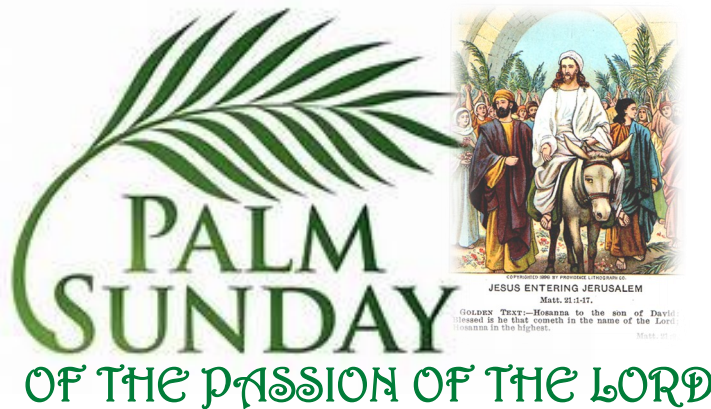

The liturgy of **Holy Week** that begins on **Palm Sunday** highlights the passion and death of the Lord Jesus. Jesus' life and death shows how far God goes to establish "a covenant of peace" that would set us free to love God in return and to share in his divine life of holiness.

On **Palm Sunday** we bless and process with palms as symbols of our welcome and praise for Jesus as the messianic king, the king for all humanity and for all ages who won victory on the cross over sin and death,

On Holy Tuesday, the **Chrism Mass** is celebrated at the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa. It is properly concelebrated by the Bishop with his clergy who will make their renewal of priestly promises. It is a sign of the unity and communion of the priests with their Bishop. The holy oils for baptism, confirmation and anointing of the sick will also be blessed. The parish delegates will bring them to their respective churches for presentation to the community on Holy Thursday.

The *Paschal Triduum* begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on **Holy Thursday**. And ends with the conclusion of Vespers on Easter Sunday. Jesus gathered with his disciples for the Last Supper. It was at this Supper that the foot-washing was done. The Lord gave them a model of serving others by washing their feet, then took the bread and wine that he pronounced as his Body and Blood to be shared and repeated until he comes again. This was the moment of the institution of the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. The washing of feet is not just a dramatic reenactment but as a full, sacramental ritual in joyful obedience to the Lord's command to do as he did. To partake at the eucharistic table is to be willing to bend down in humble service. Here the sacrament of Holy Orders was likewise instituted that the memory of the first eucharist may continue to be celebrated and the mission to preach the good news (*kerygma*), to serve (*diakonia*) and to gather in worship (*koinonia*) may be carried out.

Our communal Lenten almsgiving program thru the *CRS Rice Bowl collection* is made tonight as well as the solemn presentation of the holy oils for baptism, confirmation, and for the sick, These are followed by the solemn transfer of the Eucharist to the prepared place of adoration where all parishioners are invited to make a solemn night vigil of the passion and death of the Lord, The various parish councils, committees, ministries and organizations serve as the lead groups.

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Easter Sunday

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles
10:34, 37-43

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-24

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 5:6-8

Gospel:

John 20:1-9

FOCUS: Stay close to Jesus, trusting God, at the foot of the cross.

The passion of Christ reveals God's heart in concrete reality. We must step into this narrative. We want to be Simon who aided Jesus in time of need. We are Barabbas – deserving death – granted life and freedom. As Christians, our hearts are made for God – we are invited to remember the events of Palm Sunday and be present with Jesus during his passion.

First Reading: *Isaiah 50:4-7*

The prophet Isaiah foretells God's servant who hears and speaks his word and does not turn back from suffering.

Second Reading: *Philippians 2:6-11*

Paul writes to the Philippians, praising Jesus, who humbled himself and was exalted by God.

Gospel: *Luke 22:14-23:56*

In the Gospel, Jesus shares a Passover supper with his disciples, where he gives them bread and wine – which is his body and blood – to eat and drink. Afterward, he prays at the Mount of Olives and then is betrayed, tried, and crucified.

