

Jesus comes to us in the Eucharist. As Zacchaeus did, we ought to receive him with great joy. For Zacchaeus received Jesus and was changed by the encounter. We, too, are meant to be transformed, for the sake of the world.

#### First Reading: Wisdom 11:22-12:2

The author of the Book of Wisdom praises God for his love for all things he created and for the mercy he has on all people.

#### Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 1:11-22

Paul tells the Thessalonians that they always pray for them, that God may make [them] worthy of [their] calling.

Gospel: Luke 19:1-10

In the Gospel, Jesus calls Zacchaeus to come down from the tree, and the tax collector says he will give half his possessions away and repay what he owes anyone *four times over*.

#### UPDATED REMINDERS IN THE TIME OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

\*The daily *Star Advertiser* issue on September 29, 2022, reported that according to the Hawaii Department of Health, Covid-19 reinfections are rising. Health officials say the rise in reinfections is all the more reason to remain up to date with the vaccines and get the bivalent boosters. The vaccine is a good way to protect yourself from infection and, in particular, severe disease and death. The bivalent boosters target the specific omicron subvariant BA.5, which is affecting many people now. We thank the *UH team of Dr, Clem Ceria-Ulep* and the Project Vision of Hawaii for conducting the vaccination clinic with the bivalent and flu shots in our parish on October 23 after the 9:00 AM Mass. Parishioners of OLM and from other parishes came to take advantage of the opportunity.



\*The mask mandate in the State of Hawaii has been lifted up since March 25 but we respect those who want to continue using mask. You may now come to church with or without your own face covering.

\*Those parishioners who feel not really able yet to come for reason of health issues are not obliged to come. If you feel sick, please don't force yourself to come to church. Stay home and get well. You are dispensed from the obligation. Nevertheless, you are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed mass to fulfill your Sunday obligation.

\*At OLM, we have been providing live-streamed Mass at 9:00 AM every Sunday. It will end this Sunday hoping that more and more parishioners, both young and old, will come back to church and celebrate in person God's love and presence in the liturgy. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put a definitive end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives.

This week we want to remind the members of our units that work continues on issues of importance to Faith Action. Specifically, we target the ongoing water issues and the issue of bail reform. ## \*\*

Even though our state legislature is not currently in session, two key advocacy issues of 2022 remain unresolved. First and most important is safe water. The fuel tanks are not yet being drained, and the Navy has said draining will begin in 2024. The long-range solution, and the timeline for reaching that solution, remain unclear. The second issue is bail reform. Here are links that you can follow to learn more and to take action on each of these issues.

#### Safe Water

Earlier this year, Faith Action hosted a panel of women whose families were directly affected by the Red Hill water issue. You can hear their stories here: fb.watch/gmMz9jeMKD/

Just this month, new contamination was found. Local media reported that 93,000 people living in Pu'uloa near the Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam were being advised to boil their water after four water breaks in the Navy's system since October 14. Some neighborhoods of the Pearl City Peninsula were also flooded. There has been no response by the Navy to families' requests for temporary housing while the leaks and flooding are resolved.

## STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

LEADING PARISHIONERS TO LIVE AS DISCIPLES AND STEWARDS WHO EVANGELIZE

I have been greatly influenced by the wisdom of Bishop Sylvester Ryan, bishop emeritus of Monterey, California, who often reminds us that stewardship and evangelization are two sides of the same coin. That coin is discipleship. Forming people who are aware of their call to grow as disciples is a dynamic and life-giving process. It can also be challenging, as is the call itself. Jesus' way is one that places demands upon us, and yet, as the United States bishops' pastoral letter on stewardship notes, it is also a way of joy and a life filled with meaning. Let us briefly explore these three interrelated calls:

Discipleship: While we are drawn into Christ's Body through the waters of baptism, many of us grow into a living relationship with Christ over many years. Once that relationship has been ignited, or re-ignited, people's lives are shaped by their faith and desire to grow in love of God and all that we believe as Christians. This process of ongoing conversion takes place within the community of faith. As leaders, we have the opportunity to create an environment in which those who are already on the journey of discipleship recognize their call to reach out to others, building bridges to living faith.

Stewardship: We are Christian stewards because we are followers of Jesus Christ. As the bishops' pastoral indicates clearly, "Stewardship is an expression of discipleship with the power to change how we understand and live out our lives." Through our lives as stewards, we embrace Christ's self-giving, sacrificial way of life.

Evangelization: When we are in love, we cannot help but share that love with others. That is the essence of evangelization. We share the love of God as good stewards of our faith, and our sharing has the potential to draw others into a new or deeper relationship with God in Jesus Christ, as disciples and stewards.

Keeping this interrelationship in mind as we develop stewardship processes and initiatives helps us lead the people we serve to a joy-filled, meaningful way of life.




