


OCTOBER IS ROSARY MONTH

CUCHARISTIC ROSARY CONGRESS IN THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU "TO JESUS THROUGH MARY"

October 7 - October 13, 2023 > From the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary to the Miracle of the Sun in Fatima With the blessing of *Bishop Larry Silva*, the Diocese of Honolulu will once again join other dioceses around the nation for the 2023 Eucharistic Rosary Congress (ERC) for seven days and nights of Masses, perpetual Eucharistic adoration, and hourly rosary. The ERCs are held in response to Our Lady of Fatima's call to conversion, consecration and prayer. Our diocese will follow the "The Traveling Congress" model. The relay will start on Saturday, October 7 at 6 p.m. and will end on Friday, October 13 at 6 p.m. Each 6-hour period is held at a different parish, religious community, or Catholic school in the Diocese. Next Sunday's Reading

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading Isaiah 5:1-7

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 80:9, 12-16, 19-20

Second Reading Philippians 4:6-9

Gospel Matthew 21:33-43

FOCUS: Turn away from sin and follow Christ.

In today's Gospel parable there is a model son, who gives honor to his father by verbally assenting to his father's wishes. But his words are hollow, and his virtue is a mirage. How does our own reality measure up to our Christian ideals? Loving our neighbor sounds like a lovely sentiment until they cut us off on the highway. May Christ who calls us always to conversion help us root out any hollowness and hypocrisy in our own lives that we may truly confess that Jesus is Lord.

First Reading: Ezekiel 18:25-28

Today's readings are tied together by the theme of conversion. Ezekiel assures that those who turn away from sin shall not die.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:1-11

The Letter to the Philippians encourages unity in turning away from selfishness to emulate Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 21:28-32

And Jesus' parable favors the son who shamefully indicated defiance, but changed his mind and was obedient.

OLM JOINS THE EUCHARISTIC ROSARY CONGRESS - October 8, 2023

STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS

EUCHARIST AND THE SPIRITUALITY OF STEWARDSHIP

(This is the final article adapted from a four-part series by stewardship author and lecturer, *Reverend Joseph D. Creedon* from his 2018 book, *Stewardship: A Life-Giving Spirituality*. Father Creedon has been named the 2023 recipient of the Christian Stewardship Award by the board of directors of the International Catholic Stewardship Council. The award will be presented to Father Creedon during the opening plenary session of the Council's 61st annual conference on Sunday afternoon, October 1, 2023.)



Perhaps one of the best ways to explore the mystery and the miracle of the Eucharist with the attitude of giving thanks, the fundamental aspect of stewardship, is to take part in an extended meditation of just what happens when we gather to break bread as the People of God. When we move from the Liturgy of the Word to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. What is the first thing we do? We bring the gifts of bread and wine to the altar. The priest receives the gifts and individually holds them up and reminds us "through your goodness we have this bread to offer" and "through your goodness we have this wine to offer." There is no spoken response to these prayers but our hearts should say, "Thanks be to God."

Now comes the Eucharistic prayer. Our threefold versical and response concludes with "Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God." We used to respond, "It is right and just to give God thanks and praise." I prefer the older translation because we got to say "thanks" out-loud. For now, "It is right and just" will have to suffice.

Now the priest reminds us of what Jesus said and did at the Last Supper. It is the simple words of a man who knew he was soon to die but was determined to find a way to remain with us. "He took the bread and gave you thanks..." "He took the chalice, again he gave you thanks..." This is why we call it Eucharist because Jesus gave thanks! We are called and reminded to do the same.

The Eucharistic prayer ends and we prepare for communion. We cast aside our individuality and call upon God as "Our Father." We exchange the sign of peace. We join the centurion in scripture not by expressing our unworthiness but professing our belief that God has the power to transform our lives and make them better, "Say but the word and my soul will be healed." Then we come forward not just to receive the body and blood of Christ but also to become what we receive. We are now the body and blood of Christ. Our hearts are filled with gratitude.

One final prayer and a blessing, then "The Mass is ended. Go in Peace." Together we all proclaim, "Thanks be to God!" As a child my "Thanks be to God" was really "Thank God this is over." As an adult it is "Thanks be to God for the mystery of his love. Thanks be to God for this gathering together. Thanks be to God for this wonderful sacrament. Thanks be to God that I am now sent back into the world to continue the transformation."

