and realize your gracious presence all around us:

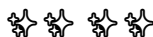
in nature, in other people, in ourselves.

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Genesis 18:20-32

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 138:1-3, 6-8

Second Reading
Colossians 2:12-14

Gospel:
Luke 11:1-13

FOCUS: The Lord wants us to live unburdened, free to be close to his healing presence.

Much of modern-day life involves the busyness of everyday tasks. The Lord asks that we simply come to him and allow ourselves to be healed and made whole, to allow him to pour his grace into our hearts and lives. This requires us to pause and to go to him in silence and stillness.

First Reading: *Genesis 18:1-10*

Abraham and Sarah provide hospitality to three men who appear nearby his tent. One of the men tells Abraham that when he comes again in a year, Sarah will have a son.

Second Reading: *Colossians 1:24-28*

Paul writes to the Colossians that he rejoices in his sufferings and joins them with the sufferings of Christ on behalf of the Church.

Gospel: *Luke 10:38-42*

In the Gospel, Jesus enters a village where two sisters attend to him. Martha is burdened, anxious, and worried as she tries to complete tasks; Mary sits at the Lord's feet and listens to him. Jesus says Mary has chosen the better part.

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

INVOLVING YOUNG PEOPLE IN SACRED LITURGY IS GOOD STEWARDSHIP



Now that your teen or college age young adult has received the sacrament of Confirmation, isn't it time to get them more deeply involved in the Mass? It is no secret that one of the best ways for a young person to nurture a greater love for the Eucharist is by a more active participation in the liturgy.

The National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry has sought for many years to encourage greater participation by young people in the Mass. A publication from the Federation, *From Age to Age: The Challenge of Worship with Adolescents* (1997), started a national dialogue on how to get teenagers more involved in the Church's celebration of the Eucharist.

Involvement by young people can include such liturgical activities as: • Extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist • Ushers • Ministers of Hospitality • Lectors/Readers • Altar servers • Gift bearers • Cantors • Musicians • Choir members • Leaders for Children's Liturgy of the Word As good stewards of the faith life of teenagers and young adults, let's identify their gifts and invite them to a fuller participation at the table of the Lord. Get them involved. Make them feel as though they are welcome as mature, responsible stewards of the life of the parish family. They will be enriched by the experience, and so will the faith community.

PROJECT TV SCREENS IN CHURCH

The two new 75-inch TV screens inside the church are now mounted. They are used for projecting the liturgical hymns, readings and prayers as well as for showing video clips and presentations during liturgical gatherings and celebrations. The sound bars, camera for livestreaming, wi-fi synchronizers, remote controls and dedicated power outlets are in place. It is hoped that the screens will help enhance the active participation of the faithful. It also eliminates the issue of blocking the image of the Resurrected Christ in the sanctuary when the old screen is rolled down. We are grateful to the *Llamedo family* for doing the installation job.

PARISH STEWARDSHIP

***GIFTS OF LOVE

❖ We acknowledge all generous monetary contributions which support our pastoral programs and ongoing projects as well as the basic operation of the Church through the regular Sunday offering envelopes and donations. We, the priests, the parish staff and leaders, deeply appreciate and gratefully acknowledge all dear parishioners who faithfully and steadily support our Church with their prayers, stewardship and personal involvement in our parish activities and programs.

***We receive with gratitude the donation of \$1,000.00 to OLM Church from the *Alfredo & Andrea Baptista Trust* in Thanksgiving for their blessings in life.

***We thank *Segundo Facuri* for donating the new Roman Missal, Gospel Book and Lectionaries for use in our Church. The liturgical books cost \$718.40. He just donated 4 cases of disinfectants for sanitizing the church in the amount of \$372.94.

***Big *MAHALO* to the *ILOCANO MINISTRY* for their donation of 2 kneelers ordered from the US Mainland. The kneelers are used on weddings and other liturgical functions. The total cost was \$700.00.

*****DONATION FROM THE FILIPINO COMMUNITY CENTER** - The *Fil-Com Center* in Waipahu issued a check to OLM Church in the amount of \$2,500.00 for hosting the covid vaccination pop-up clinics at the hall. For 5 or 6 times the group of medical and health personnel from the *FilCom CARES, UH Department of Nursing, Project Vision Hawaii* and other civic-oriented organizations came to administer the vaccine and booster shots which benefitted many of our parishioners as well as from other parishes.

*****STEWARDSHIP APPEALS** – Our appreciation and gratitude to *all dear Parishioners* who responded to our appeal during the covid-19 pandemic with their continued stewardship by mailing or dropping their offering envelopes or Mass intention offerings to help defray the needs and expenses of the parish.

Our appeal for support to the Diocesan 'OHANA IN CHRIST appeal was also met with tremendous response from generous parishioners that we were able to surpass our designated goal. May the Lord God who sees every goodness done reward us all a thousand-fold.

*****MINISTERS & VOLUNTEERS** – Our Parish has been blessed with such responsible stewards who serve and give without counting the cost and we keep praising and thanking God for them.

