





#### Next Sunday's Reading

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading Isaiah 66:10-14

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 66:1-7, 16, 20

**Second Reading** 

Gospel:

Galatians 6:14-18 Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

<u>FOCUS</u>: Jesus makes clear that there is an urgency in leaving the things of the world behind to follow him. Jesus calls each of us to give up the things of the world, to repent of our sins, and to follow him no matter the cost. He does not violate our freedom, however; he allows us to choose whether we will stay where we are or follow the way of the cross, which ultimately leads to everlasting life.

**First Reading:** 1 Kings 19:16, 19-21

In the first reading, Elijah passes Elisha and casts his mantle on him. Elisha asks if he may go home and kiss his parents goodbye.

**Second Reading:** *Galatians 5:1, 13-18* 

In the second reading, Paul writes that Christ set us free from slavery, and explains that freedom comes through the greatest commandment – to love.

**Gospel**: *Luke* 9:51-62


In the Gospel, Jesus tells a man who wishes to follow him that the kingdom of God requires following him in that very moment.

#### STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

#### \*JESUS IS THE TREASURE WE SEEK

Stewardship leaders know that forming people to share their many gifts includes stewardship of financial and material resources. Treasure. We cannot run away from this dimension of the stewardship way of life, and in fact, it is a necessary component of comprehensive stewardship formation. The U.S. bishops' pastoral letter, Stewardship: A Disciple's Response, captures this poignantly: "But a person can say no to Christ. Consider the wealthy and good young man who approaches Jesus asking how to lead an even



Teaching people to be good stewards of their money and possessions is a great gift to them and to our faith communities. When our people develop the ability to separate wants from needs, to see money as a blessing, and to understand that their giving is an expression of their faith and trust in God, they benefit, as does the parish and diocese. Of course, many immediately equate the word "stewardship" with requests for financial giving. Here, we draw on the wisdom of the pastoral letter. Immediately following the reference to attachment to possessions, we are asked to reflect again on Christ's call: "Becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ leads naturally to the practice of stewardship. These linked realities, discipleship and stewardship, then make up the fabric of a Christian life in which each day is lived in an intimate, personal relationship with the Lord" (Stewardship, p. 14).

Stewardship as a spiritual way of life is, in this regard, very incarnational. We recognize that our temporal lives, including the ways in which we use money and possessions, is an expression of our spiritual life. It is not uncommon for people to say, "Father always talks about money." We know this is not precisely true. Father does sometimes talk about money, because Jesus did! Jesus talked about money because he knew that the ways in which people steward their treasure is, in fact, a barometer of their spiritual lives. It is a sign of what they treasure. "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also," (Luke 12:34). Jesus is the treasure we seek, and stewardship forms our hearts in this search.

### THE 2021-2022 APPEAL FOR THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN HAWAII \*LAST CALL\*

#### FIRST 'OHANA IN CHRIST FUNDRAISER ENTERING FINAL STRETCH AT 75% OF GOAL

'Ohana in Christ, the Diocese of Honolulu's parish-based fundraising campaign, entered its final month of its first year at 75% of goal, according to *Mark Clark*, the diocesan director of stewardship and development.

As of May 31, the diocese had received \$845,000 of its \$1.125 million target. The campaign ends June 30.

The campaign replaced the *Bishop's Circle*, which collected primarily from individuals, to one that gave each of Hawaii's 66 parishes an assigned goal of 25% of its annual "assessment" — the "tax" it pays yearly to the diocese to help cover diocesan operations.

Twenty-two parishes have already met their goals, said Clark, whose office is coordinating the campaign.

**Our Lady of the Mount Church** so far has collected and submitted \$18,913.00 from 67 donor-parishioners. It is 185% of the designated goal of \$10,201.00.

#### PROJECT TV SCREENS IN CHURCH

Our project of putting up TV screens inside the church for projecting the liturgical hymns, readings and prayers as well as for showing video clips and presentations during liturgical gatherings and celebrations is done. The two 75-inch units are already mounted. The sound bars, camera for livestreaming, wifi synchronizers and dedicated power outlets are in place. It is hoped that the screens will help enhance the active participation of the faithful. It also eliminates the issue of blocking the image of the Resurrected Christ in the sanctuary when the old screen is rolled down screen.

Our appeal for voluntary donations to help fund this project was met with immediate response. Whatever amount given, (and nothing is too small), goes into this worthy project and we do appreciate your generous support.

The 2 TV screens are mounted onto the current banner walls. They sit at an angle that can be viewed by either side of the aisle. The banners will either be hanged in the same area or moved close to the Cross with the Resurrected Christ on the wall in the sanctuary.




