

# Pastor's Corner



### **Next Sunday's Reading** The Most Holy Trinity

First Reading Proverbs 8:22-31 Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 8:4-9

Second Reading

Gospel: John 16:12-15

Romans 5:1-5 By Rev. Fr. Edgar B. Brillantes

FOCUS: Today is Pentecost, the birthday of the Church, honoring the coming of the Spirit into our midst.

The early Church was expanded when the resurrected Jesus left his disciples, promising to send the Holy Spirit to be with them on earth. Empowered by his presence among them, they began preaching the word even though they faced many challenges. The people listened and were baptized, and the Church was born.

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

In the first reading, the Apostles are filled with the Holy Spirit and begin speaking in different languages.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

Paul writes to the Corinthians that there is only one Spirit, but he bestows many spiritual gifts on the family of God.

Gospel: John 20:19-23

In the Gospel, Jesus comes to the disciples in the locked room, offers them peace, and breathes on them, saying, receive the Holy Spirit.

### PROJECT TV SCREENS IN CHURCH

We are putting up two 75" TV screens inside the church for projecting the liturgical hymns, readings and prayers as well as pertinent occasional video clips and presentations during liturgical gatherings and celebrations. They are also used for livestreaming. It is hoped that this will help enhance the active participation of the faithful. ### **❖REPAIR & MAINTENANCE**

\*\*\*CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS — The termite-ridden and weather-worn doors in the Church, sacristy and in the parish hall have been replaced. Knight of Columbus and parishioner *Vicente Velasco* together with his son and another carpenter worked on the project for free. The materials used were purchased with the donations and stewardship offerings of parishioners as well as from the remaining unspent proceeds of the Save the Convent fundraising. We are grateful for everyone's support and generous assistance.

\*The parish purchased a new lawn tractor (*John Deere S100 17.5 HP Gas*) for use in the upkeep of the cemetery grounds located in the interior of Kalihi Valley. The total cost which included a 3-year warranty was \$2,563.35. The payment came from the donations and stewardship offerings of OLM parishioners. Big *mahalo* to everyone for being good stewards.

**❖ CHURCH ENVIRONMENT** — Volunteer parishioners come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the weekend Masses. They spruce up the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other cleaning tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. During the time of the covid-19 pandemic, in compliance with the Diocese and government advisory they marked the seating in the pews and communion line for 6-ft distancing as well as place sanitizers for use by the mass-goers and disinfect the church. ### STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS \*STEWARDS OF THE EASTER SEASON



Christ is risen! Indeed, He is risen! If you're thinking this greeting comes a little late, since Easter Sunday was April 17, think again. As Catholic Christians, we celebrate the Easter season for seven weeks, until the fires of Pentecost once again inflame our hearts on June 5. Indeed, how could we not continue to celebrate this event that has changed everything for us?

It's easy to slip into a cultural way of thinking about our great feasts. Many people have the Christmas tree taken down at the end of New Year's Day, rather than waiting for Epiphany. Likewise, most of us have long ago put the Easter decorations away.

But the Christian steward is aware of the beauty and meaning of the seasons in the liturgical calendar. The Easter season remains a special time for recommitment to the Lord. One word

for this period is "mystagogia," and those who were newly baptized at the Great Easter Vigil are especially familiar with this term. It literally means that we delve more deeply into the mystery of our faith. But exploring this mystery is not just an endeavor for new Christians. As we prepare for Pentecost, we prayerfully examine what the Resurrection means in our own lives.

For Christian stewards, it's a time to reevaluate how faith in the Risen Lord informs every aspect of our lives – how we labor, how we play, the way we pray, how we allocate our resources, where we spend our time, how we love, how we extend our compassion to others. If Christ is truly risen – an astounding and life-altering belief – then this Easter time brings immense joy and a continuing desire to know the Risen Lord.

The Scripture readings of the season are especially helpful. We hear once again the stories of the appearances of Jesus to his friends; how often they failed, initially, to recognize him in his glory. The Acts of the Apostles tell us of the struggles and the excitement of the new community of believers.

We spent forty days in the penitential season of Lent. Now, we are embarked on fifty days of joyous celebration. Let us experience this joy throughout the Easter season, so that when we celebrate Pentecost, we may truly find our hearts on fire with the Holy Spirit.

Special kudos to the 22 parishes that have met/exceeded their target goal – including the most recent: Our Lady Queen of Angels, Kula \* St. Rita, Haiku \* St. Roch, Kahuku \* St. Theresa, Kekaha - St. Theresa, Kihei.

**Our Lady of the Mount Church** so far has collected and submitted \$18,913.00 from 67 donor-parishioners. It is 185% of the designated goal of \$10,201.00.