We should come away from the Eucharist renewed in our faith and reminded of the call to be his disciples, the stewards of all God has given us. (Lifted from ICSC e-Bulletin October 2023)

On September 14, the Holy See released some prayers for the opening of the synod: https://www.synod.va/en/news/without-prayer-there-will-be-no-synod.html In a letter addressed to bishops and eparchs from all over the world, **Cardinal**

Mario Grech, General Secretary of the General Secretariat of the Synod, invites

the faithful from around the world to prayerfully participate in the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops that will **open in the Vatican on 4 October**.

With this letter, the General Secretary reminds everyone that the Synodal Assembly is above all a spiritual event, of prayer and listening to the Holy Spirit who is the true protagonist of the event.

SOLEMN BLESSING AT END OF SUNDAY MASS

In order to facilitate participation and solicit the prayerful support of the members of the assembly from local communities, the General Secretariat of the Synod prepared a "Solemn Blessing" to be recited, in particular, at the end of Sunday Masses together with intercessory prayers. The Latin original was attached. Father Dustin Dought -- of our USCCB Secretariat for Divine Worship -- has provided the **English and Spanish translation of this blessing. It is attached.**

Respecting the richness of the liturgical tradition of the Oriental Catholic Churches *sui iuris*, the letter was also sent to the leaders of those Churches with a request to implement a similar blessing and intercessions in their Divine Liturgies.

UNIVERSAL PRAYER/ GENERAL INTERCESSIONS – SUNDAYS AND WEEKDAYS

Sample petitions are available on the Vatican link (above) in various languages. They are also provided in the attached documents from the USCCB Secretariat.

OTHER PRAYERS

Cardinal Grech's appeal is part of a series of initiatives aimed at recalling the eminently spiritual character of the synodal assembly and promoting the participation of the entire People of God through prayer, including:

- the creation, already in 2021, in collaboration with the World Pope's Prayer Network and the UISG (International Union
 of Superiors General), of a site (<u>www.prayforthesynod.va</u>) that proposes a specific prayer time for the Synod every first
 Monday of the month;
- the Ecumenical Prayer Vigil (www.together2023.net) on 30 September on the eve of the Synod broadcast in live-streaming from 4.30 p.m. on Vatican News channels (vaticannews.va);
- a spiritual retreat for assembly members prior to the opening of the assembly (1-3 October 2023). Sincerely in the Lord,

MAUI CATHOLIC SUPPORT UPDATE HOPE EMERGES ON MAUI WITH STRENGTH IN SOLIDARITY

From the Office for Social Ministry

Millions of people around the globe today are on the move, migrating and not by choice. Many are forced to flee their homes





because of natural disasters, wars and dire poverty. For this year's 109th **World Day of Migrants and Refugees** (WDMR) on September 24, Pope Francis provided a profound message that resonates deeply with all forcibly displaced persons, including those affected by the devastating wildfires in Maui. Pope Francis called the world to see all forcibly displaced persons as migrant companions on our journey as one human family. He encouraged all "to see in the migrant not simply a brother or sister in difficulty, but Christ himself, who knocks at our door. The important thing is that there always be a community ready to welcome, protect, promote and integrate everyone. Only by walking together will we be able to go far and reach the common goal of our journey."

On Maui, we are witnessing Lahaina's diverse population of Hawaiians, Filipinos, Tongans, Vietnamese and Latinos, working together as One Ohana alongside people from the mainland, Europe, Asia, South Pacific, Latin America and other regions worldwide to support all who lost loved ones, homes, and livelihoods. Maria Lanakila Parish's Sacred Heart School faculty and parents are providing learning opportunities not only for the students who were previously enrolled, but also for many from the public schools which were consumed by the wildfires. (To donate to the fund for Sacred Hearts School, please go to www.shsmaui.org.)

While volunteering with Maui's Ministry of Presence and Catholic Charities Hawaii at the Lahaina Civic Center, we talked story with wildfire victims about their faith experience of compassion, solidarity and resilience. The Lahaina Civic Center also had a Filipino Resource Fair, where thousands impacted by the wildfires gathered to share their support for one another. (For more about what Catholic Charities Hawaii is doing on Maui please visit www.catholiccharitieshawaii.org).

At St. Anthony Parish parking lot in Wailuku, volunteers from most Maui's parishes gathered to pick up and deliver appliances donated from the mainland for those displaced by the wildfires. Days earlier the monthly vicariate meeting discussed establishing a "faith-sharing accompanying" mental health ministry in Maui. Let us continue relief and recovery efforts together in Maui as One Ohana in the hopeful Aloha spirit Pope Francis's WDMR prayer: "God, Father Almighty, sustain us by the power of your Spirit, so that we can reflect your tender love to every migrant whom you place in our path, and to spread in hearts and in every situation the culture of encounter and of care."
