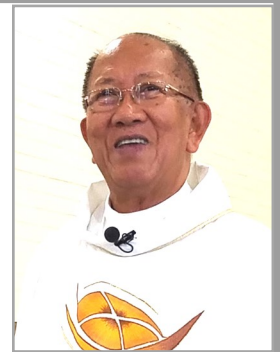

FOCUS: Give glory to God.

Today's Liturgy of the Word offers insight into what it means to glorify God. It is not about just praising occasionally with words, but rather, it is about glorifying God with our lives. What we say and what we do ought to glorify God every day. Jesus has shown us this way by his very life, from his public ministry to his passion and resurrection.

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

In the reading from the Acts of the Apostles, the first disciples return to Jerusalem after witnessing the Ascension, and devote themselves to prayer.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23

In the second reading, Saint Peter counsels those who face persecution that they will be glorified by God.

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

In the Gospel, Jesus prays to the Father as his hour has come. He describes how everything he has done on earth has been for the Father.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL: 2022-2025

"Let's be Eucharistic Stewards"

If, as Feuerbach said, we are what we eat, then those who eat the Flesh of Jesus and drink his Blood must constitute a new society, grounded in love, service, non-violence, and non-domination. Reminding them of their crucial importance as the first members of the Church Jesus said, "I confer on you, just as my Father has conferred on me, a kingdom... And you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel" (Lk 22:29-30). The order of love that obtains within God became flesh in Jesus and, through Jesus, was given to the community that he founded. That community in turn, the new Israel, would be, in accord with Isaiah's prediction, the means by which the whole world would be gathered to God.

Here, the story of the multiplication of the loaves and fish comes to mind. Initially, as we saw, the disciples refused their mission to be the new Israel and feed the crowd, but then, in light of the miracle of grace, they became the distributors of grace. A very similar dynamic is on display in the account of the Last Supper. It is never enough simply to eat and drink the Body and Blood of Jesus; one must become a bearer of the power that one has received. The meal always conduces and leads to the mission. (Quoted from Bishop Robert Barron, This Is My Body: A Call to Eucharistic Revival, p. 22)

*In the Diocese of Honolulu, Bishop Silva has lifted the restriction on receiving the precious Blood of Christ and declared its restoration in Holy Communion starting Holy Thursday. We at OLM abide by this memorandum and we shall resume our communion of both Body and Blood of our Lord on the weekend of May 27-28 which is the solemn feast of the coming down of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the Church on Pentecost Sunday.

During this period of National Eucharistic Revival (2022-2025), may we have the fervent faith and intense desire to receive the Lord's Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

To Love As Jesus Loves: An Easter Reflection

(Excerpted from the 2021 book, *The Heart of the Mission: Simple Ways to Bring People to Jesus* by *Cande de Leon*, chief advancement officer of the National Eucharistic Congress, published by Our Sunday Visitor. *Cande* will be a session presenter and speak about the Church's Eucharistic Revival at the 2023 ICSC Conference in Orlando, Florida.)

Jesus has given each baptized Catholic a mission: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt 28:19-20). Our mission is to live this calling every day of our lives.

People are at the heart of the mission of the Church. Strengthening relationships, boldly growing engagement and connecting people to the mission are simple ways to bring people to Jesus. It is not complicated – we just need to bring people to Jesus. God is always drawing closer to us, so we can rest assured that he is the one doing the hard work – not us! In order to bring people to Jesus, we must start with loving and caring for people one at a time. It has to come from a genuine desire to love and show people that they matter. After all, why would anyone listen to the Good News from us, if we haven't shown them God's love?

If we are all God's children, then we have a responsibility to help each other. We are meant to live in relationship, and to be the living presence of God in the world – to show his love to the people around us. This means treating people like family, not transactions. It's easy to do this with the people we enjoy being around. It's a lot harder to put into practice when we are talking about a coworker or acquaintance who drives us crazy. But like it or not, we are all called to this. For me this is a revolutionary idea: I am not better than anyone else. The world tries to separate us all the time by putting us into categories of race, gender or socioeconomic status. Those don't really matter. We are all children of God. It is important for all of us to try to see the people in front of us and love them like Jesus does. I invite you to join me in that, to strive each day to see people as your brothers and sisters and to treat them accordingly.

Aloha Pastors & Parish Staff,

Good news - the appeal is now tracking ahead of last year by 9% -- led by 23 parishes meeting their target goal. Special kudos to these faith communities recently over the top: St. Ann, Kaneohe & Sts. Peter & Paul, Honolulu.

PLEASE NOTE:

-Parishes short of this year's required minimum 50% of target goal will be contacted in early June regarding fulfillment options*.
-The final 'OIC 2022/2023 Report will include the assessment paid by each parish so as to acknowledge their total diocesan support.

And for 2023/2024:

-While the overall goal remains the same at \$1.125 million, parish target goals will fluctuate relative to changes in their assessment.
-Target goals will be released once parish assessments are finalized, of which the required minimum increases to 75% (up from 50%).
-Mail lists that are up-to-date can be included with the initial 'OIC mailing in September at no charge to the parish – if interested, please contact me ASAP to discuss next steps.

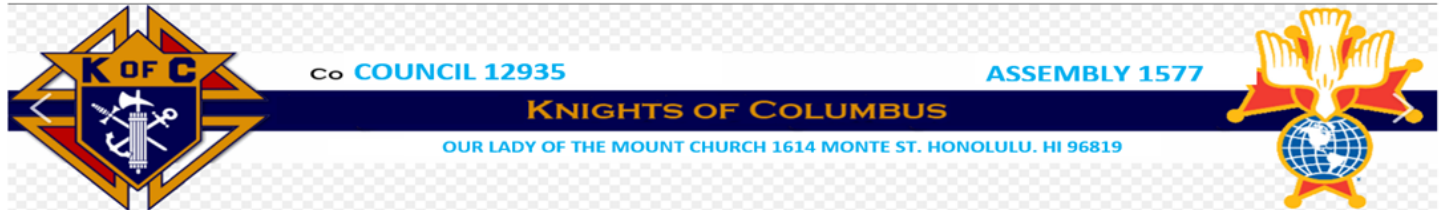


CAN (FAITHFUL CITIZEN) TRAINING CLASS

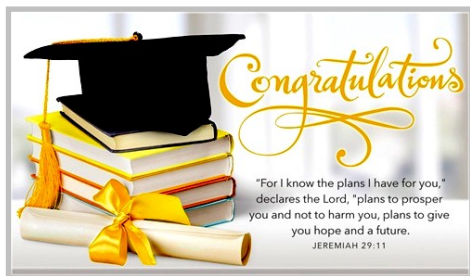

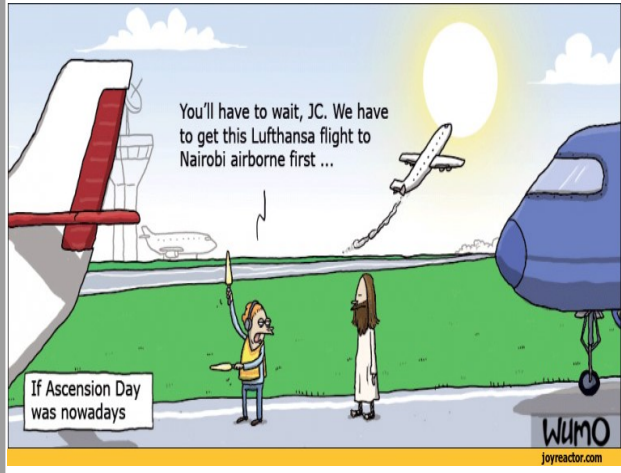
