Next Sunday's Reading Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

First Reading
Isaiah 50:4-7

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 22:8-9, 17-20, 23-24

Second Reading
Philippians 2:6-11

Passion
Luke 22:14-23:56

FOCUS: Jesus, who is love and mercy, heals and forgives.

Jesus reveals the heart of the Father, who is love. Although we turn away from him, God does not choose to condemn or turn away from us. Instead, he offers to pay our debt, to take our sins to the cross. He comes to cleanse and heal us and give us a share in his life.

First Reading: *Isaiah 43:16-21*

In the first reading from Isaiah, the Lord says to remember not the things of old, for he is doing a new thing.

Second Reading: *Philippians 3:8-4*

In Paul's Letter to the Philippians, he proclaims that he does not have righteousness because of his own doing but rather only in Christ.

Gospel: *John 8:1-11*

In the Gospel, the scribes and Pharisees test Jesus by bringing a woman who had been caught in adultery. Jesus tells them that the one without sin can cast the first stone.

Thank you very much for your teamwork, support, and contributions to the 'Ohana in Christ Annual Appeal. Total funds received now exceed \$735,000 from thousands of donors.

Congratulations to the 15 parishes that have met/exceeded their target goal – including the most recent: St. Ann, Waihee.

OLM so far has collected \$17,338.00 from 65 donor -parishioners. It is 170% of the designated goal of \$10,201.00.

OFFICE FOR SOCIAL MINISTRY**TALK STORY:****ACT OF CONSECRATION TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY**03/30/2022 by [Hawaii Catholic Herald](#)

As death and destruction continue to rise in the Russian-Ukraine war, our Holy Father is imploring Our Lady, the Immaculate Heart of Mary, for an end to the violence. On the Solemnity of the Annunciation, March 25, *Pope Francis* urged Catholics worldwide to join in a prayer of solidarity and consecrated the whole human family (particularly Russia and Ukraine) to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. *Bishop Larry Silva* also led the Act of Consecration that day during the noon Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of Our Lady of Peace in Honolulu and encouraged all in the diocese to do the same at home with their families.

“Mother of God and our Mother, to your Immaculate Heart we solemnly entrust and consecrate ourselves, the Church and all humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine. Accept this act that we carry out with confidence and love. Grant that war may end and peace spread throughout the world. The ‘Fiat’ that arose from your heart opened the doors of history to the Prince of Peace. We trust that, through your heart, peace will dawn once more. To you we consecrate the future of the whole human family, the needs and expectations of every people, the anxieties and hopes of the world.” (*Pope Francis “Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary,” St. Peter’s Basilica, March 25, 2022*)

The Act of Consecration passionately appeals to our Mother Mary saying: *“May your maternal touch soothe those who suffer and flee from the rain of bombs. May your motherly embrace comfort those forced to leave their homes and their native land. May your Sorrowful Heart move us to compassion and inspire us to open our doors and to care for our brothers and sisters who are injured and cast aside.”*

More than 10 million persons in Ukraine have been forced to leave their homes and flee as refugees. Most are women and children. Many are now orphans. Special papal envoy for peace, *Cardinal Michael Czerny*, was recently at the Ukraine border and shared these heart-wrenching reflections of what he observed firsthand: *“I saw the war ... I saw it in the eyes of the women, men and children I’ve met: uprooted, lost people, who carry everything they have left in a backpack or a shopping bag. They breathe and walk, but one can say that they have ‘lost their lives,’ or rather that the war has taken that away, and they have not yet begun to build a new one. The majority of refugees are women and children, and for them, there is the added threat of trafficking.”*

Yet even through the pain and suffering, *Cardinal Czerny* has also witnessed acts of kindness by strangers, and is optimistic that hope is still alive: *“I saw many people engaged in the peacemaking, approaching the refugees. It is a true army of peace that has mobilized for the initiatives of reception and solidarity, at many different levels. I have seen a Europe capable of putting aside closures and fears, capable of opening doors and borders, instead of building walls and fences. I have seen Europeans capable of behaving again like the Good Samaritan, loading into cars and buses strangers found ‘half-dead’ along the roads leading to the border. In a nutshell, I saw (the encyclical) ‘Fratelli tutti’ in action, in people’s hands and faces, in their actions and words.”*

Let us all continue to pray to Our Mother Mary with these concluding words of the Act of Consecration: *“Through your intercession, may God’s mercy be poured out on the earth and the gentle rhythm of peace return to mark our days. Our Lady of the ‘Fiat,’ on whom the Holy Spirit descended, restore among us the harmony that comes from God. May you, our ‘living fountain of hope,’ water the dryness of our hearts. In your womb Jesus took flesh; help us to foster the growth of communion. You once trod the streets of our world; lead us now on the paths of peace. Amen.”*

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

*SPIRITUAL HOUSECLEANING IS GOOD STEWARDSHIP

Spring housecleaning used to be a solemn ritual in many families. Dedicated homemakers took down heavy winter drapes and replaced them with summer's lighter fabric. Bedding was washed and aired on backyard clothes-lines, storm windows lined up against the house for a thorough wash. This time of year, our grandmothers removed and cleaned everything from cupboards and closets. Today, with most adults working outside the home, and schedules filled to overflowing, cleaning can sometimes be more piecemeal, catch-as-catch-can.

