

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading

Responsorial Psalm

Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23

Psalm 90:3-6, 12-17

Second Reading

Gospel:

Colossians 3:1-5. 9-11

Luke 12:13-21

FOCUS: Knock and keep knocking; trust God's goodness and don't give up.

Why does the man in Jesus' prayer illustration keep knocking? Two reasons: He knows his friend heard him; he knows this friend has bread. Why should we pray without giving up? We know God hears our prayers and that he is able to provide for us. When we keep seeking him and knocking, we show trust in his faithfulness.

First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32

In the first reading, Abraham intercedes for Sodom and Gomorrah, asking the Lord to save the city if even 10 righteous people are found there.

Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14

Paul writes to the Colossians and encourages them to trust the grace of baptism to take away sins and give life.

Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray. He tells them to ask, seek, and knock.

Heavenly Father, You are the source of wisdom and grace, the author of human freedom and creativity. We thank you for these gifts, and ask that you teach us to be good stewards of our creative spirits. Take your family to a farmer's market if in season. *12. Stop for a moment during your busy day and enjoy an ice cream cone or other favorite treat. *13. If you hear a great homily, tell the homilist. *14. Splurge on some produce and buy enough to share with someone in need. *15. GOSPEL REFLECTION

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Weekend of July 23/24, 2022)

A prominent theme in today's Gospel parable is generosity. Late at night, a sleepy friend responds to his neighbor's request for food for an unexpected quest. Jesus suggests that it would be unthinkable for a friend to deny a friend in need. A friend would most certainly give what is asked and more. Through this story, Jesus illustrates God's generosity. Good stewards realize the extraordinary love and graciousness with which God showers us. We need never convince God to be generous. God is already that generous friend. His abundant love bathes us in goodness. This week, prayerfully reflect on God's generosity to us. What should our response be to that generosity?



**We thank *Segundo Facuri* for donating the new Roman Missal, Gospel Book and Lectionaries for use in our Church. The liturgical books cost \$718.40. He just donated 4 cases of disinfectants for sanitizing the church in the amount of \$372.94.

**Big MAHALO to the ILOCANO MINISTRY for their donation of 2 kneelers ordered from the US Mainland. The kneelers are used on weddings and other liturgical functions. The total cost was \$700.00.

***DONATION FROM THE FILIPINO COMMUNITY CENTER - The Fil-Com Center in Waipahu issued a check to OLM Church in the amount of \$2,500.00 for hosting the covid vaccination pop-up clinics at the hall. Of the amount, \$1,000.00 goes to the account of the OLM Filipino Catholic Club in appreciation for their assistance during the clinics. For 5 or 6 times the group of medical and health personnel from the FilCom CARES, UH Department of Nursing, Project Vision Hawaii and other civicoriented organizations came to administer the vaccine and booster shots which benefitted many of our parishioners as well as from other parishes.

***STEWARDSHIP APPEALS – Our appreciation and gratitude to *all dear Parishioners* who responded to our appeal during the covid-19 pandemic with their continued stewardship by mailing or dropping their offering envelopes or Mass intention offerings to help defray the needs and expenses of the parish.

Our appeal for support to the Diocesan 'OHANA IN CHRIST appeal was also met with tremendous response from generous parishioners that we were able to surpass our designated goal. May the Lord God who sees every goodness done reward us

***MINISTERS & VOLUNTEERS - Our Parish has been blessed with such responsible stewards who serve and give without counting the cost and we keep praising and thanking God for them.

❖REPAIR & MAINTENANCE

***CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS – The termite-ridden and weather-worn doors in the Church, sacristy and in the parish hall have been replaced. Knight of Columbus and parishioner Vicente Velasco together with his son and another carpenter worked on the project for free. The materials used were purchased with the donations and stewardship offerings of parishioners as well as from the remaining unspent proceeds of the Save the Convent fundraising. We are grateful for everyone's support and generous assistance.

*The parish purchased a new lawn tractor (John Deere S100 17.5 HP Gas) for use in the upkeep of the cemetery grounds located in the interior of Kalihi Valley. The total cost which included a 3-year warranty was \$2,563.35. The payment came from the donations and stewardship offerings of OLM parishioners. Big mahalo to everyone for being good stewards.

❖CHURCH ENVIRONMENT – Volunteer parishioners come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the weekend Masses. They spruce up the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other cleaning tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. During the time of the covid-19 pandemic, in compliance with the Diocese and government advisory they marked the seating in the pews and communion line for 6-ft distancing as well as place sanitizers for use by the mass-goers and disinfect the church.
