

HAPPY PRESIDENTS' DAY





ASH WEDNESDAY - FEBRUARY 22



Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. Christians around the world receive ashes today which is a sign of our mortality and of our need for repentance before God. The next forty days of Lent give us an opportunity to consider both of these truths. They are expressed in the formula recited by the minister during the imposition of ashes on our head: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The other formula is: "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Lent Begins

The day will come when our physical bodies will no longer have life, but our faith informs us that our souls will live on. We come to Church and acknowledge that we are sinful creatures, always in need of forgiveness and reconciliation with God and with one another. Over these forty days, let us repent of our sins as we renew our journey beyond our mortal existence to eternal life with the Lord.

Ash Wednesday is a day of universal fast and abstinence in the Church. As God calls out to the people thru the prophet Joel, "Return to me with your whole heart," the Lord Jesus tells his disciples how – by giving alms, by praying and by fasting with sincerity of heart, without calling attention to ourselves.

On this day at OLM, we celebrate **two Masses – 7:00 AM and 6:30 PM**. The imposition of ashes will be done within the Mass.

It is fitting that on this Lenten season of repentance we observe our traditional devotions of making the **Stations of the Cross**, participate in the **Rice Bowl** program under the auspices of the Catholic Relief Services of the US Bishops, and celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. The Stations of the Cross will be held <u>every Friday at 7:00 PM</u>. The **Penance and Reconciliation** is scheduled on <u>March 9</u> when other priests will come to help out with the Confessions. The service will be preceded by a video presentation on the significance of Lent which will start at <u>6:00 PM</u>.

We invite every parishioner, young and adults, to join our services in church and make this season meaningful and spiritually fruitful to all of us.



WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

*Sacramental Rite of Anointing of the Sick

On <u>February 11</u>, which was the *Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes* and declared by Pope John Paul II of blessed memory as *World Day of the Sick*, our two priests, *Fr. Edgar* and *Fr. Adrian* administered the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Around 30 parishioners came forward to receive the Anointing which is a Sacrament of the Church that is offered to Catholics who are dangerously ill due to grave sickness injury or old age. TEACHING MASS - BULLETIN INSERT THE MASS: FULL, CONSCIOUS, AND ACTIVE PARTICIPATION SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 2023



Over the past several weeks, these bulletins have focused on breaking down the different parts of the Mass and diving deep into the details. It is important for us to know the Mass along with its elements and its symbols so that we can understand and participate in the Mass in a deeper way. We are called to not simply spectate the Mass, but to take part in the worship in our mind, body, soul, and spirit. With this in mind, our last bulletin will review the different parts of the Mass covered in previous sections and will focus on what we are called to do in order to participate in the Mass in a full, conscious, and active way, This presence of Jesus within us, however, is not meant to be kept hidden away inside us. We are called to take Jesus with us out into the world! That is the center of what we might call our mission as Catholics.

PREPARING FOR MASS

Before we arrived at the Mass, our worship had already begun. We should enter a spirit of prayer before we even enter the church or even leave our homes. We should prepare ourselves by dressing our bodies in clothes fitting for worship, preparing our mind by meditating on the upcoming event of the Mass, our souls by prayer, and our hearts by recognizing God's love for us and responding with our love for Him. Coming to Mass is not a simple empty tradition or obligation. It is a deep expression of our relationship with God. Our Lord calls us to enter His house and be with Him. We come together as one Catholic family to be with God in the Eucharist.

INTRODUCTORY RITES

Our Mass begins, rightly so, with the Sign of the Cross, which we make together as a sign of our unity of faith, our common baptism, and the means of our redemption. After we make the sign of the cross, the priest offers us words of greeting and blessing, which we return. This way, we know that even if we perform different tasks, in the liturgy, we are united in a single act of worship as a single body of believers. Entering into our prayer, we then turn to God with a contrite heart and ask for mercy and forgiveness. We call to mind our sins during these first minutes of the Mass, recognizing that we are yet sinners in need of the help of God and prayers from all the saints. This prayer does not replace the Sacrament of Reconciliation, but it does offer absolution for small, venial sins. After acknowledging our sins and receiving God's mercy, our hearts turn to God in joy as we sing the Gloria, an ancient song of praise which tells of God's glory, power, mercy, and His closeness to us. The Gloria is not sung at every Mass but is reserved for Sunday Masses as well as feasts throughout the year. After the Gloria, the priest exclaims, "Let us pray," prays silently with us, and prays aloud the prayer of the day. We unite ourselves to this same prayer so that, while it is spoken aloud by only one, it is prayed by all.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Our prayer continues through our proclaiming the Word of God. As Jesus is the Word made flesh, He is truly present in the word of God whenever it is read. As such, we sit to listen attentively to the readings from the Old Testament, the Psalms, the New Testament letters, and then finally the Gospel. The Gospel reading carries extra significance because not only is it the word of God, but it contains the words of Jesus spoken through His own mouth and his mighty works. Thus, while we sit for the other readings, we stand for the Gospel out of reverence for the words of Jesus.

