

First Reading Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31 **Responsorial Psalm** Psalm 128:1-5

Matthew 25:14-30

FOCUS: Always be prepared to welcome Christ, for we know neither the day nor the hour of his arrival. The Gospel parable reminds us to keep vigil for Jesus. It is easy to get distracted by the details of work, family life, and other responsibilities so that we forget the real purpose and mission of our lives. Let's each take a moment to contemplate how we can live out our vocation in life, readying ourselves for the Lord's coming.

#### First Reading: Wisdom 6:12-16

The first reading speaks of the attributes of wisdom, and the importance of the love of wisdom, as it is the perfection of prudence.

Second Reading: Thessalonians 4:13-18

In the second reading, Paul encourages people of faith to hold on to hope in the Resurrection.

Gospel: Matthew 25:1-13

In the Gospel, Jesus tells a parable where five virgins were ready for the bridegroom and five were not. Those who were not ready missed out on the wedding feast.

#### **APPEAL FROM BISHOP LARRY SILVA:**



#### NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL: 2022-2025 CATECHISM SERIES ON HOLY EUCHARIST Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink?

Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. God's whole plan for our salvation is directed to our participation in the life of the Trinity, the communion of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Our sharing in this life begins with our Baptism, when by the power of the Holy Spirit we are joined to Christ, thus becoming adopted sons and daughters of the Father. It is strengthened and increased in Confirmation. It is nourished and deepened through our participation in the Eucharist. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eu-



charist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). In being united to the humanity of Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life. "Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me" (Jn 6:57). By being united to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit dwelling in us, we are drawn up into the eternal relationship of love among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As Jesus is the eternal Son of God by nature, so we become sons and daughters of God by adoption through the sacrament of Baptism. Through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation (Chrismation), we are temples of the Holy Spirit, who dwells in us, and by his indwelling we are made holy by the gift of sanctifying grace. The ultimate promise of the Gospel is that we will share in the life of the Holy Trinity. The Fathers of the Church called this participation in the divine life "divinization" (theosis). In this we see that God does not merely send us good things from on high; instead, we are brought up into the inner life of God, the communion among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In the celebration of the Eucharist (which means "thanksgiving") we give praise and glory to God for this sublime gift.

#### MAUI CATHOLIC SUPPORT UPDATE

GOD'S LOVE AND COMPASSION SHOWN ON MAUI

October 16, 2023

From the Office for Social Ministry

This year's synod is meant to be an inspiring pastoral experience of "accompaniment"- praying, listening, and walking together. Pope Francis said this synod assembly is an opportunity for the church to reflect the way God is closely present in the world. "Let us keep going back to God's own "style", which is closeness, compassion, and tender love. God has always operated that way.

One shining example God's close, compassionate, tender loving presence in the wake of the Maui wildfires continues to be the school of Maria Lanakila parish in Lahaina, now located at the Sacred Hearts Mission church in Kapalua. The school is a beacon of hope sharing a healing spirit of resilience among faculty, parents, and students who lost loved ones, homes and livelihoods. The parish school is inspiring others to participate in this close, compassionate, tender process of "accompaniment" by supporting the parish efforts to help provide tuition and rebuild the school. For ways on how to help, please visit www.shsmaui.org.

The Diocese is also supporting this healing listening process with all the Maui parishes through the initiation of a Spiritual and Health Care Ministry. Bishop Larry Silva recently formed a task force to develop a Handbook for Prayer and Reflection saying: We pray that this Spiritual and Mental Health Ministry will bring Christ's healing and health to many!" Maui parishes have begun organizing their Spiritual and Mental Health ministry with persons impacted by the wildfires. Catholic Charities Hawaii will also be providing trauma-informed professional mental health counseling services. Indeed, the active healing presence of Christ through the Church in Maui is a vital part of the Synod experience of accompanying and listening to the Spirit and each other on our journey of faith together.


