

#### Next Sunday's Reading Fifth Sunday of Lent

First Reading Isaiah 43:16-21

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 126:1-6

Second Reading Philippians 3:8-4 Gospel John 8:1-11

FOCUS: We have been reconciled to the Father through the Son.

We can rejoice in today's theme of God's forgiveness and mercy. He led the Israelites to the Promised Land; he has reconciled us to himself through Christ; and he is always ready to forgive, awaiting us with open arms to come and rest in his love.

First Reading: Joshua 5:9, 10-12

In the first reading, the Israelites celebrate Passover in Gilgal, feasting on the produce of the land.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

Saint Paul writes, whoever is in Christ is a new creation, for God has reconciled us to himself through Christ.

**Gospel:** Luke 15, 1-3, 11-32

In the Gospel, Jesus addresses a parable to the Pharisees and scribes. The parable is of a father and his two sons, the younger of whom squanders his inheritance but returns home to be welcomed by his father.

#### WORLDWIDE CONSECRATION OF RUSSIA AND UKRAINE TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

In light of the tragic invasion of Ukraine by Russia, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has declared to pray a Prayer of Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary at a Penance Service at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome at 5:00 p.m. Rome time, on Friday, March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation which is televised via EWTN channel or online. He is inviting all bishops and priests to do the same.

All priests are asked to pray the Prayer of Consecration at every Mass offered at the parishes on the Solemnity of the Annunciation (including anticipated Vigil Masses, if any). At OLM, aside from the Mass we recite it also at the Stations of the Cross. All parishioners are enjoined to participate in this worldwide prayer for peace. We are distributing copies so parishioners can bring them home and pray it individually or with their family or groups. We shall pray it again as a community in all the Masses this weekend.

In the apparition of 13 July 1917, in Fatima, Our Lady had asked for the consecration of Russia to Her Immaculate Heart, stating that if this request were not granted, Russia would spread "its errors throughout the world, promoting wars and persecution of the Church." "The good," she added, "will be martyred; the Holy Father will have much to suffer, various nations will be destroyed."

## Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary Basilica of Saint Peter 25 March 2022

O Mary, Mother of God and our Mother, in this time of trial we turn to you. As our Mother, you love us and know us: no concern of our hearts is hidden from you. Mother of mercy, how often we have experienced your watchful care and your peaceful presence! You never cease to guide us to Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

Yet we have strayed from that path of peace. We have forgotten the lesson learned from the tragedies of the last century, the sacrifice of the millions who fell in two world wars. We have disregarded the commitments we made as a community of nations. We have betrayed peoples' dreams of peace and the hopes of the young. We grew sick with greed, we thought only of our own nations and their interests, we grew indifferent and caught up in our selfish needs and concerns. We chose to ignore God, to be satisfied with our illusions, to grow arrogant and aggressive, to suppress innocent lives and to stockpile weapons. We stopped being our neighbour's keepers and stewards of our common home. We have ravaged the garden of the earth with war and by our sins we have broken the heart of our heavenly Father, who desires us to be brothers and sisters. We grew indifferent to everyone and everything except ourselves. Now with shame we cry out: Forgive us, Lord!

Holy Mother, amid the misery of our sinfulness, amid our struggles and weaknesses, amid the mystery of iniquity that is evil and war, you remind us that God never abandons us, but continues to look upon us with love, ever ready to forgive us and raise us up to new life. He has given you to us and made your Immaculate Heart a refuge for the Church and for all humanity. By God's gracious will, you are ever with us; even in the most troubled moments of our history, you are there to guide us with tender love.

We now turn to you and knock at the door of your heart. We are your beloved children. In every age you make yourself known to us, calling us to conversion. At this dark hour, help us and grant us your comfort. Say to us once more: "Am I not here, I who am your Mother?" You are able to untie the knots of our hearts and of our times. In you we place our trust. We are confident that, especially in moments of trial, you will not be deaf to our supplication and will come to our aid.

That is what you did at Cana in Galilee, when you interceded with Jesus and he worked the first of his signs. To preserve the joy of the wedding feast, you said to him: "They have no wine" (*Jn* 2:3). Now, O Mother, repeat those words and that prayer, for in our own day we have run out of the wine of hope, joy has fled, fraternity has faded. We have forgotten our humanity and squandered the gift of peace. We opened our hearts to violence and destructiveness. How greatly we need your maternal help!

Therefore, O Mother, hear our prayer.

Star of the Sea, do not let us be shipwrecked in the tempest of war.

Ark of the New Covenant, inspire projects and paths of reconciliation.

Queen of Heaven, restore God's peace to the world.

Eliminate hatred and the thirst for revenge, and teach us forgiveness.

Free us from war, protect our world from the menace of nuclear weapons.

Queen of the Rosary, make us realize our need to pray and to love.

Queen of the Human Family, show people the path of fraternity.

Queen of Peace, obtain peace for our world.

O Mother, may your sorrowful plea stir our hardened hearts. May the tears you shed for us make this valley parched by our hatred blossom anew. Amid the thunder of weapons, may your prayer turn our thoughts to peace. May your maternal touch soothe those who suffer and flee from the rain of bombs. May your motherly embrace comfort those forced to leave their homes and their native land. May your Sorrowful Heart move us to compassion and inspire us to open our doors and to care for our brothers and sisters who are injured and cast aside.

