Familiar symbols will bring out this sense of anticipation such as the Advent Wreath with the gradual lighting of the four candles. There are also Advent Mission, Sacrament of Reconciliation and the traditional Misa de gallo or Simbang-Gabi celebrated in churches. Within the season are celebrated the Marian feasts of the Immaculate Conception (Dec 8) and Our Lady of Guadalupe (Dec 12) which are close to our hearts as parishioners dedicated to Our Lady. How blessed we are then at OLM to be visited by the Blessed Lady of Guadalupe thru the replica of her miraculous image on Dec 3. The US Bishops are requesting also all the faithful to hold a Holy Hour or whole night vigil for the intention of protecting the life of the unborn and putting an end to abortion of innocent lives. Amidst the persisting threat of the deadly covid variants and global pandemic as well as political and economic crisis, the Lord Jesus warns us to avoid both self-centered diversions and self-consuming anxieties. Instead, we his faithful disciples should confidently anticipate Jesus' coming with redeeming mercy and prayerfully attend to Jesus' presence among us thru the sacraments and liturgical services in Church.





STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

*ADVENT REFLECTION

On this first Sunday of Advent, the Gospel reading depicts Jesus warning his followers about the end-time. He urges them to pray, be vigilant, spiritually awake, avoid self-indulgence, spiritual malaise, and a preoccupation with anxiety. Jesus advises against a lifestyle of earthly pleasures and worry. These will not matter when the Lord asks for an account of our stewardship. Stewards realize their lives



are not just about the here and now. They know themselves to be reflections of God's active presence in the world and witnesses of the Lord's promises. As we begin this season of hope, let us reflect on the practical effect of having every waking moment in our lives dedicated to the Lord.

*PSALMS OF PRAISE AND THANKSGIVING

The Thanksgiving holiday is an excellent time to rediscover the psalms of praise and thanksgiving. When you find a quiet moment, sit and relax with your Bible. Think of a time when awe and gratitude overwhelmed you. Maybe it was a sunrise, or children playing in a park, an inspirational hymn at Mass, a family gathering, or a walk in the woods. Remember how you appreciated that special moment. Then, open your Bible to one of the psalms of thanksgiving and recite it to yourself. Take Psalm 118 for instance: Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever. Listen to the words. Close your eyes. Let the psalm speak to you. Other psalms of praise and thanksgiving you might consider include Psalms 92, 95, 98, 100, 103, 104, 105, 107, 111, 117, 145, and 147. Whatever psalm you choose for that quiet moment, thank God for that special time of awe as well as all the good things in your life, and praise God for his glorious deeds.

Dear Pastors, Priests & Parish Office Managers/Secretaries (parishes only, schools may have their own separate directives):

In follow up to Governor Ige's and Oahu Mayor Blangiardi's news conferences today this is what we know:

*As of December 1, 2021 for OAHU parishes only, all venues will be open to full capacity WITH MASK-

ING.

*Contract tracing in venues will stop as of December 1, 2021.

*As of December 1, 2021, each county will implement appropriate measures for social gatherings, restaurant operations, social establishments and other venues within their own counties.

*Therefore, we will need to wait to hear word from the mayors of the counties of Kauai, Maui and the Big Island when they will open to full capacity.

The Diocesan Covid-19 Task Force will be meeting soon and updated directives will be formally communicated to you in preparation for the second Sunday of Advent. Please do not make any changes to your processes or church capacity until the formal communication is provided.

Mahalo for your patience and cooperation as we navigate this changing environment.

Cash Bail Panel 1 of 2: TALK STORY WITH FORMERLY INCARCERATED FOLKS

On October 27, 2021, the *Transformative Justice Task Force* hosted a panel discussion on cash bail. This panel was moderated by *Kat Brady*, a long-time community justice advocate and coordinator of the *Community Alliance* on *Prisons* (CAP). The four panelists: *Sara Gaspar, Michael Gaspar, Kano'eauna'inoa "Na'i" Awo* and *Candy Matautia* shared their personal stories about how cash bail laws impacted them and their communities when they were previously incarcerated. Subject: UPDATED LITURGICAL DIRECTIVES FOR THE NEW LITURGICAL YEAR DURING THE TIME OF PANDEMIC

The following are the updated liturgical directives and reminders that impact all Catholic churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions in the Diocese of Honolulu during the time of pandemic effective the First Sunday of Advent, November 28, 2021.