❖REPAIR & MAINTENANCE

*****CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS** – The termite-ridden and weather-worn doors in the Church, sacristy and in the parish hall have been replaced. Knight of Columbus and parishioner *Vicente Velasco* together with his son and another carpenter worked on the project for free. The materials used were purchased with the donations and stewardship offerings of parishioners as well as from the remaining unspent proceeds of the Save the Convent fundraising. We are grateful for everyone's support and generous assistance.

*The parish purchased a new lawn tractor (*John Deere S100 17.5 HP Gas*) for use in the upkeep of the cemetery grounds located in the interior of Kalihi Valley. The total cost which included a 3-year warranty was \$2,563.35. The payment came from the donations and stewardship offerings of OLM parishioners. Big *mahalo* to everyone for being good stewards.

❖**CHURCH ENVIRONMENT** – Volunteer parishioners come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the weekend Masses. They spruce up the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other cleaning tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. During the time of the covid-19 pandemic, in compliance with the Diocese and government advisory they marked the seating in the pews and communion line for 6-ft distancing as well as place sanitizers for use by the mass-goers and disinfect the church. 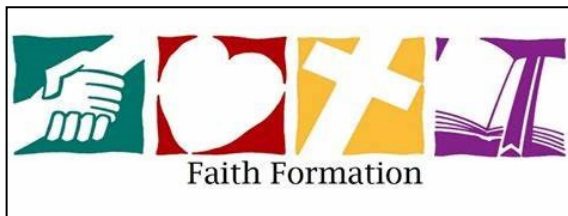

RESPECT LIFE -- *Message to Parishioners*

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born, I dedicated you." Jeremiah 1:5

With the overturning of Roe vs Wade, it is important that our parish join the nationwide effort to form a Respect Life Committee in our parish to educate our parishioners, so they understand the issues and the importance of protecting all human life and meeting the needs of those who are most vulnerable – especially the unborn children, their mothers, the elderly, the seriously ill or dying and their families.

As Coordinator, I am recruiting for volunteers to help meet the needs the committee will serve.

Members will include interested parishioners, adults, and young adults as well as the youth, members of organizations that represent persons with disabilities, persons of minority cultures, and those responsible for education and pastoral care.

The parish committee will rely on the Diocese's Respect Life Office headed by Deacon Gary Streff and his wife, Valerie Streff for information and guidance .

The committee will play a vital role in parish life and will enjoy the strong support of our clergy and key ministry leaders and personnel. Its efforts can and may often coordinate and overlap with other parish programs -- bible studies or youth groups, for example, which focus upon pro-life passages and catechesis found in Catholic Tradition.

The objectives of the parish respect life committee are to coordinate and promote parish participation in the annual Respect Life Program from the USCCB as well as specific intentions of the pastor or parish community. This will be done through:

Education - Fostering awareness of the need to restore legal protection to the lives of unborn children and to safeguard in law the lives of all including of those who are chronically ill, disabled, or dying.

Pastoral Care - Support comprehensive maternity support services, as well as post-abortion counseling and reconciliation programs.

Public Policy - Keep informed regarding upcoming important legislation and encourage parishioners to take action in areas of public policy as outlined by the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops), NCHLA (National Committee for Human Life Action), and the Hawaii Catholic Conference

Prayer & Worship - Sponsor programs of prayer in the parish to pray for mothers and their unborn children, those who are disabled or dying, prisoners on death row and those they have harmed.

Issues / Tasks the committee will be addressing. A member to lead and coordinate:

- 1 - March at the Planned Parenthood Office – group of parishioners and their families
- 2 - Educate our children in the Faith Formation classes
- 3 - Educate their parents and guardians
- 4 - Educate the community
- 5 - Design a Memorial to Pray for the Unborn, Pregnant Mothers, the Vulnerable, all Human Life – statue, candles, flowers, prayers, etc.
- 6 - Research and execute how to develop a culture of life in the parish
- 7 - Prepare special prayers to be said at Mass for all creation
- 8 - Research for pregnancy resource centers
- 9 - Plan fundraisers for special events
- 10 - Prepare a list of names of parishioners' with medical health care expertise: doctors, nurses, therapists, etc.
- 11 - Research and report the adoption process
- 12 - Prepare and distribute pamphlets of Respect Life services

Members to include: Clergy, Catechists, Knights of Columbus, Ministry Members, Organization Members, Parishioners, Youth Ministry, etc.

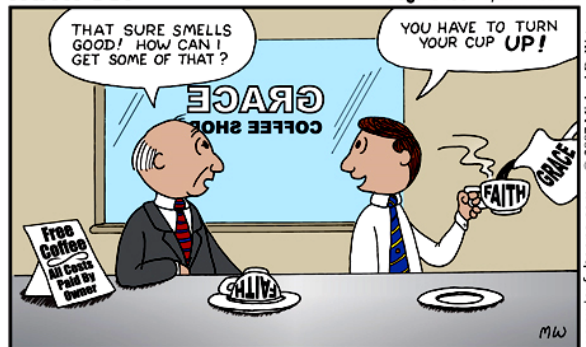