The **Good Friday** celebration is part of the single, three day-long liturgy of the Triduum that is why it has no introductory rites and dismissal. The ministers prostrate and everyone makes a reverent kneeling for a period of total silence then proceed with the liturgy of the Word of God, the Passion narrative and Solemn Intercessions, veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. This is a day of fasting and abstinence and the collection is for the Holy Land.

The **Easter Vigil** on Holy Saturday is the "night of all nights." It begins with darkness everywhere and the assembly is made to settle into the sacred darkness. Then comes the blessing of a real fire, a real beeswax candle and procession with real candles until the *Exsultet* or the proclamation of Easter. We welcome back the "Gloria", the grand "Alleluia" and the ringing of church bells. The environment is made festive with Easter lilies and blooming flowers of spring. The Liturgy of the Word excludes minimalism for it includes more than the usual two readings and is meant to take time with the chanting of the responses. There is a blessing of baptismal water, the celebration of the initiation sacraments and the renewal of baptismal promises. The dismissal takes on a double alleluia throughout the Easter octave.

The **Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord** is the climax of the dramatic actions of the *Triduum* with the first reports of the miraculous news of the risen Lord. Our Savior has conquered death and been raised to new life. Since we are all baptized into his death, we are all raised to new life in him. In that newness of life, we celebrate and sing our joy and thanksgiving – *Christ is risen! He is alive! Alleluia!*

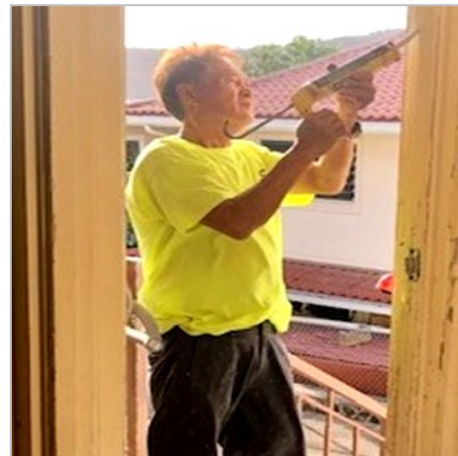
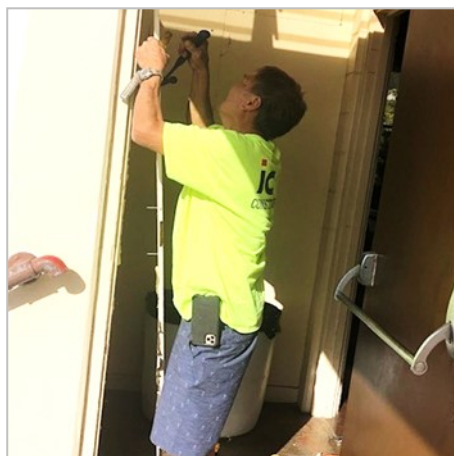

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

*PUT YOUR PRAYER INTO ACTION THRU ALMSGIVING

As our Lenten journey brings us closer to Easter, let's be mindful of those ancient and time-tested exercises that help us renew our lives and bring us closer to God. The traditional practices include: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Lent, of course, is a privileged period for prayer and many spiritual writers have encouraged us to see fasting and almsgiving as essential elements of our prayer lives. St Augustine wrote that fasting and almsgiving are "the two wings of prayer" and that almsgiving is actually putting our prayer into action.

Of course, much attention is paid to prayer and fasting. But almsgiving gets the least attention among the three Lenten practices. Almsgiving can actually be viewed as "fasting" from our income and material possessions. It also brings us closer to Christ Jesus because it translates our prayers into acts of love for each other and for those less fortunate.

The New Testament reveals how the early Christians embraced the practice of almsgiving. For Saint Luke, almsgiving was essential to the practice of good stewardship. St. James exhorts Christians to care for the needs of their brothers or sisters, to put their faith into action with alms to those in need: *If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and in lack of daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, be warmed and filled,' without giving them the things needed for the body, what does it profit? So faith, by itself, if it has no works, is dead* (James 2:15-17).

