

First Reading Isaiah 63:16-17, 19, 64:2-7

Gospel

Mark 13:33-37

FOCUS: We celebrate Jesus, our king and true shepherd.

"To which king should I be loyal?" is not a question many of us face in modern times, but for both faithful Jews and followers of Jesus, it was a decision on which their lives could literally depend. We realize how relevant the question remains when we ask, "Who or what reigns in my life?" The answer determines both our present and future joy.

First Reading: *Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17*

In the first reading, Ezekiel speaks for the Lord saying he will tend his sheep, give them rest, and seek out the lost.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28

Paul writes to the Corinthians that Christ has been raised from the dead, and in [him] shall all be brought to life.

Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks to the disciples about the coming of the Son of Man. It will be a time when he sits upon his throne and separates the sheep from the goats.



NOVEMBER: A MONTH TO REFLECT ON GRATITUDE AND GIVING


Towards the end of each year, it is easy for us to become distracted with the busyness and planning for the upcoming holidays, starting with Thanksgiving. As Christian stewards, it is an important aspect of our faith to live each day in gratitude and to prayerfully discern and reflect on what we are giving back to God through our parish, diocese and other charitable institutions in the coming year. Now is a good time to reflect on what priority we will give to God in our spending. Christian stewards acknowledge with gratitude that even our financial resources, our material wealth ultimately come from God. Exercising good stewardship over the money one makes, manages, spends and offers back to God is a tangible measure of their gratitude to God and their spiritual health.

Giving generously to their parish, dioceses and institutions of the universal Church is second nature to good stewards. They prayerfully reflect on their ability to give and return the "first fruits" of their financial resources back to God (Leviticus 23:10). The good steward's desire is to put God first among his or her spending priorities. They take seriously the psalmist's question: "What return shall I make to the Lord for all the good He has done for me?" (Psalm 116:12).

The best way to respond to God's loving generosity is by reflecting that generosity day by day. What God does in Jesus' human life is a much-magnified version of what happens when we take time to pray, offer our time and talents to our parish family or when family budgets and spending habits are reprioritized to conform more devotedly to the Gospel. The stewardship question is not, "Should I do these things?" but rather, "How much should I do?" Take time during this month of November to reflect prayerfully on God's generosity toward you, on the quality of your own life of gratitude and what you are doing and can do to further God's kingdom by your own giving patterns in the coming year.



DIOCESE OF HONOLULU - EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL PILGRIMAGE STARTED ON NOVEMBER 1

This Year of Parish Revival is about falling deeper in love with the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus and following him more closely. Mirroring this internal journey with an external one is a beautiful way to connect body and soul in the pursuit of Christ. Most of us will not have the opportunity to join the Eucharistic Caravan on the mainland leading to the Eucharistic Congress on July 17, 2024 in Indianapolis.

We can participate in the revival here at home. Make the Honolulu Diocese Pilgrimage a part of your experience of revival by planning a self-led personal pilgrimage in the next months leading up to the beginning of the Eucharistic Caravan in San Francisco.

The Diocese of Honolulu offers a Hawaii Eucharist Revival virtual pilgrimage called **Hawaii Pilgrim** <u>HERE</u> or by getting the **Polarsteps - Travel Tracker app** for your digital device. Sign up for a free Polarsteps account. Enter "Hawaii Pilgrim" on the Explore (Search people & places) tab. Click on "Follow" and begin your journey. Use Hawaii Pilgrim to find church addresses, Mass, adoration and other regularly scheduled events when the church will be open.

*In implementing the Eucharistic Revival program, the Dioceses and parishes have their point persons. In the Diocese of Honolulu, it is *Fr. Alfred Omar Guerrero* and in OLM Parish, *Fran Kovaloff* is the point person. *Fr. Ese'ese Tui* is the head of the Eucharistic Revival Task Force.

You will notice that the words on the logo is in the Hawaiian language. This is to help promote conversation if anyone ever ask what does it mean.

Here is the explanation of the Hawaiian phrase. Thank you, Dallas Carter to writing up this explanation.

"Hō'eu'eu Eukalikia"

In the Hawaiian language, "Hō'eu'eu" means "to rouse" or "to stir up," and "Eukalikia" is a term referring to the Eucharist, the Christian sacrament of communion. Together, the phrase "Hō'eu'eu Eukalika" can be translated as "To stir up the Eucharist."

In the context of our Hawaii diocesan Eucharistic revival, this phrase serves as a powerful reminder to reawaken our appreciation, understanding, and active participation in the Eucharist. It calls on us to deepen our connection with this sacred sacrament and to share its significance with others.

Your parish, vicariate, group may use the logo on your bulletins, social media, website and even shirts. Let me know if you have any questions. Blessings.

A message from The Most Reverend Larry Silva, Bishop of Honolulu

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In 2002, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops developed the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. This document guides our efforts to promote healing and reconciliation with victims/survivors of sexual abuse of minors by clergy, religious or Church workers. It outlines an effective response to allegations of sexual abuse, calls for more effective screening of those entering service in the Church, and provides for education for clergy and others who have contact with minors or who are in a position of trust in the Church. We affirm to work diligently to prevent the sexual abuse of minors. We pray forgiveness from those persons who were abused as minors by clergy, religious or Church workers, and we pray that the healing power of Christ may touch them. We thank God for our children and youth and commit ourselves to care for them as gifts of God's love.

Who should report child sexual abuse?

>A parent or guardian who has reason to believe their child has been sexually abused is encouraged to report.

>A person who is being sexually abused should make a report.

>A mandated reporter who has reason to believe that child abuse or neglect will occur in the reasonably foreseeable future, must immediately report the matter to Child Welfare Services or to the Police Department. Mandated reporters include licensed healing arts or health-related professionals; employees or officers of any public or private agency or institution, or other individuals providing social, medical, hospital, or mental health services, including financial assistance; employees or officers in a law enforcement agency; child care providers; medical examiners or coroners; employees of any public or private agency providing recreational or sports activities.

What is child sexual abuse? Child sexual abuse includes harm (or threatened harm) to a child, age 17 or younger, resulting from: sexual contact or conduct which includes sex acts, incest (sex between family members), touching a child on the breasts, genitals, or buttocks, or the clothing covering them, having the child sexually touch another person, voyeurism; e.g., watching a child bathing or changing clothes or exposing ones genitals to a child; sexual exploitation which includes activities like preparing, selling, distributing, or possessing pornographic materials that involve children, child prostitution, and situations where the child is used for the sexual gratification of others. To make a report If you suspect a child is being sexually abused, contact the Department of Human Services (DHS)/ Child Welfare Services (CWS) Available 24 hrs. a day/ 7 days a week Oahu: 808-832-5300 Neighbor Islands: 1-800-494-3991 If you believe the child is in immediate danger, call 911.
