






WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

October 23: Today, the universal Church celebrates World Mission Sunday. Pope Francis urges us to reflect on the theme: "You shall be my witnesses." We are called to look upon the example of the laywoman from France, Blessed Pauline Jaricot, whose love for the Gospel and for those in far-flung places has inspired millions in the past 200 years to help with their prayers and deeds for the propagation of the faith. She formed a group of young women to pray for missionaries and support them with just a penny a week. She would become foundress of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, a confraternity dedicated to praying for and supporting the Missions. Funds from that society helped build many churches in the United States, educate children in the faith, and extend Christ's healing to victims of war, cruelty, oppression, terror, disaster and despair. Today, we have the same opportunity to witness to Christ by joining in that effort of praying for and promoting foreign missions in our homes and parishes. May God bless you and those you love for your generous missionary witness, as He strengthens and guides missionaries throughout the world.

Sirach says that God hears the cry of the lowly and oppressed.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18.

Paul praises the Lord for giving him strength as his life is threatened.

Gospel: *Luke* 18:9-14

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the Pharisee and tax collector praying at the temple. The humble tax collector – not the self-righteous Pharisee – leaves justified.

UPDATED REMINDERS IN THE TIME OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

*The daily Star Advertiser issue on September 29, 2022, reported that according to the Hawaii Department of Health, Covid-19 reinfections are rising. Health officials say the rise in reinfections is all the more reason to remain up to date with the vaccines and get the bivalent boosters. The vaccine is a good way to protect yourself from infection and, in particular, severe disease and death. The bivalent boosters target the specific omicron subvariant BA.5, which is affecting many people now. The UH team of Dr, Clem Ceria-Ulep will again conduct free vaccination with the bivalent boosters in our parish on October 23 after the 9:00 AM Mass. There will also be flu shots available. Please register to take advantage of the free clinic.



*The mask mandate in the State of Hawaii has been lifted up since March 25 but we respect those who want to continue using mask. *You may now come to church with or without your own face covering.

*Those parishioners who feel not really able yet to come for reason of health issues are not obliged to come. If you feel sick, please don't force yourself to come to church. Stay home and get well. You are dispensed from the obligation. Nevertheless, you are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed mass to fulfill your Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide live-streamed Mass every Sunday of the 9:00am Mass. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put a definitive end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. *Let's strive to stay safe, healthy and holy as we come back to the house of God and gather as one blessed family. ABOUT THE BIVALENT BOOSTER

This weekend, we are administering the bivalent booster vaccination. The State of Hawaii Department of Health is encouraging all who are eligible to take it. The value of the bivalent booster is that it is effective against the original virus and omicron variants (the variants affecting Hawaii/U.S. population at this time). It reduces hospitalization and death rate especially for those who are older; and those with pre-existing conditions like, diabetes, high blood pressure, those with weaken ability to resist infection.

Those eligible are 12 years and older. It should be taken 2 months after the last COVID 19 vaccine dose taken.

WHAT DOES THE FUTURE HOLD FOR FAITH ACTION?

Today, the various churches and temples which comprise Faith Action face circumstances they had not foreseen 25+ years ago. More than two years of COVID, along with aging membership, have drastically reduced in-person participation in faith-based congregations.

At its creation more than 25 years ago, Faith Action for Community Equity was conceived as an alliance of faith-based congregations committed to impacting our community regarding issues of social justice. Essential aspects of this alliance were: 1) that identification of the issues would arise from grassroots discussions within each member unit and 2) that members of our congregations would be trained in the basics of community organizing, so that we would have the means to actually carry out the work of advocating for social justice.

These two essential aspects no longer exist. So what does this mean for Faith Action? Clearly, issues of social justice remain. Community organizing is vital in this time of seismic change. We must ask . . . is there a more effective way for these issues to be addressed? Do the organizing principles of Faith Action need to be rethought? Steering Committee representatives of our member units have been scheduled to meet on October 22. This topic will be top of mind for many.

Stay in touch with your unit's steering committee representative, both to learn about the discussion and to share any ideas you may want to put forth.

*Faith Action for Community Equity is a grass-roots, member-led, 501(c)3 non-profit organization driven by a deep spiritual commitment to improving the quality of life for our members and all the people of Hawaii. United by common values and galvanized by collective power, we address the root causes of social injustice on Oahu through our intergenerational, interfaith, and intersectional organizing strategy. We are the only organization of its kind in Hawaii.

With the celebration of World Mission Sunday, October is a month that offers Catholics worldwide the opportunity to renew their commitment to proclaim the Gospel and to give a greater missionary focus to parish activities. It is time to reflect on the global context of our stewardship, and to express our gratitude to missionaries who bear witness to Christ in the most remote and challenging places of the world, often with their lives.

The month of October can remind us that being witnesses to Jesus Christ is a stewardship responsibility of us all, and that in a world experiencing increasingly disturbing forms of alienation and indifference, our communion of faith can offer signs of hope and work to make the planet a home for all peoples.

We are "communion" because of the gift of the Eucharist. And this gift that we celebrate in the sacrament is not something we can keep to ourselves. By its very nature it demands to be shared with everyone. That is one reason the missionary impulse of our Church has always been a sign of vitality in its unique witness of unity around the world.

There are a number of ways you can focus on the missionary activity of the Church:

- Include petitions for the Church's missionary work in your daily prayers.
- Increase your awareness of the wider global mission of the Church.
- Discover ways to participate in specific missionary activities taking place in your parish or diocese.
- Give generously on World Mission Sunday, celebrated this year on October 23.

The Church's work around the world is as important as the work in our own neighborhood. Let us be mindful this month that we are stewards of the Gospel, called to proclaim it to the ends of the earth, bringing hope to a world that hungers for Christ's peace.