Almsgiving is about showing our love through sharing rather than hoarding what we have and Lent is perhaps one of the best times of the year to prayerfully discern how best we can act with generosity toward others. We might even try creating an Almsgiving Plan to help us prayerfully discern how best to organize our giving. Take some quiet moments to prayerfully reflect on what you have to share and write down a giving plan that includes your parish, diocese, and charities that could use your financial support.

Easter is almost upon us. Let us act now to integrate almsgiving into our life of faith. By putting our prayer into action in this way, we begin to "cast off" the old self within us and put on Christ in order to arrive at Easter renewed and able to say, with St. Paul: *"It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me."*

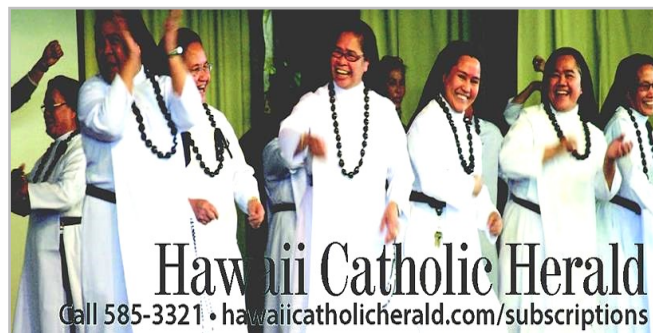

In your womb Jesus took flesh; help us to foster the growth of communion. You once trod the streets of our world; lead us now on the paths of peace. Amen.”

**EVENT RECAP: PRAYERS FOR KAPUKAKI**

Prayer is a powerful tool for connection and growth. Praying can help us deal with our anxieties and emotions and creates a space for us to change what we can, and often to find hope in the darkest times. Prayer can also help us with overwhelming situations, such as the current water contamination crisis at Red Hill.

In the early morning hours of March 22nd, Faith Action began its observance of World Water Day with “Prayers for Kapukaki,” a 20-hour prayer service for the permanent shut down and safe defueling of the tanks at *Kapūkakī* (Red Hill). The event was held virtually and ran continuously from 4 am–12 midnight.

Over 20 faith leaders from diverse spiritual traditions volunteered to lead attendees in a time of intention and prayer centered on the sacredness of water. Some leaders chose to share thought-provoking readings and meditations, while others opted to sing, recite poems, or show video clips. Prayer leaders also provided regular opportunities for attendees to share their own thoughts, feelings, and reflections.

Despite the ranging styles of prayer and worship, salient universal themes persisted throughout the day. First, water is essential to life. Second, protecting water is a sacred act. Finally, as people of faith, it is our sacred duty to protect our most precious resource for present and future generations. These three themes converged to create a beautiful rendering of the power of prayer, evidenced by the notable increase in rain every day since the event!

*By contract, KOFC can only settle with the spouse’s estate even if the couple has surviving children;

*If the spouse has an annuity, KOFC can be instructed to “settle” by using the spouse’s annuity to receive the death benefit. *This avoids the Letters of Testamentary that is normally required (this is issued by a Judge overseeing the spouse’s estate); as you can surmise, anytime you need a court judgement, you need a lawyer so there may be legal fees.

*(What’s theorized above DOES NOT apply to a Single Premium Immediate Annuity aka SPIA...SPIA’s are set up with a single premium up front; after that, no other premiums are accepted. However, there’s no limit to the number of annuities a Brother/his spouse may have.)

LESSON LEARNED: If you DON’T have a Flexible Premium Annuity **START ONE today!**

Annuities have also been used to pay life insurance premiums; as your investment grows, you access that growth to pay for your insurance. Finally, KOFC has set up a charitable annuity product where a Brother Knight can start the annuity and anyone can contribute to the annuity where the beneficiary could be a parish or school and donors receive tax benefits for their contributions. The parish/school DOES NOT need the Brother Knight to pass before they start receiving the benefits from the annuity. KOFC is pretty flexible so let me know if you have any questions.
