

Annual Finance Council Report to Parishioners



Dear Parishioners:

Greetings Our Lady of the Mount Ohana! Your finance council is pleased to share that for the fiscal year July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022, that through everyone's generosity we exceeded the budgeted income of \$180, 605 by \$41,205. Total income collected was \$222,125.

See The Statement of Activities Reports-2022 (July 2021-June 2022 vs. Budget 2021-2022 and July 2021-June 2022 vs. Prior Year) on the following page.

The actual Offertory Collection was higher than budgeted. However, the actual offertory Collection is lower than the prior year due to the Anniversary offering in 2020-2021 but nothing in 2021-2022. Other Regular Income was higher than budgeted. However, the Other Regular

Income was lower than the prior year due to lower funeral services done in 2021-2022. Usual (non-scheduled) Income was higher than budgeted. However, Usual (non-scheduled) Income was lower than the prior year due to the PPP1 loan forgiveness income recognized in 2020-2021

For Expenses. The actual Employment Costs were lower than budgeted due to the late hiring of our youth minister; Property and Liability Insurance were lower than the prior year Supplies and Other Services are higher than the budget (higher than the prior year) due to the installation of the TV monitors in the Church in 2021-2022. These were covered by donations (Non-scheduled Income) Contributions and Assessments were higher than the prior year due to higher Income reported in 2019-2020 (\$ 256,919), which was the basis for the diocese assessment calculation.

Your Finance Council along with Fr. Edgar would like to thank everyone for their generosity to that support your parish needs and activities. We are most grateful. The required financials are attached to this bulletin announcement.

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS CHRISTMAS: A STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION ON SHARING

"Bah! Humbug!" was the attitude of Ebenezer Scrooge toward the two gentlemen who came looking for a Christmas donation to help the poor and homeless in the streets of London. "All I want to do is eat, drink and be merry!" was the attitude of the rich fool in Jesus' parable. Neither the wealthy but miserly Scrooge in Charles Dickens' classic, A Christmas Carol, nor Jesus' miserly fool in the Gospel of Luke (Luke 12:16-21), would find good company with Christian stewards who know those attitudes draw us away from God, not closer. As we await the coming of Jesus at Christmas, the Advent season is the perfect time to reflect on our own attitudes toward the things we possess and our need to share with others who are less fortunate.

There is, of course, no season quite so full of wild abundance as the Christmas season. We are entering a joyful, exuberant time, full of music, family, parties, good food and friends. But every Christian steward knows that there is a shadow side to abundance, particularly material abundance, which brings its own challenges.

Poverty, in North America and indeed worldwide, is growing, not diminishing. In the United States alone, one in six Americans now lives below the poverty line. The poor among us become invisible and the poverty that overtakes them becomes a scourge that brings a whole host of societal problems such as hunger, homelessness, crime and domestic violence. Moreover, a culture that is focused on consuming more and more and built on satisfying the self and ignoring the needs of other people is a culture that impoverishes the soul. A preoccupation with our own wants and possessions fosters a spiritual poverty that has no room for the Lord at its center. That kind of spiritual poverty neglects the true meaning of Christmas in

the season becomes a time of material excess. Scrooge told his charitable solicitors that he wished to be left alone, and all the rich fool wanted was to be left alone with his material abundance. Christian stewards know that these attitudes are not compatible with being followers of Christ Jesus. Let us embrace the joy and the delightfulness of the Christmas season and at the same time remain mindful that the true joy of Christmas is not tied into the wealth of goods under the tree, but to the abundance of love and generosity that fill our hearts and spill out to others, especially those most in need of our generous spirit.
