

CATECHESIS: The Liturgy of the Eucharist

The Liturgy of the Eucharist, which comprises the second half of the Mass, is considered the deepest and most profound worship that we, the human race, can offer to God. Many people believe it is simply a re-telling of the Last Supper, but it is actually far more than that. The Liturgy of the Eucharist is indeed a reliving of that night at the Last Supper, but it also relives the fullness of Christ's passion, His crucifixion and death, and even His resurrection. In the Liturgy of the Eucharist, especially the Eucharist.

ristic Prayer, we partake in that one sacrifice of Jesus offering himself on the Cross and rising again. When we celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we are not simply remembering some events that took place 2000 years ago and showing them on some kind of stage. Rather, as we participate in the Liturgy, the reality of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection are made present to us in the Eucharist. It is almost like being transported back into the Hill of Calvary, witnessing the crucifixion and resurrection before our very eyes, although hidden from our mortal view under signs. Nonetheless, with eyes of faith, we behold Christ crucified and Christ risen when our eyes are drawn to the Holy Eucharist held out to us by the priest. This is why the Mass is both the most solemn and the most joyful event of our day, our week, and of our whole life. Every time we come to the Liturgy of the Eucharist; the entire event of Christ's redemptive sacrifice is made present to us.



<u>FOCUS</u>: From a beatitude perspective, discipleship is worth the cost, and suffering will not have the last word.

Jesus gives us a different point of view on suffering and discipleship through the beatitudes. Suffering will not have the last word; rather, those who suffer will be blessed. Discipleship is not without cost, but it will be rewarded. With a beatitude perspective, we are reassured and inspired to press onward with rejoicing rather than fear.

First Reading: Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13

In the first reading, the prophet speaks of the humble and righteous remnant of Israel.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:26-41

In the second reading, Paul explains that God calls the weak and lowly so there can be only boasting in the Lord.

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12

In the Gospel Jesus goes up a mountain, where his disciples follow him, and he teaches them with a series of statements promising blessings and rewards for those who suffer, especially for his sake as disciples.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

LEADERSHIP: Calling Others To Become Faithful Stewards

"Leadership is about setting a direction. It's about creating a vision, empowering and inspiring We are people to want to achieve the vision, and enabling them to do so with energy and speed through an effective strategy. In its most basic sense, leadership is about mobilizing a group of people to jump into a better future." This description of the leader from Dr. John Kotter presents much upon which we may reflect as people who desire to lead others to live as good and faithful stewards. Let us explore this description with our leadership role in mind.

Setting a direction, creating a vision: In a certain sense, it is not we who create the vision. The vision is actually God's, shown to us most fully in Jesus Christ. It is our responsibility and privilege to bring this vision to our parish communities, however, and this is an important aspect of what we do. We all know it is not enough to talk about stewardship once and consider the message sent! However, at times most of us feel as though we are repeating ourselves. Jesus probably felt that way, too, as he talked about love of God and love of neighbor over and over again!

Empowering and inspiring people to want to achieve the vision: A priest once said that he had come to realize that when we animate the ministry and service of others, it is not so much about "empowerment," since our service is not about power. Rather, we entrust ministry to one another, recognizing that each of us has something unique and powerful to contribute.

Developing an effective strategy: Many parish leaders struggle to move from reaction mode to a pro-active stance through careful discernment and planning. A plan creates a framework that serves as a springboard for action and response, and is a vital aspect of good leadership.

Mobilizing people to jump into a better future: We know the impact of growing and living as disciples and stewards. This life of stewardship touches others and changes us. The steward's way is the better way, for individuals, for our faith communities, and for the world!

LITURGY



On <u>February 2, Thursday</u>, is the **Feast of the Presentation of the Lord**, a day when the Church blesses candles and celebrate Christ as the Light for all the nations. This day is also known as **Candlemas Day** which includes the rite of blessing candles at the beginning of the Mass by the church door followed by a procession with lit candles to the altar. Parishioners may bring their own candles for their use at home in their family prayers or devotions or get one from the church.

This day is also observed as **World Day for Consecrated Life** when the Church recognizes the witness of those persons who have chosen to follow Christ by means of the practice of the evangelical counsels such as the Religious Sisters and Brothers, nuns, monks and hermits. *Pope John Paul II* said that this is a

"suitable occasion for consecrated persons to renew their commitment and rekindle the fervor which should inspire their offering of themselves to the Lord.

<u>February 3, Friday</u>, is the **memorial of St. Blaise**, who was bishop of Armenia and died as martyr during the persecution of Emperor Licinius. He was associated with the miraculous healing of throats which made his feast as the traditional day for the blessing of throats with the blessed and crossed candles.

The blessing formula is: Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
