

THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION is one of the most important feasts of our Lady. Catholics believe in the Assumption of the Virgin Mary into Heaven. We believe that when her earthly life was over, Mary was taken up, body and soul, into Heavenly glory, where the Lord exalted her as Queen of Heaven. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, # 966).

The Assumption is the feast of Mary's total liberation from death and decay which are the consequences of original sin. It is also the remembrance of the day when the Church gave official recognition to the centuries-old belief of Christians about the Assumption of their Heavenly Mother.

By the 13th century, the belief had been accepted by most Catholic theologians, and it was a popular subject with Renaissance and Baroque painters. It was on November 1, 1950, that, through the Apostolic Constitution Munificentimus Deus, Pope Pius XII officially declared the Assumption as a Dogma of Catholic Faith.

On this important feast day, we try to answer two questions: 1) What is meant by "Assumption?" 2) Why do we believe in Mary's Assumption into Heaven, despite the fact that there is no reference to it in the Bible?

"Assumption" means that after her death, Mary was taken into Heaven, both body and soul, as a reward for her sacrificial cooperation in the Divine plan of Salvation. "On this feast day, let us thank the Lord for the gift of the Mother, and let us pray to Mary to help us find the right path every day" (Pope Benedict XVI).

In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that he has come not to bring peace but division.

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

AN ANCIENT PSALM CALLS US TO GRATITUDE

The Book of Psalms is Israel's hymnbook. Historically, the psalms are so closely linked to King David that many believe some of them were written by him. They provide prayers for every aspect of the life of the Israelites, and today they reveal a spiritual wisdom that can draw the Christian steward into a deeper intimacy with God, especially through the fundamental notion of gratitude.

Psalm 50 provides an insightful look at gratitude. The psalmist felt so strongly about the call to thankfulness to the Lord that he even chose to speak with the Lord's voice, assuring the people that God did not need their burnt offerings: "I shall take no young bull out of your house nor male goats out of your folds. For every beast of the forest is Mine. The cattle on a thousand hills. I know every bird of the mountains, and everything that moves in the field is Mine." No, God tells the people, everything is already God's, so your cattle and birds and young bulls need not be offered to their Creator.


So, what does God want from us? The psalmist urges us to "offer to God a sacrifice of Thanksgiving."

Keeping in mind that all we have is from God, and remains God's, Christian stewards awake each morning to say with humility, "Thank you." The ancient psalmist's words make sense to a modern Christian, because the God who gave us free will does not possess our thankfulness until we freely give it. And we're asked for more than a perfunctory show of gratitude. The God who already possesses cattle on a thousand hills and every bird of the mountain is calling us to a deep sense of conversion, a sense that we stand before the God who has gifted us with everything we possess.





ACT OF CONSECRATION TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY



HAWAII ADMISSIONS DAY - August 19

WE REJOICE & CELEBRATE WITH ALL OF HAWAII ON THE ANNIVERSARY OF ITS STATEHOOD

Hawaii Admission Day is celebrated on August 19, 2022. Admission Day or Statehood Day is a legal holiday in the State of Hawaii in the United States. It is celebrated annually on the third Friday in August to commemorate the anniversary of the 1959 admission of Hawaii into the Union. Statehood bills for Hawaii were introduced into the U.S. Congress as early as 1919 by Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalanianaole, the non-voting delegate sent by the Territory of Hawaii to the U.S. Congress. Additional bills were introduced in 1935, 1947 and 1950. In 1959, the U.S. Congress approved the statehood bill, the Hawaii Admission Act. This was followed by a referendum in which Hawaiian residents voted 94% in support of statehood (the ballot question was: "Shall Hawaii immediately be admitted into the Union as a State?"), and on August 21, 1959 (the third Friday in August), President Dwight D. "RED HILL RESIDENT PANEL"

Traditional media outlets have reported breaking news of the November 2021 Red Hill fuel leak: the amount of fuel released, the risk to our aquifer, and concerns about the jet fuel plume spreading. As weeks gave way to months, thousands of people lived without clean running water.

Unfortunately, Red Hill and its impact on collective well-being has begun to fade from the public consciousness. Consequently, Faith Action's Environmental Justice Task Force (EJTF) set out to focus on the narrative of families directly affected by the fuel leak. They did this via a virtual panel discussion on July 21st, featuring military and civilian residents whose water came from the contaminated U.S. Navy's water system.

Four courageous women shared how the crisis disrupted their families' vital routines and continues to negatively affect their lives, health, and general well-being. They described how they each first found out about the dangerous leakage through bits and pieces from Facebook, articles from Civil Beat and personal observation of the smell and sheen of their water, despite the Navy's public declaration that the water was safe at that time. They disclosed serious illnesses their families are enduring because of painful exposure to jet fuel-laced water. Most frustrating for them was the dismissive military medical staff who refused to acknowledge that their ailments were results of jet fuel contamination.

We are grateful to the four women who stepped up to advocate on behalf of their community and to remind us that people are still suffering from the water crisis which has not yet ended.


