipino Catholic Clubs; households; neighbors; a small group from your parish; a small group at your workplace; attendees at youth sports; youth groups; young adult groups; senior groups; etc.). The objective is to be as inclusive as possible.

Collate responses in a brief summary and submit them to <a href="https://bit.ly/SynodResponses">https://bit.ly/SynodResponses</a>.

Repeat this consultation process with other people or groups, especially with those who are not a part of our normal parish groups.

Responses submitted will be collated into a diocesan report of ten pages or less and submitted to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. The USCCB will summarize all reports from the U.S. dioceses. A continental consultation will follow when the Canadian Catholic Conference will join in with the USCCB. Then all the combined summarized reports will be sent to the Vatican in preparation for the October 2023 Synod of Bishops, where representative bishops and others from countries throughout the world will meet with our Holy Father, Pope Francis.

Thank you for your participation in this Synod consultation process. May it bear much good fruit for our diocese and for the Catholic Church throughout the world!

#### Subject: UPDATED LITURGICAL DIRECTIVES FOR THE NEW LITURGICAL YEAR DURING THE TIME OF PANDEMIC

The following are the updated liturgical directives and reminders that impact all Catholic churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions in the Diocese of Honolulu during the time of pandemic effective the First Sunday of Advent, November 28, 2021.

<u>SINGING AT MASS</u>: Singing by both a choir and congregation is now allowed. Masks must be worn as a mitigation effort. Other mitigation measures (e.g., increased physical distancing and improved ventilation) should be considered and implemented.

HYMNALS AND OTHER PRINTED MATERIALS: All hymnals and missalettes may be returned to the pews and used. Pastors may choose to continue printing Worship Aids and/or project Music texts while following copyright/licensing guidelines. Printed bulletins and other materials may be handed out.

<u>COLLECTION BASKETS:</u> Collection baskets should not be passed from person to person, but people may place their offering in a basket in front of the altar or in a locked box as they enter the church. As an alternative, ushers may use collection baskets with handles or may pass through the aisles while holding the baskets.

#### Reminders from previous diocesan directives and/or protocols:

- Face coverings (masks or mask/face shields) will be worn at ALL times by all who participate at the Mass during the liturgical celebration. For those ministers with respiratory issues the use of a face shield instead of a face mask is highly recommended.
- The priests, deacons and anyone assisting in the distribution of Communion will sanitize their hands just before and just after distribution of Communion. If they feel their hands are contaminated during Communion, they may pause and sanitize their hands before resuming.
- Priests may administer the Anointing of the Sick and Viaticum, especially in situations where there is the danger of death. Priests, deacons and other duly commissioned extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion may take Communion to the homebound, always exercising proper hygiene procedure and wearing masks.
- Parishes may celebrate communal penance services and/or reinstate specified hours of reconciliation. Please observe good spacing between the penitent and priest, while at the same time observing absolute privacy for the penitent. Confessions by phone or via the internet are not permitted. Private confession is an essential element for ongoing conversion and growth in holiness. General absolution is not permitted and only be imparted under grave circumstance.
- Funerals in churches are allowed with the body of the deceased present if the mortuary is permitted to transport the body. The Funeral Mass or Funeral Liturgy outside of Mass may be at full capacity with 6' social distancing and the indoor mask mandate enforced.
- Churches may remain open during the day for private prayer at the discretion of the pastor and observing whatever guidelines he may establish.
- As an act of charity, anyone who is sick or who is particularly vulnerable to infection should not attend Mass at this time.
- We encourage parish priests to continue live-streaming their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website. Daily and Sunday Mass are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. #### \*PRAYER FOR DELIVERANCE FROM THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC\*

Dear God of all the living, you sent your Son Jesus to heal us from illness and sin.

We turn to his healing power in this time of anxiety over the pandemic of this potentially deadly virus.

St. Damien and St. Marianne Cope dedicated their lives to the service of those who had an infectious disease.

St. Marianne Cope said, "I am not afraid of any disease," because she was confident in your power to save.

At the same time, she took prudent precautions of hygiene to assure that she and her Sisters would not be infected.

Let us learn from this example to put our trust in you to save us from the ravages of disease and to take prudent measures to prevent its spread. Guide us to know when to isolate ourselves from the possibility of infection, but never let anyone be left without the care and concern of others in the community.


