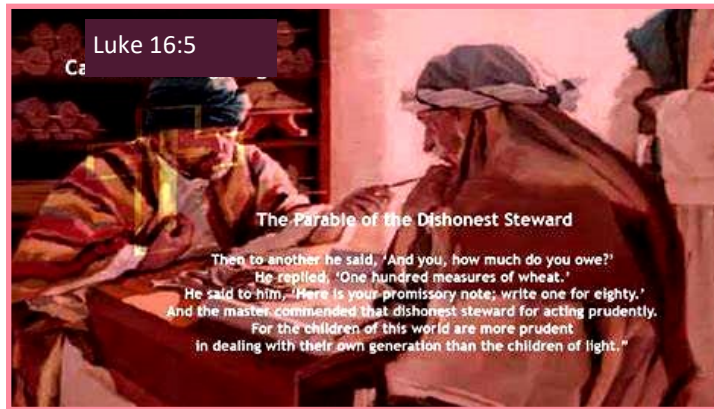

FOCUS: *The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones.*

Loving God and neighbor are the highest priorities for Christians. The prophets challenged the Israelites when their love of wealth led to neglecting God, and warned them against treating others unjustly and dishonestly. Jesus reinforces the message: Our relationship with God requires a commitment to a higher calling by remaining true to him and treating others with honesty, generosity, and justice.

First Reading: Amos 8:4-7

In the first reading, Amos warns those who trample upon the needy that the Lord will not forget the way they have treated the poor.

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 12:1-8

In the second reading, Saint Paul advises Timothy to pray for everyone, including those in authority.

Gospel: Luke 16:1-3

In the Gospel, Jesus uses the parable of the dishonest steward to teach his disciples about trustworthiness.

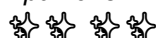

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

STEWARDSHIP SAINT FOR SEPTEMBER - SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL



The feast day of Saint Vincent de Paul is September 27, the date of his passing in 1660. He was the founder of the Vincentians and the Sisters of Charity, and is the patron saint of all charitable organizations. Born in 1581 to a peasant family in southwestern France, Vincent studied for the priesthood at a local Franciscan college and then at Toulouse University. He was ordained a priest at the age of nineteen. Little is truly known of Vincent's early life in the priesthood except that he spent a year in Rome, perhaps studying. In 1612 he became a parish priest in a village just north of Paris and the following year became a tutor in the household of the wealthy and politically powerful Gondi family. He remained with the family for the next 12 years and spent some time as a parish priest where he attended to the needs of the sick and the poor in his parish. In 1617 he formed a group of women who ministered to the needs of these families. He established similar groups in other villages.

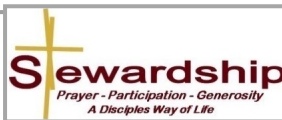
Around the year 1618, Vincent came to know Saint Francis de Sales, whose writings, especially the Introduction to the Devout Life, had a strong influence on him. That same year Vincent established a society of priests, sometimes referred to as "Vincentians," who with the financial support of Madame Gondi, would go from village to village on the Gondi estates to preach to the peasants and conduct missions. The mission work became so successful that with the approval of the archbishop of Paris and continued financial support of the Gondis, the group established a base in Paris and their community continued to grow along with their ministry. Meanwhile the women's groups started to multiply. In 1633 Vincent began offering formal religious formation for this new group, called the Daughters of Charity. A new order of women religious was born that ministered in hospitals, orphanages, prisons, and many other places. The order was formally approved by the Church in 1668. Vincent's approach to a devout life of faith was to be simple, practical and to have confidence in God's love and mercy. He would maintain: "When you leave your prayer to care for a sick person, you leave God for God. To care for a sick person is to pray." At Vincent's funeral the presiding bishop said that he had "changed the face of the Church." He was canonized in 1737. In 1833, Blessed Antoine Frederic Ozanam would found the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul. In 1885 Pope Leo XIII named St. Vincent de Paul universal patron of all works of charity.

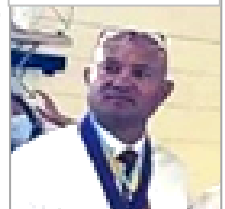

DIOCESAN ROSARY CONGRESS – Everyone is Invited!



From October 1-7, 2022, the Diocese of Honolulu will join other US Dioceses on the 2022 Diocesan Rosary Congresses (DRC). The purpose of the DRC is to assist the faithful in each diocese to fulfill the message of Fatima. The 7 days and nights of Masses, perpetual Eucharistic adoration, and hourly rosary incorporated in the DRC program are offered in the spirit of reparation to restore the sanctity of life, to establish peace in our cities, nation, and the world, and to console the hearts of Jesus and Mary. We also pray for the ending of the Covid-19 pandemic and a safe and prompt recovery of those who are affected, physically as well as spiritually.

In our diocese the relay will start on Saturday, October 1 at 6:00pm and end on Friday, October 7 at 6:00pm. Each 6-hour period is held at a different parish or religious community in the Diocese.

UPDATED REMINDERS IN THE TIME OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The mask mandate in the State of Hawaii has been lifted up since March 25 but we respect those who want to continue using mask. ***You may now come to church with or without your own face covering.**

*When we resumed our public celebrations of the Holy Mass on days and weekends, we continued to observe health and safety protocols of keeping hygiene practices and secure recommended vaccination and boosters. But starting this weekend we will skip sanitizing our seats and the pews. We shall also be putting back holy water on the fonts by the church doorways. This is also in keeping with the State Department of Health following relaxed guidelines issued Thursday, August 11, by the US Center for Disease Control and Prevention (*Star Advertiser, 8/12/2022*).

*Those parishioners who feel not really able yet to come for reason of health issues are not obliged to come. *If you feel sick, please don't force yourself to come to church. Stay home and get well. You are dispensed from the obligation. Nevertheless, you are highly encouraged to join the televised or livestreamed mass to fulfill your Sunday obligation.

*At OLM, we provide the live-streamed Mass every Sunday at the 9:00am Mass. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put a definitive end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. *Let's strive to stay safe, healthy and holy as we come back to the house of God and gather as one blessed family. 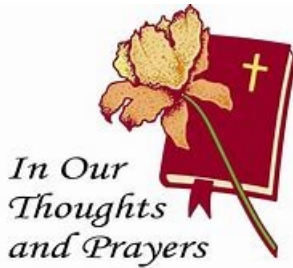
