

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6:11-16


Paul encourages Timothy in his commitment and fidelity to the Gospel truth.

PILGRIMAGE TO OBERAMMERGAU PASSION PLAY & MEDJUGORIE

It is always a blessing to have the opportunity to join a pilgrimage to sacred shrines. *Fr. Edgar* and 9 parishioners from various parishes in Hawaii plus 40 others from the Mainland including another Filipino priest, *Fr. Alex Enriquez*, merged at Zurich, Switzerland where the group started their land tour in one bus. We were able to celebrate Masses every day in different churches and had the chance to tour significant cities like Lucerne in Switzerland; Salzburg and Vienna in Austria, Munich in Germany; Vaduz in Lichtenstein and Dubrovnik in Croatia. The highlight was the Oberammergau Passion Play which is staged every ten years by the villagers of that rural village in Germany in fulfillment of their vow when they were spared from a devastating plague in 1633.



On the way to Medjugorie, we stopped by another shrine and pilgrimage site of our Lady in Zagreb, Croatia, called the Black Madonna or *Marija Bistrica*. In Medjugorie where we stayed for three days, we witnessed the presence of thousands of pilgrims attending the Mass and Eucharistic Adoration so quietly and solemnly in an open space. For those who were able, they climbed the rocky road to the Apparition Hill and Cross Mountain where the Blessed Lady of Medjugorie appeared to the visionaries since 1981.

The trip from September 5 to 17 was supposed to have been made in 2020 but the covid pandemic came and disrupted the schedule. The stops and tour of other European countries like Switzerland, Lichtenstein, Germany, Austria, Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina were added bonus to the pilgrimage. As usual, the pilgrims indulged themselves in shopping for souvenir items mostly religious articles. Some were thoughtful of purchasing chalice and ciborium for their parish church. Above all, we certainly prayed for OLM parishioners and the world at the shrines for good health, peace and joy.

We are grateful to our Pastor-emeritus, *Fr. Adrian Gervacio* who covered the Masses and other spiritual duties in Fr. Edgar's absence. The hospital chaplain, *Fr. Francis Sanchez*, also helped out with the funeral and burial services for the deceased.







Rev. Fr. Edgar B. Brillantes Pastor





Rev. Fr. Adrian R. Gervacio Pastor Emeritus

Fr. Edgar B. Brillantes was born in Trinidad, Davao del Sur, Mindanao, Philippines on October 30, 1954. He is the eldest of 8 children, 6 boys & 2 girls, to parents Augusto Brillantes & Tita Bueno, who were both teachers and now deceased.

He started his seminary formation at the Immaculate Conception Minor Seminary in Vigan, Ilocos Sur. He enrolled at the St. Louis University, Baguio City, as college freshman but completed his Bachelor of Arts degree at the Immaculate Conception Major Seminary in Vigan. He pursued his Theology degree at the ICST Regional Seminary of Northern Luzon. He was ordained to the Priesthood on April 14, 1980 in San Juan Bautista Parish, San Juan, Ilocos Sur, his hometown, for the Archdiocese of Nueva Segovia by the Archbishop Juan Sison.

In 1983, he was sent by Cardinal Jose T. Sanchez for further studies at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome, Italy, where he earned his Licentiate in Sacred Theology (STL).

His pastoral assignments in the Philippines included: Parochial Vicar at St. Paul Metropolitan Cathedral, Vigan City; Administrator of San Ildefonso Parish, San Ildefonso, Ilocos Sur; Pastor of Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, Sevilla, Sta. Cruz, Ilocos Sur; Pastor of San Juan de Sahagun Parish, Candon City; Spiritual Director & Professor at the Immaculate Conception School of Theology (ICST), Vigan City.

Fr. Edgar arrived in Hawai'i from the Philippines on August 6, 1999 to serve with the Filipino Ethnic Ministry in the Diocese of Honolulu. At the same time, Bishop Francis DiLorenzo appointed him as Administrator of St. John the Baptist Parish in Kalihi Uka, Honolulu. On July 1, 2006, Bishop Larry Silva assigned him as Administrator of St. Joseph and Malia Puka O Kalani Parishes in Hilo, Hawai'i. On July 1, 2007, he was Appointed Administrator of Our Lady of Sorrows Parish in Wahiawa. He eventually became Pastor upon his incardination into the Diocese of Honolulu in April 2008. On July 1, 2012, he was installed Pastor of Saints Peter & Paul Parish in the Ala Moana District. Currently, Fr. Edgar is the Pastor of Our Lady of the Mount Church in Kalihi Valley since July 1, 2014.

Aside from his parochial positions in the Honolulu Diocese, Fr. Edgar has served as member of the Presbyteral Council; Spiritual Director for Knights of Columbus; Spiritual Director for Diocesan Congress of Filipino Catholic Clubs; Spiritual Advisor for Cursillos of Hawaii; and President of the Filipino Priests Association of Hawaii.

