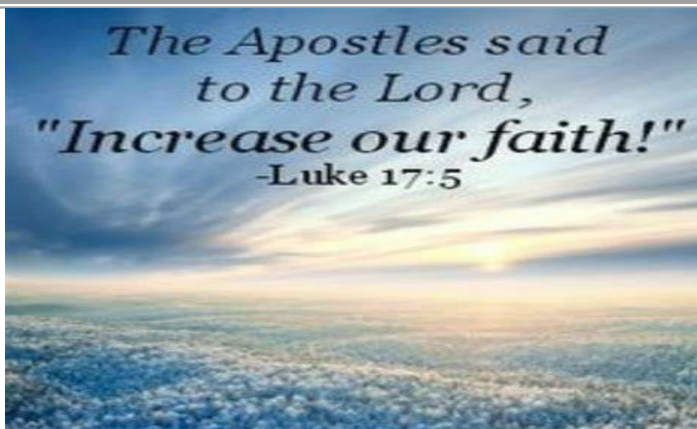

First Reading

FOCUS: Christ helps us grow in faith and in the ability to act in his name.

Courage, a gift of the Holy Spirit, lies at the heart of today's Scripture – the courage to be faithful to Christ and the Gospel in all things and in all places. Like the disciples, we should be unafraid to ask Jesus for an increase in faith, for he reminds us that even with the smallest amount of faith we have the ability to do great things in his name.

First Reading: *Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4*

In the first reading, Habakkuk cries out to the Lord, and the Lord answers. Saint Paul encourages.

Second Reading: *2 Timothy 1:6-8; 13-14*

Timothy to never lack courage or be ashamed of his faith in Jesus Christ.

Gospel: *Luke 17:5-10*

In the Gospel, the Apostles ask Jesus to *increase [their] faith*, and Jesus gives them instruction using a mustard seed as a metaphor.

From October 1-7, 2022, the Diocese of Honolulu will join other US Dioceses on the 2022 Diocesan Rosary Congresses (DRC). The purpose of the DRC is to assist the faithful in each diocese to fulfill the message of Fatima. The 7 days and nights of Masses, perpetual Eucharistic adoration, and hourly rosary incorporated in the DRC program are offered in the spirit of reparation to restore the sanctity of life, to establish peace in our cities, nation, and the world, and to console the hearts of Jesus and Mary. We also pray for the ending of the Covid-19 pandemic and a safe and prompt recovery of those who are affected, physically as well as spiritually

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS CONNECT PARISH GIVING WITH "GREAT IDEALS"

"Set your stakes on great ideals, the ideals that enlarge the heart," Pope Francis once enjoined his listeners at a papal audience. "Life is not given to us to be jealously guarded for ourselves but is given to us so that we may give it in turn" (April 24, 2013).

We can learn much from our pontiff's teaching, especially in light of what we are learning about trends in giving among young adults. While the studies cited below include on-going research into the giving patterns of millennial adults, here are three ideas we can consider when inviting members of our parish community to give:

1. **Consider the Parish as a Giving Circle or Consider Giving Circles within the Parish:** One study concluded that people give more readily when they are part of a "giving circle." When people are involved in determining the recipients of time, financial stewardship, and giving of their time and talent, they think more strategically and are therefore more generous in their giving habits.

2. **Consider the Impact of Giving:** People want to know that their giving will have an impact on the recipients, and on themselves as givers. Often, we focus on the call to give as a response to God's love and as part of our responsibility as disciples of Jesus Christ. It is not that we will stop doing this, of course, yet the Pope's urging to "set your stakes on great ideals" is a perfect example of a rallying cry that people are likely to want to follow, particularly younger adults. Show people the "great ideal" of living Christ's mission, give them some indication of the potential impact on themselves and those to whom they give, and participation is likely to increase.

3. **Consider How You Cultivate Relationships of Trust:** People need a personal connection with or genuine trust in the leadership of an organization in order to increase the giving of themselves and their resources. These trusting relationships are built over time, and often begin with small, one-time "micro-volunteering" opportunities.

As parish leaders, let us set our stakes on great ideals, and invite our parish members to do so as well. In this way we have an even greater chance of helping them see themselves as good stewards of the many and varied gifts of God.

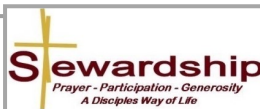

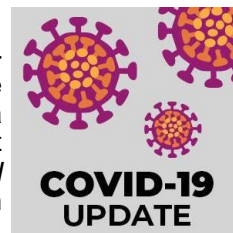

UPDATED REMINDERS IN THE TIME OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

*The daily *Star Advertiser* issue on September 29, 2022, reported that according to the Hawaii Department of Health, Covid-19 reinfections are rising. Health officials say the rise in reinfections is all the more reason to remain up to date with the vaccines and get the bivalent boosters. The vaccine is a good way to protect yourself from infection and, in particular, severe disease and death. The bivalent boosters target the specific omicron subvariant BA.5, which is affecting many people now. The *UH team of Dr. Clem Ceria-Ulep* will again conduct free vaccination with the bivalent boosters in our parish on October 23 after the 9:00 AM Mass.



*The mask mandate in the State of Hawaii has been lifted up since March 25 but we respect those who want to continue using mask. *You may now come to church with or without your own face covering.

*Those parishioners who feel not really able yet to come for reason of health issues are not obliged to come. If you feel sick, please don't force yourself to come to church. Stay home and get well. You are dispensed from the obligation. Nevertheless, you are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed mass to fulfill your Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide live-streamed Mass every Sunday of the 9:00am Mass. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put a definitive end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. *Let's strive to stay safe, healthy and holy as we come back to the house of God and gather as one blessed family. Let us continue to pray for one another and for the whole world.

ACT OF CONSECRATION TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

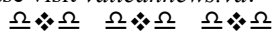

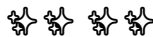

MEMENTOS OF MEDJUGORIE PILGRIMAGE



OLM Pastor, *Fr. Edgar*, and 9 parishioners from various parishes in Hawaii plus 40 others from the Mainland including another Filipino priest, *Fr. Alex Enriquez*, joined as one group to make a pilgrimage to the *Oberammergau Passion Play* which is staged every ten years by the villagers of that rural village in Germany in fulfillment of their vow when they were spared from a devastating plague in 1633; and to the village of *Medjugorie* in Bosnia-Herzegovina where the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared and gave messages to 6 visionaries since 1981. For those who were able, they climbed the unleveled rocky road to the Apparition Hill and Cross Mountain. Above all, they prayed for OLM parishioners and the world for good health, peace and joy.

Photo (l): After negotiating the one-mile unleveled stony road with a cane and determination, pilgrims reach their goal at the Apparition Hill with much relief and gratitude. The place was where the Blessed Lady of Medjugorie first appeared and gave messages to the young visionaries. A towering statue of the Blessed Mother also stands on top of the hill.