<u>SINGING AT MASS</u>: Singing by both a choir and congregation is now allowed. Masks must be worn as a mitigation effort. Other mitigation measures (e.g., increased physical distancing and improved ventilation) should be considered and implemented.

HYMNALS AND OTHER PRINTED MATERIALS: All hymnals and missalettes may be returned to the pews and used. Pastors may choose to continue printing Worship Aids and/or project Music texts while following copyright/licensing guidelines. Printed bulletins and other materials may be handed out.

<u>COLLECTION BASKETS:</u> Collection baskets should not be passed from person to person, but people may place their offering in a basket in front of the altar or in a locked box as they enter the church. As an alternative, ushers may use collection baskets with handles or may pass through the aisles while holding the baskets.

Reminders from previous diocesan directives and/or protocols:

- Face coverings (masks or mask/face shields) will be worn at ALL times by all who participate at the Mass during the liturgical celebration. For those ministers with respiratory issues the use of a face shield instead of a face mask is highly recommended.
- The priests, deacons and anyone assisting in the distribution of Communion will sanitize their hands just before and just after distribution of Communion. If they feel their hands are contaminated during Communion, they may pause and sanitize their hands before resuming.
- Priests may administer the Anointing of the Sick and Viaticum, especially in situations where there is the danger of death. Priests, deacons and other duly commissioned extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion may take Communion to the homebound, always exercising proper hygiene procedure and wearing masks.
- Parishes may celebrate communal penance services and/or reinstate specified hours of reconciliation. Please observe good spacing between the penitent and priest, while at the same time observing absolute privacy for the penitent. Confessions by phone or via the internet are not permitted. Private confession is an essential element for ongoing conversion and growth in holiness. General absolution is not permitted and only be imparted under grave circumstance.
- Funerals in churches are allowed with the body of the deceased present if the mortuary is permitted to transport the body. The Funeral Mass or Funeral Liturgy outside of Mass may be at full capacity with 6' social distancing and the indoor mask mandate enforced.
- Churches may remain open during the day for private prayer at the discretion of the pastor and observing whatever guidelines he may establish.
- As an act of charity, anyone who is sick or who is particularly vulnerable to infection should not attend Mass at this time.
- We encourage parish priests to continue live-streaming their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information for their parish's Facebook and/or website. Daily and Sunday Mass are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. For a comprehensive and updated list please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org.

ONE MONDAY IN ADVENT

THE HISTORY OF THE ADVENT WREATH

By Rev. William Saunders, Catholic Education Resource Center, Potomac Falls, Virginia

The Advent wreath is part of our longstanding Catholic tradition. However, the actual origins are uncertain. There is evi-

dence of pre-Christian Germanic peoples using wreathes with lit candles during the cold and dark December days as a sign of hope in the future warm and extended-sunlight days of

By 1600, both Catholics and Lutherans had more formal practices surrounding the Advent wreath.

The symbolism of the Advent wreath is beautiful. The wreath is made of various evergreens, signifying continuous life. Even these evergreens have a traditional meaning which can be adapted to our faith: The laurel signifies victory over persecution and suffering; pine, holly, and yew, immortality; and cedar. strength and healing. Holly also has a special Christian symbolism: The prickly leaves remind us of the crown of thorns, and one English legend tells of how the cross was made of holly. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ. Any pine cones, nuts, or seedpods used to decorate the wreath also symbolize life and resurrection. All together, the wreath of evergreens depicts the immortality of our soul and the new, everlasting life promised to us through Christ, the eternal Word of the Father, who entered our world becoming true man and who was victorious over sin and death through His own passion, death, and resurrection.