After the Gospel is read, the priest or deacon will preach what is called a homily, which is a teaching specifically tied to our faith, drawing from the readings we have proclaimed. We are called to take these lessons to heart. As Catholics, we are called to live out our faith and pass it on to those we encounter in life. In order to prepare (continued on page 2)

ourselves for this great mission, we must come to know our great faith through the teachings of the Church, receiving them through the preaching of the clergy. This should not be the only way that we come to understand our faith, as there are many resources beyond a weekly homily from a priest or deacon, but that does not make it any less important. Indeed, receiving the teaching of the Church and listening attentively to the readings and homily are still an act of worship. After the homily, and almost as a response to it, we stand and together recite the Creed, the summary of the teachings of the Church articulated in this way since the fourth century. All Catholics believe every word of the Creed, and it is important to know it, for it is what we believe. Having been taught the faith, we now profess it as one body of faith. United in our faith, we follow the creed by bringing the petitions of our community to God. We announce them and exclaim in one voice, "Lord, hear our prayer," after each petition. These petitions close the Liturgy of the Word.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Eucharist is the source and summit of our Faith. It is both the greatest gift we receive and the greatest thing we can offer to God. This is because the Eucharist is the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus Christ, even if it has the appearance of bread and wine. Since Jesus is God and God alone is perfect, it is the perfect offering and a perfect gift. Because of this, it is right for us to see the Liturgy of the Eucharist as true worship of the God who is not far away and distant from us, but present with us in every place where Mass is offered. In the Liturgy of the Eucharist, bread and wine are brought to the altar where they are transformed into the Body of Christ through the Eucharistic Prayer. During this prayer, we worship and adore the Lord as He comes down to us from heaven. It is here that the church is no longer simply a house of prayer, but a heavenly dwelling. God is with us here, not only in spirit, but physically as well. As members of the faithful, we are called to enter the deepest sense of worship, recognizing Christ in the Eucharist and responding with reverence, respect, and a prolific sense of awe. This is God who is before us! He is right there, held up by the priest for all of us to see! Our God present with us, we pray aloud in one voice the Our Father, the prayer Christ Himself taught us, and exchange a sign of peace; a peace which comes from God and is for us to share with our brothers and sisters. In the sharing of peace, we are actively participating in the sign of our communion with one another, and rightly, because communion is the next part of the rite. The first to take communion is the priest, but before he does so, he first breaks it as a sign that Christ's body is to be shared with all the faithful, just as the sign of peace. After the priest takes communion for himself, he then gives communion, first to the deacon, and then all the faithful who are rightly disposed. It is right that we receive communion, as it is a gift from God. This gift of communion is the very body and blood of Christ, a true reality, hidden beneath bread and wine. For us, we come forward to receive communion with a prayerful heart, dwelling on who it is that we are about to receive. We reverence our Lord with a bow as the priest or minister presents us with the Eucharist, and as he or she proclaims, "The body of Christ," we respond, "Amen," for indeed we truly believe.

CONCLUDING RITES

Communion does not end the Mass. Before we leave, we are given our mission to love and serve the Lord in the world. We are disciples of Christ, called to fill the world with His presence, taking Him with us from the church and into the world. We bear Christ in spirit and in our bodies, carrying Him with us into our daily lives. With the final blessing and the call to go forth, we depart from the church building, but we who are the Church carry Christ with us wherever we go.



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

STEWARDSHIP OF GOD'S WORD: READING THE BIBLE



February is a transitional month, especially with Ordinary Time ending on the 21st at the doorstep of Ash Wednesday, February 22, and the season of Lent. Many of us also begin to hope that spring will be around the next corner. The first seed catalog we find in the mail reminds us this must be true, yet we know it's not time to turn the soil. We wait in the quiet of late winter.