Fr. Adrian R. Gervacio was born on September 8, 1939 in Bacarra, llocos Norte, Philippines. He arrived in Hawaii in August 1975.

For five years, Father ministered to the Filipino communities in the diocese. He traveled to parishes and mission churches, working in each parish for a month, visiting families and preaching a mission for seven nights. This was very meaningful and fulfilling. He went to a radio station in Honolulu and gave a talk. On the neighbor islands, Father recorded talks to be played on the radio. Father was associate pastor at Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa for two years. In June 1977, Father was incarnated into the Diocese of Honolulu by the late Bishop John J. Scanlan. He was then the pastor at St. Anthony Parish in Kalihi for four years. In 1982, Fr. Adrian was appointed pastor of St. Anthony on Puuhale Road.

In 1986, Father requested of the late Bishop Joseph Ferrario to be endorsed for the Archdiocese for Military Services. The request was granted and Father was commissioned as a U. S. Navy chaplain in September of 1986. Father served with the Marine Corps in Okinawa; rode ships while stationed in Subic Bay, Philippines; went on to Guam; then to Guantanamo Bay; Charleston, South Carolina; Port Hueneme, California; and retired with the rank of Lt. Commander when he was stationed at Naval Air Weapons Station, China Lake, California. The varied ministries and going to different places enriched him as a priest. The many varied assignments contributed to a very meaningful priesthood.

After retiring from the Navy in 2006, Father was sent to St. John Apostle and Evangelist Church in Mililani where he served as interim administrator. In June 2007, Father took an assignment as pastor of Our Lady of the Mount in Kalihi Valley. Father retired from active ministry in June 2014.

On March 18, 2017, Fr. Adrian celebrated the 50th Anniversary of his ordination into the priesthood. In the Hawaii Catholic Herald on April 20, 2017, Hawaii's 2017 Jubilarians, Fr. Adrian, other priests, clergy and religious members were honored. A Mass of gratitude was celebrated by Bishop Larry Silva at the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa on May 6, 2017. Fr. Adrian remains at Our Lady of the Mount Parish as Pastor-Emeritus.

DIOCESAN ROSARY CONGRESS – Everyone is Invited!



From October 1-7, 2022, the Diocese of Honolulu will join other US Dioceses on the 2022 Diocesan Rosary Congresses (DRC). The purpose of the DRC is to assist the faithful in each diocese to fulfill the message of Fatima. The 7 days and nights of Masses, perpetual Eucharistic adoration. and hourly rosary incorporated in the DRC program are offered in the spirit of reparation to restore the sanctity of life, to establish peace in our cities, nation, and the world, and to console the hearts of Jesus and Mary. We also pray for the ending of the Covid-19 pandemic and a safe and prompt recovery of those who are affected, physically as well as spiritually.

In our diocese the relay will start on Saturday, October 1 at 6:00pm and end on Friday, October 7 at 6:00pm. Each 6-hour period is held at a different parish or religious community in the Diocese.

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

SEPTEMBER: A RECOMMITMENT TO STEWARDSHIP

Summer's end brings with it nostalgia for carefree days, long nights, lazy weekend afternoons, reunions with families, and summer road trips. But in our parishes, autumn brings a burst of new life that makes September feel almost like spring. Why? For the Christian steward, fall brings a renewed sense of commitment. Literally, many of us make our commitment of time and resources to our parish during September or soon



after. Stewardship and ministry fairs bring a sense of excitement to parish weekends, witness talks remind us of the good work to be done, renewed calls for sign-ups for Eucharistic Adoration are issued, and kids are everywhere – in our Catholic schools and in our faith formation programs – filling us with hope and enthusiasm for our young Church.

This is the time when we reexamine and reconfirm our stewardship. If you found yourself away from your parish this summer – either through neglect or through travel and visits to other parishes – now is the time to get reacquainted. Our parish is our primary faith community, where we build relationships based on our shared values and sacramental life, and September is a wonderful way to come "home" to that community.

Some things which will draw you closer to your faith community during September:

- Visit, or better yet help with, the ministry fair. Spend time with people you may not have seen due to summer travels, and "meet and greet" any newcomers you spot.
- Make sure you go to your parish school's Back to School night if you have kids enrolled, or visit your child's faith formation class and introduce yourself to the teacher.
- Consider a new ministry this year. Think of something that will reinvigorate you, provide the greatest service, bring out your best talents, and help you to meet more of your fellow parishioners.
- Maybe you've gotten a new pastor or associate pastor over the summer. Now's the time to introduce yourself and issue a dinner invitation.
- Find out what adult faith formation classes or presentations are offered for the fall, and commit to at least one.
- Take inventory of your financial giving. Did you sometimes neglect the parish offertory during the summer months? Find out if your parish has online giving, or automatic withdrawal, so that your year-round stewardship helps provide the parish with a stable income.
- Make Sunday Mass your top weekend priority, ahead of sports, school activities, or other temptations.




STEWARDSHIP DAY 2022, OCT 1


