

Next Sunday's Reading Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
1 Kings 19:16, 19-21

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 16:1-2, 5, 7-11

Second Reading
Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Gospel:
Luke 9:51-62

FOCUS: Here in the great mystery of the Eucharist, Christ fulfills his promise to be with his people always. Today we profess and acknowledge the Eucharist as the source and summit of our faith. Here, under the appearance of bread and wine, Christ's body and blood are broken and shared, and we celebrate Christ's enduring presence with us. Here we encounter his compassionate love and healing, and here we are strengthened and nourished to live the Gospel.

First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20

In this First Reading, Melchizedek – *a priest of God Most High* – brings bread and wine to Abram and blesses him.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Paul writes to the Corinthians, telling them what he received from the Lord: that the Lord offered his body and blood to his disciples. Paul says, *as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes.*

Gospel: Luke 9:11-17

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks to the crowds about God's kingdom and heals all who need healing. He then feeds them (about five thousand in number), using five loaves and two fish.

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

*WANTED: POSITIVE MALE ROLE MODELS

Father's Day reminds us that fathers are a tremendous source of love, strength and protection for a child. Notwithstanding the faithful and heroic efforts of single moms bringing up children in today's society, children still need to be around Christian men who are positive role models; men who are actively involved in their life of faith, possess spiritual passion, and are faithful fathers and husbands. Undoubtedly, parishes need more men to be involved in the spiritual development of young people.

Males bring a unique contribution that cannot be successfully substituted by females. Only men can serve as male role models and communicate the model of God as a loving father to children.

In today's society, for a number of reasons, many children grow up in single-parent homes, nurtured by their mothers. The parish or school may be the only place where these children have an opportunity to interact with men who model the loving, caring, and nurturing values of Christian manhood. Children can benefit from having a positive and responsible male role model in their lives.

It is said of young males that they are naturally more attentive to men when being taught good manners and respect for others. Men are generally better able to get young males unhooked from video games and involved in athletic competitions and outdoor activities so they can experience a wider world, and do things that are physically demanding; thus realizing a host of virtues. Adolescent males appear to develop emotional literacy, social skills, and Christian values more readily from men. And the presence of a Christian man helps reduce the possibility of a young male becoming disaffected, socially isolated, and more prone to embracing at-risk behaviors.

Of course, much of the above can be said for the importance of men in the lives of young women as well. But men can offer a unique Christian witness to young women in a culture that is so focused on young females as sex objects. It is important for girls to experience positive male role models; Christian men who see young women as children of God and are interested in what they say, think and feel as they grow in their spiritual lives.

Young people need both male and female role models. But adult males are fewer to be found. Let Father's Day remind us to find ways to connect with fathers and invite other positive male role models into the faith formation of our young people. Let's encourage men to get more involved in the parish as mentors, tutors, catechists and other ministries. Let's help young people see first-hand how Christian men follow Jesus Christ and live as his disciples in today's world.

The day was first recognized as a federal holiday in June 2021, when President Joe Biden signed the **Juneteenth National Independence Day Act** into law.

FIRST 'OHANA IN CHRIST FUNDRAISER ENTERING FINAL STRETCH AT 75% OF GOAL

'Ohana in Christ, the Diocese of Honolulu's parish-based fundraising campaign, entered its final month of its first year at 75% of goal, according to *Mark Clark*, the diocesan director of stewardship and development.

As of May 31, the diocese had received \$845,000 of its \$1.125 million target. The campaign ends June 30.

The campaign replaced the *Bishop's Circle*, which collected primarily from individuals, to one that gave each of Hawaii's 66 parishes an assigned goal of 25% of its annual "assessment" — the "tax" it pays yearly to the diocese to help cover diocesan operations.

Twenty-two parishes have already met their goals, said Clark, whose office is coordinating the campaign.

Our Lady of the Mount Church so far has collected and submitted \$18,913.00 from 67 donor-parishioners. It is 185% of the designated goal of \$10,201.00.

PROJECT TV SCREENS IN CHURCH

Our project of putting up TV screens inside the church for projecting the liturgical hymns, readings and prayers as well as for showing video clips and presentations during liturgical gatherings and celebrations is slowly being realized. The two 75-inch units are already mounted. The next ones to be put up are the sound bars and the camera for livestreaming. It is hoped that this will help enhance the active participation of the faithful. When we had the trial run last Sunday we realize that the image of the Resurrected Christ in the sanctuary is not blocked anymore as when the rolled down screen was in use.

When we made the appeal for voluntary donations to help fund this project, we got immediate response. Whatever amount given, (and nothing is too small), goes into this worthy project and we do appreciate your generous support.




ILLUSTRATION OF THE INSTALLED TV SCREENS IN CHURCH

❖REPAIR & MAINTENANCE

*****CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS** – The termite-ridden and weather-worn doors in the Church, sacristy and in the parish hall have been replaced. Knight of Columbus and parishioner *Vicente Velasco* together with his son and another carpenter worked on the project for free. The materials used were purchased with the donations and stewardship offerings of parishioners as well as from the remaining unspent proceeds of the Save the Convent fundraising. We are grateful for everyone's support and generous assistance.

*The parish purchased a new lawn tractor (*John Deere S100 17.5 HP Gas*) for use in the upkeep of the cemetery grounds located in the interior of Kalihi Valley. The total cost which included a 3-year warranty was \$2,563.35. The payment came from the donations and stewardship offerings of OLM parishioners. Big *mahalo* to everyone for being good stewards.

❖**CHURCH ENVIRONMENT** – Volunteer parishioners come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the weekend Masses. They spruce up the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other cleaning tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. During the time of the covid-19 pandemic, in compliance with the Diocese and government advisory they marked the seating in the pews and communion line for 6-ft distancing as well as place sanitizers for use by the mass-goers and disinfect the church. 