What better time than February, before Lent and the advent of spring, to settle in for some reading and praying with sacred scripture? February can be a quiet time of patient reflection for the Christian steward. The psalms, like so many biblical passages, remind us of the benefits of reading God's word: "Your word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path" (Ps 119:105).

Our liturgical year offers us a wonderful pathway to the Bible by providing Lectionary readings for each day. Our Sunday Gospel readings this year come to us mainly from Saint Matthew. In the month of February, we have an opportunity to reflect on Christ's teachings in his Sermon on the Mount with its hope-filled Beatitudes. This Gospel is ideal for spending time with the Lord in quiet meditation.

In the Gospel of Saint Matthew Jesus gives us a guide to Christian living. If you choose to read this great book of the Bible, consider just one episode in the Gospel each time you read it. Put yourself into the scene. See what words strike a chord in you. Ask the Lord to help you know him through the Gospel reading.

One of the hallmarks of Saint Matthew's Gospel is his emphasis on discipleship and what it means to follow Jesus. Christian stewards look to this Gospel to gain new insights into their journey of faith; and much like the desires of gardeners, long for the seeds of the Gospel, especially the Beatitudes, to be planted in their own hearts. Find some quiet time. Pick up your Bible. And use God's gift of these quiet February days to deepen your knowledge of Christ through sacred scripture.



2022 Annual Stewardship Report: Message to Parishes

Dear Members of the Body of Christ,

Peace be with you!

As we continue our Eucharistic Revival throughout the United States, I am happy to present to you the 2022 Stewardship Report for the Diocese of Honolulu. It indicates just a fraction of the ways that all of you take seriously your understanding that you are truly members of the Body of Christ, who is present and active in the world today. In the Eucharist, we the members of the Body, with our diverse gifts and talents, come into intimate and holy communion with the Head of the Body and with each other. This weekly gathering for worship is essential to the mission of making Jesus Christ and his healing love present in the world, because in the Mass we encounter his Real Presence and go forth from there to continue his presence in the world.

We thank all of you who have contributed of your time, talent and treasure to your parishes, to the diocese, and to service of our community. Some do so as catechists, whether in the intimate setting of the home or in classrooms. Some serve by evangelizing the culture, bringing the light of Christ to a world that sometimes walks in darkness, whether by influencing legislators to enshrine a respect for all life in our laws or by working to eliminate chronic poverty and its root causes. Some offer much needed human support for those who suffer spiritually or emotionally, whether by offering a compassionate ear, preparing a meal at a difficult time, or praying and fasting for someone in need. Some clean our places of worship or give their money to help build and maintain them. 'OHANA IN CHRIST MESSAGE: A VITAL FUNDRAISER

This year, the Annual Diocesan Stewardship Report includes a spotlight on 'Ohana in Christ, the annual appeal for the Catholic Church in Hawaii. Now in its second year, this important fundraiser is vital to diocesan operations along with the other sources of revenue listed in the charts on these pages. The need for additional funding arose with the ending of With Grateful Hearts, the previous capital campaign, as well as the severe impact of the COVID pandemic on parish collections. In



turn, Bishop Larry Silva reduced parish assessments (the money parishes contribute to the diocese every year) to provide relief to parishes while maintaining nearly all diocesan operations. At the same time, Bishop Silva formed a special committee to explore new ways to meet the mounting financial challenge while keeping parish assessments low. The committee made up of clergy, staff and lay leaders — considered another With Grateful Hearts-type campaign, launching an annual appeal like most other Catholic dioceses, or cutting costs by reducing ministries, programs and services. Bishop Silva wants to broaden financial support among the faithful. But even more he wants to raise awareness among island Catholics of the Church's overall mission and the scope of its work across the Islands. Emphasizing the spirit of stewardship and our gratitude for God's many blessings to our Hawaii family, it was decided to build on the existing Bishop's Circle appeal, rebranding it as 'Ohana in Christ, and asking each parish to accept the challenge of meeting an assigned target. In its first year, 'Ohana in Christ delivered nearly \$1 million for the Catholic Church in Hawaii. A big MAHALO to all the parishes and the thousands of donors for your generous support. Special kudos to the parishes that met their target goal, as well as those parishes over the finish line so far this year. 




