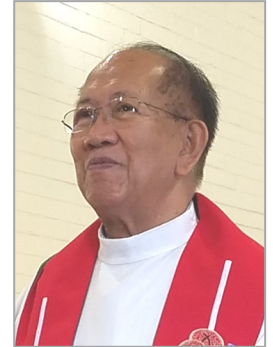

First Reading
Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9

FOCUS: Easter isn't just about Jesus' resurrection from the dead, but our rising to new life. The first Easter – that day in human history where Jesus Christ was raised from the dead – is not simply a historical fact, but a theological and spiritual reality in which we continue to live. We are immersed in the life that was created for us in his rising, and we celebrate that "little Easter" in every Sunday Eucharist. Through the grace received there and the gifts of the Holy Spirit, we are sent as workers in the kingdom, helping to renew the face of the earth.

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

In the first reading, we hear about the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the first followers of Jesus who begin speaking in different tongues.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

Saint Paul says that there are *different kinds of spiritual gifts and forms of service*, but the same Spirit and Lord *who produces all of them in everyone*.

Gospel: John 20:19-23

In the Gospel, Jesus appears to the disciples, saying *peace be with you* and showing them his hands and his side.

FLORES DE MAYO

The traditional May devotion to the Blessed Mother culminates this Sunday with the Holy Mass preceded by the communal praying of the holy rosary, floral offering and crowning of Mary. It will be followed by a solemn procession of the image escorted by the angels and the "sagalas" or the maidens representing the virtues of Mary. The occasion will be capped with a festive fellowship at the hall. The month-long traditional celebration is spearheaded by the OLM Filipino Catholic Club headed by **Fe Go**.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

Pentecost: A Stewardship Feast To Celebrate

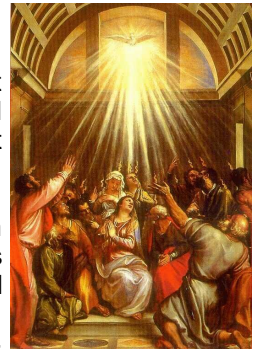
A challenge for the Christian steward is accepting, and even rejoicing in, the fact that our commitment to faith is often a counter-cultural one. Perhaps this is nowhere more striking than in the quick cultural "end" of the Easter season, and our own belief that Easter is leading us through May to the great feast of Pentecost on May 28.

We see this discordance in many Christian celebrations adapted by the popular, commercial culture. While we are still enjoying the season of Christmas and looking forward to Epiphany, most American homes have taken the Christmas tree to the recycling center and moved on to thoughts of Valentine's Day. During the sacrificial early days of Lent, there's something jarring – yes, just wrong – about all those pastel Easter eggs and bunnies appearing in stores. And all that chocolate!

So, as Christian stewards, we feel no surprise that as we break our Easter fast and begin our meditation on the Resurrection, we find that the stores have tucked those chocolate bunnies away on discount shelves, and we're off to the next commercially competitive venture. And as the great feast of Pentecost beckons us, we realize that the society around us gives this occasion hardly a passing nod. Apparently, there's no money to be made from Pentecost, the day the Holy Spirit came among the apostles and imbued in them the courage to be true followers of Christ. Courage, strength, faith, the Spirit – these are hard to market in the public square, aren't they? The willingness to live and ultimately to die as martyrs for Christ, as the apostles did, these are things that are hard to package in bright paper. They don't fit well in the greeting card aisle.

Perhaps during these days of May when we as Catholic stewards continue to celebrate the season of Easter and look forward to Pentecost, we might examine our own willingness to step outside the culture in our celebration of great Christian feast days. Keep the reminders of the Resurrection around you. Let your family prayer reflect the marvels of the season. Help your children to be aware of the liturgical calendar. Explain to them the meaning of the changing colors of the priests' vestments. Dress up in red for Pentecost Sunday. But most importantly, educate yourself and your family on how powerful it is to understand and celebrate the great markers and mysteries of our shared faith experience.

Aloha Pastors & Parish Staff,

Good news - the appeal is now tracking ahead of last year by 9% -- led by 23 parishes meeting their target goal.

Special kudos to these faith communities recently over the top: St. Ann, Kaneohe & Sts. Peter & Paul, Honolulu.



PLEASE NOTE:

-Parishes short of this year's required minimum 50% of target goal will be contacted in early June regarding fulfillment options*.

-The final 'OIC 2022/2023 Report will include the assessment paid by each parish so as to acknowledge their total diocesan support.

And for 2023/2024:

-While the overall goal remains the same at \$1.125 million, parish target goals will fluctuate relative to changes in their assessment.

-Target goals will be released once parish assessments are finalized, of which the required minimum increases to 75% (*up from 50%*).

-Mail lists that are up-to-date can be included with the initial 'OIC mailing in September at no charge to the parish – if interested, please contact me ASAP to discuss next steps.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL: 2022-2025



“Let’s be Eucharistic Stewards”

The distribution of Communion: In the Communion, preceded by the Lord's prayer and the breaking of the Bread, the faithful receive *“the Bread of Heaven”* and *“the cup of Salvation,”* the Body and Blood of Christ who offered Himself *“for the life of the world.”* Since this Bread and Wine have been made Eucharist (*“eucharistized”* according to an ancient expression), *“we call this food Eucharist. No one may partake of it unless he believes what the Church teaches is true, has received Baptism for the forgiveness of sins - a new birth, and unless he lives in keeping with what Christ taught”* (CCC #1355). In receiving Communion, we share in the Body of Christ so totally that He becomes our Food and we become united with the risen

Savior and with the whole Faith community.

** “Many of the Church Fathers characterized the Eucharist as food that effectively immortalizes those who consume it. They understood that if Christ is really present in the Eucharistic elements, the one who eats and drinks the Lord’s Body and Blood becomes configured to Christ in a far more than metaphorical way. The Eucharist, they concluded, Christifies and hence eternalizes.*

It implies that the whole of one’s life – body, psyche, emotions, spirit – becomes ordered to the eternal dimension, to the realm of God. It means that one’s energies and interests, one’s purposes and plans, are lifted out of a purely temporal context and given an entirely new spiritual valence. The Christified person knows that his life is not finally about him but about God; the Eucharistized person understands that her treasure is to be found above and not below. The eternalized person can say with Paul, “It is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me” (Gal 2:20).

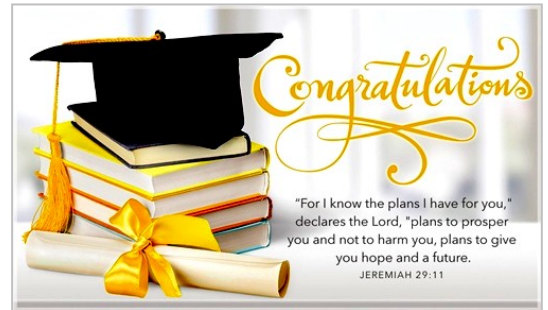
