

FOCUS: Let us truly be the body of Christ by demonstrating the Father's love to others. How can we walk alongside the way and the truth and the life? We can be Christ to each other. As the body of Christ, we do his works. We offer our time, talent, or treasure to those in need. Let us ask Jesus how we can continue to build his kingdom on earth.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

Christian Stewards: People of the Resurrection

For those immersed in the secular world, Easter is long over. The pastel bunnies, the chocolate eggs, the color-splashed jelly beans which appeared in the marketplace so temptingly just as Christians were beginning the fasting of Lent, have long been swept from the store shelves to be replaced in anticipation of the next marketable holiday. For the Christian steward, how backward this all seems. Yes, we believe that the Paschal mystery and the life-changing events of Easter are not over. They are not an end but a triumphal beginning, and they have altered us in a quite radical way.

The mystery and miracle of Easter challenge us to live as different people, as people of the Resurrection. What does this mean? For those new Catholics who participated in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), a period of mystagogy helps to understand this mystery. Indeed, this ancient Greek word actually means "to lead through the mysteries." During *mystagogia*, many parishes introduce their new members to service in a quite practical way. Here are the ministries of the parish; here are the charities we support; here are the needs of our community and our congregation. How do you choose to live out your faith in the Resurrection in a quite tangible and real way? How do your gifts fit into our needs? Essentially, however, this is a question that the Easter season calls forth in all Christian stewards not just our newest members.

We have lived through Lent and the Paschal mysteries, all the while trying to deepen a relationship with the person of Christ. It's as simple, yet as amazing and complex as that. The deeper the relationship grows, the more we become rooted in it, the more this relationship with Christ comes to dominate our lives. We no longer compartmentalize Jesus, we hold him at our center. And the mysteries lead us to the fundamental question at the heart of all Christian stewardship, the question that Easter compels us to ask: How do I steward my resources – my time, my money, my abilities and gifts, my very life – so that they are in service to the Kingdom of God? It's not a part-time question. It's not a seasonal question that's swept off the shelf periodically. It's the basic question which the Easter season demands of us: Jesus, how do you want me to serve you?

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL: 2022-2025

“Let’s be Eucharistic Stewards”

At the Consecration during Mass, the priest solemnly says the words of institution by which the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ himself. It is not the priest who transforms the bread and wine into Body and Blood of Christ; only God can do that. The act of consecrating the gifts requires the Holy Spirit’s direct involvement. The priest performs the Epiclesis which is the calling down of the Holy Spirit by extending his hands over the gifts with his palms down above them and make the sign of the cross that they may become the Body and Blood of Christ. It makes the gifts holy and acceptable so that they become worthy to be the Eucharist.

At this moment, the priest repeats the words first uttered by Christ: *“This is my body,”* and, *“This is the chalice of my blood.”* When the priest says these words, it is no longer the priest who is speaking, but Christ speaking through the priest. As Christ is the fullness of Truth, what He says is always true, and thus when He says that the bread is His body, it thus becomes so. Our Lord then does the same to the wine, transforming it into His blood. This concludes with, *“Do this in memory of me.”*

When we process or fall in line for Holy Communion, we are actually receiving the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. He gives himself as our spiritual nourishment during our earthly pilgrimage. He lives in us and we also live in him. This is the fullness of life which the Lord promised: *“I came that you may have life and have it to the full.”*

Following the memorandum from the Bishop exhorting the restoration of receiving the precious Blood of Christ by the faithful we have set the Feast of Pentecost on May 27-28 to start implementing it at OLM.

During this period of National Eucharistic Revival (2022-2025), may we have the fervent faith and intense desire to receive the Lord’s Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist.



ACT OF CONSECRATION TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY



“Mother of God and our Mother, to your Immaculate Heart we solemnly entrust and consecrate ourselves, the Church and all humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine. Accept this act that we carry out with confidence and love. Grant that war may end and peace spread throughout the world. The ‘Fiat’ that arose from your heart opened the doors of history to the Prince of Peace. We trust that, through your heart, peace will dawn once more. To you we consecrate the future of the whole human family, the needs and expectations of every people, the anxieties and hopes of the world.”

“May your maternal touch soothe those who suffer and flee from the rain of bombs. May your motherly embrace comfort those forced to leave their homes and their native land. May your Sorrowful Heart move us to compassion and inspire us to open our doors and to care for our brothers and sisters who are injured and cast aside.”

“Through your intercession, may God’s mercy be poured out on the earth and the gentle rhythm of peace return to mark our days. Our Lady of the ‘Fiat,’ on whom the Holy Spirit descended, restore among us the harmony that comes from God. May you, our ‘living fountain of hope,’ water the dryness of our hearts. In your womb Jesus took flesh; help us to foster the growth of communion. You once trod the streets of our world; lead us now on the paths of peace. Amen.”



'OHANA IN CHRIST PROGRESS REPORT (July 1, 2022-April 30, 2023)

Aloha Pastors & Parish Staff,

Good news - the appeal is now tracking ahead of last year by 9% -- led by 23 parishes meeting their target goal.

Special kudos to these faith communities recently over the top: St. Ann, Kaneohe & Sts. Peter & Paul, Honolulu.

PLEASE NOTE:

-Parishes short of this year's required minimum 50% of target goal will be contacted in early June regarding fulfillment options*.

-The final 'OIC 2022/2023 Report will include the assessment paid by each parish so as to acknowledge their total diocesan support.

And for 2023/2024:

-While the overall goal remains the same at \$1.125 million, parish target goals will fluctuate relative to changes in their assessment.

-Target goals will be released once parish assessments are finalized, of which the required minimum increases to 75% (*up from 50%*).

-Mail lists that are up-to-date can be included with the initial 'OIC mailing in September at no charge to the parish – if interested, please contact me ASAP to discuss next steps.


