




#### WORLD MISSION SUNDAY SECOND COLLECTION - October 21-22

Christ came to restore our relationship with God and one another: There is no God besides [him]. Christians cannot be content to lead prayerful lives in private. We have a right and a responsibility to build communities of peace and justice in our homes and nations.

Isaiah reveals to King Cyrus of Persia that the Lord has called him by name so all may know there is no other God.

#### FILIPINO PRIESTS' GATHERING

The Filipino Priests serving in the entire USA including Alaska and Hawaii have formed the National Association of Filipino Priests in the USA (NAFP-USA) some 14 years ago. They are holding their 4<sup>th</sup> General Assembly on October 23-27 in New Jersey and New York. The Hawaii delegation consists of 25 priests and Bishop Larry Silva is joining them too. This gathering was supposed to be held in Year 2020 but the covid-19 pandemic forced its rescheduling to this time. There are 350 registered priests attending including the Bishops who are invited speakers and the 3 Filipino Bishops shepherding in Salt Lake City, UT, Los Angeles, CA and Houston, TX.

This month of October 2023 happens to be the time of the Synod of Bishops in Rome on Synodality, thus, our chosen assembly theme is in line with this very important event in the life of the church which is - "JOURNEYING TOGETHER: COMMUNION, PARTICIPA-TION, MISSION." The Synod, with its powerful theme, is a grace-filled opportunity for us



Filipino priests to go through a conversion experience and to journey together with Jesus. Journeying together in communion, participation and mission, is undoubtedly a mandate to listen and to learn, to love and to live, to let go and to let God! The keynote talk will be delivered by the Most Rev. Michael Saporito, D.D., Auxiliary Bishop of Newark and Regional Bishop of Bergen County. Presiding at our Eucharistic concelebrations are Cardinal Timothy Dolan at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City and Cardinal Joseph Tobin at the Cathedral-Basilica of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in Newark, NJ.

We are billeted for our accommodation and conferences at the Meadowlands Hilton in East Rutherford, NJ. The first three gatherings were held in Los Angeles, CA, Orlando, FL and Houston, TX. Please pray for us, your priests, as we pray for you.

# STEWARDSHIP EXPRESSIONS CELEBRATING WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

October 22 is World Mission Sunday! Pope Francis, in his message for World Mission Sunday 2023, reflects on the theme "Hearts on fire, feet on the move," based on the story of the disci-



ples who encounter Jesus on their way to Emmaus (cf. Lk 24:13-35). Every year, this Sunday in October celebrates and encourages our efforts to proclaim the Gospel in both word and deed.

One parish marked the occasion by offering a glimpse into the Church's global solidarity. Students representing the cultural diversity of the parish processed, readings and songs were offered in various languages, and a feast offering ethnic dishes followed the liturgy. That Sunday, parishioners enjoyed an intimate connection to the legacy of missionary support that can be traced back nearly two centuries.

North America was "mission territory" in the early 1800s when *Pauline Jaricot* gathered small groups in her family's mill in Lyon, France to offer prayers and sacrificial giving to support missionary work in North America and China. Her effort grew to become the *Society for the Propagation of the Faith*, which continues to promote the global mission of the Church.

By the early 1920s, the United States was no longer a primary focus of missionary activity. But there was concern that Catholics in the United States, who focused primarily on their local Church, lacked an understanding of the Church's global and mission outreach. In 1926, Church leaders designated the second to last Sunday in October as World Mission Sunday to broaden the understanding of the Church's global mission.

Every parish is asked to raise awareness of the worldwide evangelizing efforts of the Church. Parishes also take up a collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith to be used for the missions. Worldwide efforts like *World Mission Sunday* support more than 1,000 missionary dioceses.

In the 1960s, the Second Vatican Council, echoing the missionary credo found in the words of the Gospel of Mathew (28:18), emphasized that the Church is missionary by nature, and every baptized Catholic is called to missionary work through good works and setting a good example.

The new understanding of 'mission' is focused on the life and ministry of Jesus Christ and his proclamation of the Kingdom of God. St. Paul maintained that the Kingdom of God is peace, justice, joy and life in the Holy Spirit. If we understand 'mission' as this spreading of the Kingdom of God, then we work for peace and justice. We celebrate life as gift from God lived joyfully in the Spirit.

What is your parish doing for World Mission Sunday? If you are in parish leadership, plan something different this year -- a mission training day, a lunch or dinner event, a guest speaker, a special adult formation class focused on the Church's world mission. Why not highlight the global projects and partners that your parish supports?

#### MAUI CATHOLIC SUPPORT UPDATE

#### **GOD'S LOVE AND COMPASSION SHOWN ON MAUI**

October 16, 2023

From the Office for Social Ministry

This year's synod is meant to be an inspiring pastoral experience of "accompaniment"— praying, listening, and walking together. Pope Francis said this synod assembly is an opportunity for the church to reflect the way God is closely present in the world. "Let us keep going back to God's own "style", which is closeness, compassion, and tender love. God has always operated that way."



One shining example God's close, compassionate, tender loving presence in the wake of the Maui wildfires continues to be the school of Maria Lanakila parish in Lahaina, now located at the Sacred Hearts Mission church in Kapalua. The school is a beacon of hope sharing a healing spirit of resilience among faculty, parents, and students who lost loved ones, homes and livelihoods. The parish school is inspiring others to participate in this close, compassionate, tender process of "accompaniment" by supporting the parish efforts to help provide tuition and rebuild the school. The Diocese is also supporting this healing listening process with all the Maui parishes through the initiation of a Spiritual and Health Care Ministry. Bishop Larry Silva recently formed a task force to develop a Handbook for Prayer and Reflection saying: We pray that this Spiritual and Mental Health Ministry will bring Christ's healing and health to many!" Maui parishes have begun organizing their Spiritual and Mental Health ministry with persons impacted by the wildfires. Catholic Charities Hawaii will also be providing trauma-informed professional mental health counseling services. Indeed, the active healing presence of Christ through the Church in Maui is a vital part of the Synod experience of accompanying and listening to the Spirit and each other on our journey of faith together.

#### APPEAL FROM BISHOP LARRY SILVA:





# CATECHISM SERIES ON HOLY EUCHARIST THE CHURCH'S EUCHARISTIC FAITH

By Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, from Sacramentum Caritatis



The Church's faith is essentially a eucharistic faith, and it is especially nourished at the table of the Eucharist. Faith and the sacraments are two complementary aspects of ecclesial life. Awakened by the preaching of God's word, faith is nourished and grows in the grace-filled encounter with the Risen Lord which takes place in the sacraments: "Faith is expressed in the rite, while the rite reinforces and strengthens faith." For this reason, the Sacrament of the Altar is always at the heart of the Church's life: "Thanks to the Eucharist, the Church is reborn ever anew."

The more lively the eucharistic faith of the People of God, the deeper is its sharing in ecclesial life in steadfast commitment to the mission entrusted by Christ to his disciples. The Church's very history bears witness to this. Every great reform has in some way been linked to the rediscovery of belief in the Lord's eucharistic presence among his people.

\*In implementing the Eucharistic Revival program, the Dioceses and parishes have their coordinators and point persons. In the Diocese of Honolulu, *Fr. Alfred Guerrero* is the Coordinator and in OLM Parish, *Fran Kovaloff* is the point person.