Holy Mother of God, as you stood beneath the cross, Jesus, seeing the disciple at your side, said: "Behold your son" (*Jn* 19:26). In this way he entrusted each of us to you. To the disciple, and to each of us, he said: "Behold, your Mother" (v. 27). Mother Mary, we now desire to welcome you into our lives and our history. At this hour, a weary and distraught humanity stands with you beneath the cross, needing to entrust itself to you and, through you, to consecrate itself to Christ. The people of Ukraine and Russia, who venerate you with great love, now turn to you, even as your heart beats with compassion for them and for all those peoples decimated by war, hunger, injustice and poverty.

Therefore, Mother of God and our Mother, to your Immaculate Heart we solemnly entrust and consecrate ourselves, the Church and all humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine. Accept this act that we carry out with confidence and love. Grant that war may end and peace spread throughout the world. The "Fiat" that arose from your heart opened the doors of history to the Prince of Peace. We trust that, through your heart, peace will dawn once more. To you we consecrate the future of the whole human family, the needs and expectations of every people, the anxieties and hopes of the world.

Through your intercession, may God's mercy be poured out on the earth and the gentle rhythm of peace return to mark our days. Our Lady of the "Fiat", on whom the Holy Spirit descended, restore among us the harmony that comes from God. May you, our "living fountain of hope", water the dryness of our hearts. In your womb Jesus took flesh; help us to foster the growth of communion. You once trod the streets of our world; lead us now on the paths of peace.



# STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS \*EMBRACING THE CROSS OF JESUS CHRIST

The Lenten season offers us a unique opportunity to focus more intently on the gift of the cross. Do you ever think about how you experience the cross of Jesus Christ? Do you ever think about the power of that cross in your daily life? Is the cross even relevant to your life? It is to stewards of the Lord, who recognize the hope Christ brings through the gift of his cross. They acknowledge that for them, the cross is their only hope. Being good stewards of our life in Christ is not easy, but to embrace the cross is not only countercultural, it seems absurd. Then again, we cannot avoid what Jesus said to his disciples: "If you wish to come after me you must deny yourself and take up your cross daily and follow me. For if you wish to save your life, you will lose it; but if you lose your life for my sake you will save it" (Luke 9:23-24).



The cross is more readily embraced by people of faith who suffer, are poor, broken, or are the victims of such things as violence, oppression or natural disasters. They see the cross as the hope that no matter what has happened to them, God will see them through. The Father did it for Jesus who hung on the cross, so surely their sufferings will be redeemed by Jesus' sufferings.

Where people possess much material abundance, comfort and leisure, however, there is a tendency to deemphasize the cross, to draw away from it. They can't touch it or feel it so they wish to "save" their lives by looking to other things: power, wealth, fame, relevance, being the center of attention. What is preached about the cross from the pulpit sounds good, but in reality something more tangible is desired.

Christ emptied himself completely in humble obedience, allowing himself to suffer and die out of compassion for the world (Philippians 2:6-11). Good stewards follow his example and work day-to-day to empty themselves and live compassionately; most noticeably by sharing their lives with others.

As we approach the climax of our liturgical year, the Easter triduum, let us ask the Holy Spirit for an even deeper awareness of the cross in our lives. Let us find hope in the cross and pray that as we embrace it, we too will experience in a special way the joy of new life in the risen Lord.



## FÄITH ÄCTION BILLS STILL ALIVE, MIDPOINT OF LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The state legislature has completed the crossover of bills that survived one house and now will be considered by the other house. Faith Action has supported the following bills through testimonies and phone calls. As of this date, March 21, 2022, they are still alive.

\*Transformative Justice Task Force (TJTF): Co-chairs Lee Curran, Kylie Akiona

House Bill 1567 on cash bail eliminates the use of monetary bail for certain nonviolent offenses and requires defendants to be released on their own recognizance until appearing in court. Currently, those who cannot afford the bail (the poor) are jailed. They cannot work or take care of family-- and the downward spiral for that family begins. "We recognize that cash bail doesn't create true safety for the community. We are incarcerating thousands of folks who have not been convicted of a crime at the expense of community well-being and millions of tax dollars a year," says Lee. \*HousingNOW! Task Force: Chair Calvin Foo Pham

Many housing bills are still alive. FA has given testimony in support of HB 1752 HD3 which creates incentives for reluctant landlords to accept low-income renters who qualify for federal Section 8 vouchers that help with the rent. The incentives include cash for repair costs that exceed security deposit. It also gives landlords one month rent reimbursement when a unit transitions to a new Section 8 renter and also when an incoming Section 8 renter takes over a leaving Section 8 renter's unit. "The 'carrot' is a positive approach that may, over time, eliminate stigma (of Section 8) among property owners," says Foo. However, he stresses more work is needed in the bill "that would include language preventing discrimination by source of income," thereby opening opportunity for low-income families to find a home.

\*Environmental Justice Task Force (EJTF): Chair Susan Gorman-Chang

The Carbon Cashback House Bill 2278 aims to help in reaching Hawaii's goal of being carbon neutral by 2045. 1) A fee is placed on fossil fuel coming into Hawaii to reduce its consumption; 2) This leads to reduced greenhouse gas emissions. 3) Money collected from the fee is given to Hawaii's residents in equal shares. The Tax Review Commission set up by the governor had recommended this tax; the University of Hawaii Economic Research Organization (UHERO) study shows that this tax benefits families of all levels of income, especially those at the lowest. Susan says, "Mahalo for EVERYONE's support of HB 2278 and everyone's hard work crafting, meeting, educating, advocating and everything we all did to get it this far!"