Nevertheless, this season often brings out the latent spring housecleaner in all of us. Who hasn't taken notice, suddenly, of late afternoon's brilliant sunshine highlighting windows streaked with winter's grime, or spotted a previously hidden layer of dust peeking out from the beneath the stove on a sun-splashed morning? The growing light and warmth makes us instinctively want to get busy.

In a sense, that's what Lent was all about. For many of us, *Ash Wednesday* was deep in the heart of a cold and snow-packed winter. But as we journeyed through the season, we saw glimmers of a far-off spring, even as we dug out from the latest storm. Light returned, and Lent reminded Christian stewards of our yearning to clean the house of our interior lives - our souls. Gradually, we saw illuminated the cobwebs in our own hearts.

Times of silence, prayer, fasting and giving move us with gratitude into the beautiful liturgies of the *Easter Triduum*. Yet, sometimes a nagging feeling troubles us. Did our efforts match our *Ash Wednesday* resolve? Did we do "enough"?

If you're troubled by this question, take heart. After all, if you thought your Lent was perfect, you might be like the Pharisee Jesus spoke of in his parable of the "Pharisee and the Tax Collector" – smug and self-satisfied. "I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity . . ." (Luke 18:11). Instead, we come before the Lord at a glorious Easter liturgy like the tax collector ". . . be merciful to me a sinner." The Christian steward spends a lifetime asking, "How can I do more?" As light streams through our windows and chases away the shadows, let the Light of Christ continue to illuminate the dark spots in your own spiritual life, but rejoice in the forgiving God who has conquered all darkness for us.

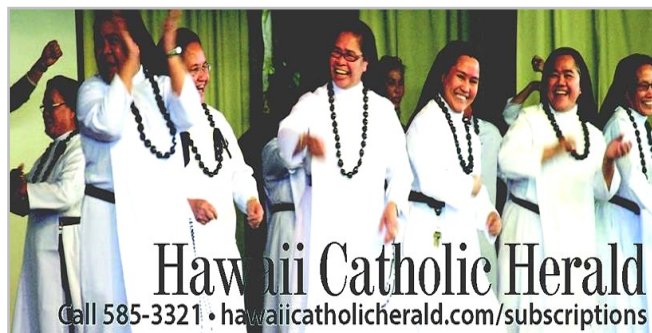

FAITH LEADERS SUPPORT CHANGES TO CASH BAIL SYSTEM (HB 1567)

When a person is arrested in Hawai'i, a judge sets a cash bail amount that person has to pay. The idea is to ensure that person shows up to court. If that person has money, they get to go home. They are allowed to continue to work, pay bills, and be present with their families. If that person does not have money, they go to jail. They are punished because they don't have money. Only the poor are punished.

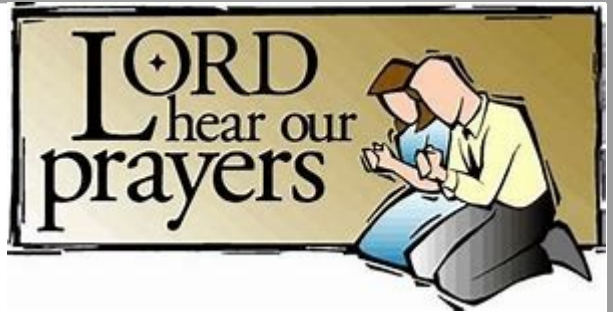
Let us all remember that all of this punishment happens before someone is even proven guilty. All the person lacks to avoid these penalties is the cash to be free.

The changes to the cash (some use the word "caste") bail system being proposed in HB 1567 would allow low-level, nonviolent offenders to remain employed and in their homes. Our faiths urge us to call upon lawmakers to act and pass these reforms. Our hope urges us to call upon all of us to let our legislators know that our values in Hawai'i demand these changes. Perhaps most importantly, our logic shows us that this system is painfully, woefully, and very recently broken.

When did this treatment of the poor become normal? The answer of time and of wisdom tells us it is not normal, and it never should be. We might not be able to pinpoint the exact moment this injustice started, but we know that we can end it now.
